ARTIFICIAL SURFACE UPDATE

Discussions have been held with the APIA Soccer Club about the possibility of Lambert Park becoming available and a synthetic surface built there. APIA at this stage will not be vacating Lambert Park, at least until they are able to secure a full-time lease of Leichhardt Oval. Due to the uncertainty over Lambert Park, it was decided to press ahead with a Development Application for Federal park. A landscape architect has been engaged to prepare the documentation for the DA to be submitted to Leichhardt Council. The approximate cost of this will be about \$4,000. Preliminary drawing should be available in the Clubhouse for Member perusal within the next few weeks.

Under 15's Although they didn't score a goal in their 4 matches, the Under 15's were always competitive and gave the opposition a good hard tussle. They never stopped trying and some of the short passing in the forwards was, on occasions, very impressive.

Under 13's This team played 3 hours of hockey in their 6 games and after the last one some had trouble putting one leg before the other! There was too much down the middle play and the defence will need to improve their speed delivering the ball to the forwards. Our short corner defence needs some work before the semis - we gave away a few soft goals from corners in this Carnival.

Under 11's With 5 games played, the Under 11's reached the Final of the day and received a Runners-Up Medal. The team was a composite from the Whites and the Maroons, with some of the players not playing together before and the side lacked a little cohesion at times. Nevertheless, the side performed well and the players had a great day, even though they didn't manage to snatch the Final from Parramatta.

The Under 15's and Under 13's had only 10 of their regular players available and players from "down stream" came in to help. These younger "fill-ins" acquitted themselves with distinction, despite giving away many years to their opponents.

Jason Bowden played kicking back and other player given the chance to play in unfamiliar positions so they could develop all round hockey skills. It was only some brilliant saves from the St George goalie that stopped the Glebe tally being higher.

GLEBE UNDER 11's MAROON

Moorebank (13.7.91) Lost 14 - 3 This game was at Moorebank as Jubilee was unfit due to heavy rain. We played the game with only 10 players because of holidays and sickness. An added disadvantage was not having a goalkeeper. The result wasn't as bad as it seems at first. Moorebank have 4 very skilful players very much at home on the turf and they scored some excellent goals. Glebe never gave up and never stopped tackling in our true tradition. David Wall had his best game of the season and made some good runs towards the Moorebank goal. Owen Macindoe acquitted himself well at right-half and his tackling and passing have improved since the start of the season. Anthony Wark was always dangerous in the Moorebank circle and with some could have added to his hat-trick. Despite the score, Moorebank did not have it all their own way and we were able to penetrate their defence and score 3 goals. With a tighter defence, a goalkeeper and a full team the score will be closer next time we meet. Thank you Corrie Kelleher for a fine job umpiring and Mrs Maggie O'Sullivan who continues to supply oranges and water, very much appreciated by the team.

Sutherland Blue (20.7.91) Lost 10 - 1 Sutherland are the best in the competition and a defeat of this size against a team of this calibre is no disgrace. Glebe never stopped trying and kept tackling right to the last. We did have scoring opportunities and could have scored one or two more goals. Alexander Crook, the Under 13's regular goalie played for us and acquitted himself well. Full-backs Sandy Gittins and Tom Wingfield tackled and ran all day. Owen Macindoe continues to improve. Pat Wark at centre-half covered a lot of territory although he needs to pass the ball more to the corners rather than down the middle to the oppositions centre-half - a small criticism in an otherwise outstanding game. Kate O'Sullivan is not frightened to take on bigger, faster, meaner opposition forwards and made her presence felt. Mark O'Sullivan made a couple of 10 metre bursts - great for one so young. Cameron Mackay continues to improve and Mark Paterson (the baby of the team) made some good effective tackles and play of the ball. Ross Tapsell, insideleft, was effective in the forwards but needs to drop back just a bit defending 16 yard hits and helping the full-backs. This applies to inside-right David Wall as well but he made some good runs. Given the right opportunities in the circle, David has the capacity to score goals. Anthony Wark was always dangerous in attack and also ran out well on the short-corners - although Sutherland had at least 10 or 12 corners, they failed to

convert one of them. A good team effort, only beaten on the day by an older, more skilful, well drilled opposition. It was nice to here the words of encouragement players gave each other in this match.

Moorebank (27.7.91) Lost 1 - 7 Moorebank are a very capable team and to restrict them to a 6 goal winning margin on their home ground was a good effort on our behalf - we made them fight for every goal. A pleasing feature of this game was the exhibition of dribbling skills by the younger members of the team, Mark O'Sullivan, Kate O'Sullivan and mark Paterson - skills developed at Wednesday night training and not previously utilised. Alexander Crook, the Under 13's goal-keeper who is eligible to play for the Under 11's, effected some good saves and kept the score down - the last time we played Moorebank was without a goalkeeper and we conceded 14 goals. Sandy Gittins worked hard in this game and none of the opposition forwards could outrun him. Ross Tapsell (normally inside-left) played left-half and acquitted himself well.

David Wall continues to improve at insideright and relayed the ball effectively to Anthony Wark at centre-forward. Owen Macindoe's work rate in improving and with a good dose of the flu played well. Cameron Mackay tried hard all game, playing to his potential. Pat Wark was a little sluggish early in the game but his enthusiasm picked up as the game progressed - with concentration over the full game, he would be an outstanding player. Anthony Wark scored 1 goal and narrowly missed two more. He was a constant threat to the Moorebank defence and his hitting of the long corners was excellent. Even with Nicholas Kelleher and Tom Wingfield out sick the side performed very well. We score goals even against the best teams in the competition which is a pleasing feature of our play.

Sutherland Sharks (3.8.91) Won 2 - 0 In the 1st round Sharks beat us 3 - 1, in the 2nd round it was a 0 - 0 draw and in this game at Jubilee we beat them 2 - 0. These scores emphasise the improvement of the team as the season progresses.

We played without a goal-keeper and most critics gave us only an outside chance to win. Tom Wingfield and Nick Kelleher returned after sickness. Nick played as kicking-back and had his best game of the season. Tom was quick and repeatedly won the ball and pushed it up to our forwards initiating many Glebe sorties. Sandy Gittins at right-back was like the Scarlet Pimpernel - everywhere and really stamped his mark on the game. Mark O'Sullivan has shown enormous improvement and played another good game repeatedly tackling players years older and

winning the ball. Kate O'Sullivan positioned herself well and tried very hard recovering from a nasty ball to the knee. Owen Macindoe's work rate has improve 500% and is most effective on the right-wing. Pat Wark threw himself into the game and was a tower of strength at centre-half in one of his better games of the season. Cameron Mackay's ball and stick skills have made a gigantic step forward in recent weeks. Ross Tapsell, inside-left, made some incisive runs and on several occasions looked as if he might score. David Wall at inside-right also had a couple of golden opportunities to score, but lady luck deserted him. He made some decisive runs in attack and passed the ball well to Anthony Wark who involved himself well in the game. His teammates and Glebe supporters were delighted when he scored his first goal midway through the 2nd half. Our win was truly a team effort, one of which the team can be proud. Carole Wark umpired for us and Maggie O'Sullivan continues to bring oranges and water for half-time. Thank you both.
