Next Sunday 31st. July is a busy one for the Club. Some of our players - those who played against Canberra - will journey to Goulburn to play for the Foxall Cup.

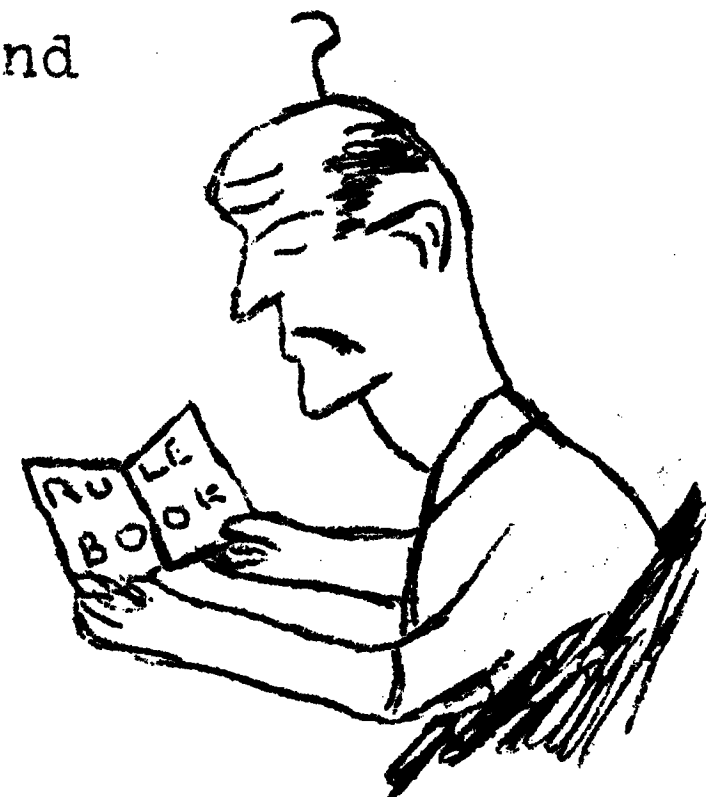
Three other members Greg Harris, Bob Fox and Fred Letts will represent Sydney 2 against Illawarra at Wollongong.

ANSWER TO UMPIRE'S CORNER. A Penalty Corner (Rule 10c).

It is a breach of the Rule if the ball is played in such a way as is either dangerous in itself, or likely to lead to dangerous play. to lift a ball directly at an opponent from close quarters where he would have little chance of avoiding it, or driving a fast ball directly at a player who was too close to either judge its flight, or to avoid it, would be strokes dangerous in themselves and subject to the penalties provided by the rule stated above.
