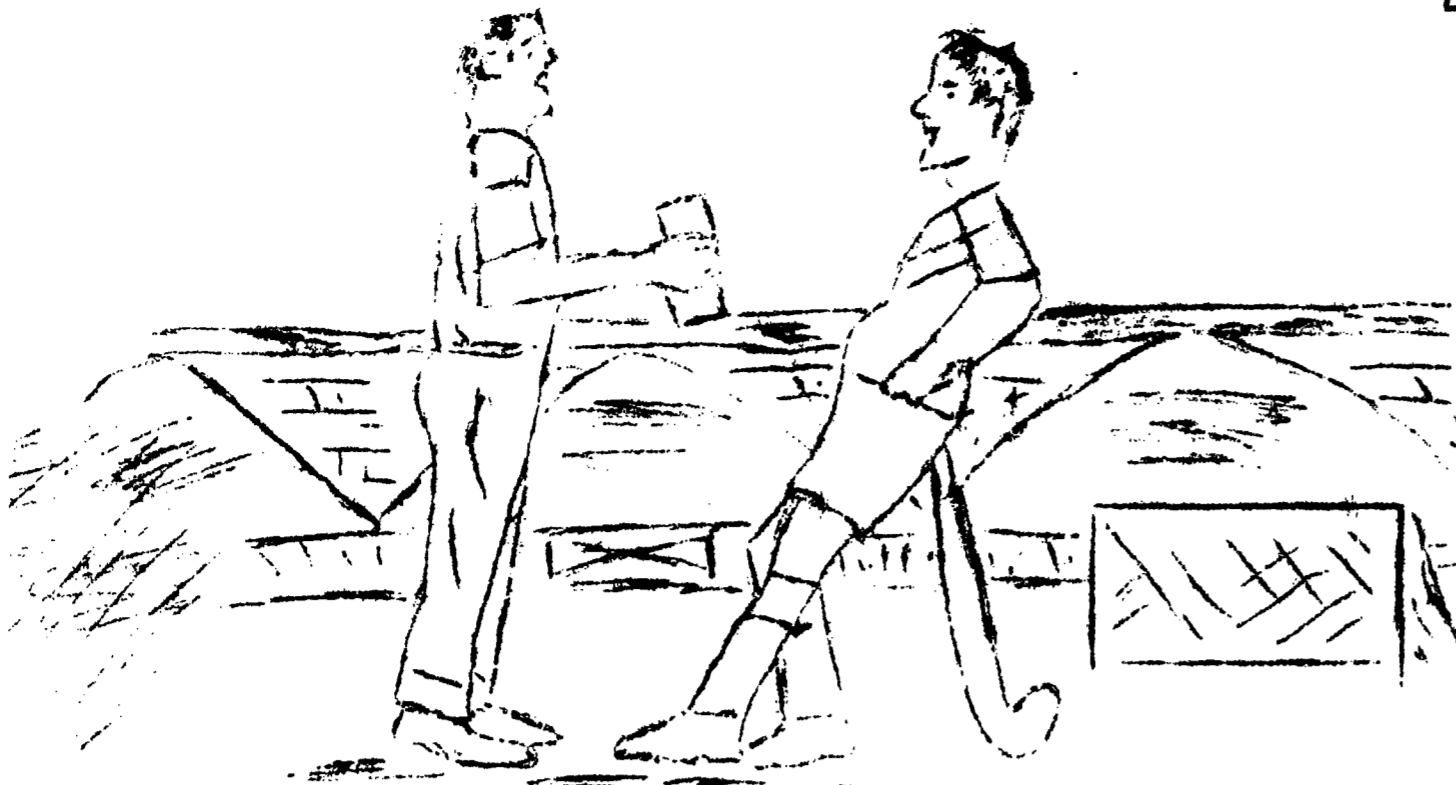
SECOND GRADE.
