After the presentation of all pennants, Pat Nilan outlayed a plan for a new 250 CLUB to be run over 25 weeks with the final prize to be a trip for two (2) to the MUNICH OLYMPIC GAMES plus accomadation. This was accepted unanimously by the meeting and will now get under way early in January.

MR. NILAN also showed the meeting figures of the percentage who trained last season. Many members were set back when they heard that there was only a 47% turn up for 1970 training. This in itself speaks for why Glebe only won one (1) Premiership last season.

Mr. Nilan has accepted the positions as Club Captain and Club Coach for the forth coming season and with the aid of MR. John Atterton as Club Trainer it is hoped that club members will get behind these two (2) men and give them all the support in order that Glebe D.H.C. again will reign supreme.
