INSIDE the results of the 1977 Player of the year competition.

Trevor Vanderput (no stranger to the paper) comes up with a very interesting article on Umpiring, and it makes very good reading. It seems umpiring is a problem everywhere.

"UMPIRES"

Over the years there has been a lot of player, coach and spectator criticism of the umpiring standards. As an ex-player and ex-coach some of my obeservations may be of interest.

Attitude: Most of the time we seem to attract people with the correct attitude but every now and again we are inflicted with "little Hitlers". The umpire that races about threatening all and sundry (players and spectators!!) The guy who takes a savage delight in sending players off to prove who is boss and to award penalty strokes out of the depths of his imagination.

Ideal; The ideal bloke is the fellow that feels he is helping the players have a good game and that he is there to supervise that the rules are not flagrantly broken, to the disadvantage of either team.

Spirit of the Rules: Some of our newer Umpires find it hard to interpret the spirit rather than the "letter" of the rule. More discussions after games would be an advantage to both players and Umpires. Talk to the Coaches - don't preach!

Amateur: The sooner we can afford to pay Umpires the better we can demand a higher standard. At the moment these dedicated men in white take all the abuse and don't get a penny for it. Players are interested in improving their game (skills etc) when do we ever see the younger (never) Umpires offering to umpire friendly matches pre-season? I remember when Graeme Ashly was a lot younger he was always at the grounds wanting to 'help out' and umpire friendly games. He has learned not to get involved with any personalities and has empathy with the players. The players respect him for this and he is considered one of the States top umpires now. Graeme is now an International Badged Umpire.

Advice: Don't worry about being too dogmatic about the exact spot from where the free hit should be taken, don't be incensed with the sticks rule on free hits or centres from the wings. Try and curb your own feelings when a player "explodes". We know its hard at times but remember your heated action can completly ruin a game. Players generally tend to accept umpires that mix with players, not hold themselves aloof. Learn your hand signals and use them. It's terrible to see an umpire with apparently both hands held out; each pointing in different directions (this is a poor habit and occurs when the inexperienced umpire points to "where" the foul took place with one arm and points the direction of the free hit with the other. This leads to confusion and frustration but more important loss of confidence of the players.

This is intended to be constructive and I do hope no replies are written in to rubbish me. I was an Umpire (of sorts!!) and gave it away because of the abuse and non-enjoyment of my umpiring (by me!!) so I know how it feels. Lets show a bit more empathy towards each other Player - Umpires - Coaches.

I like this Umpires philosophy - from Hockey Circle 1977 -

"After an experience like the Olympics I will still indeed be going back to umpire at club level. Irrespective of the standard, umpiring is challenging, it renders a service to players and above all it is a good excuse to have a beer with friends in the 3rd half of the game."
