PLAYERS' WINNING INCENTIVE SCHEME.

1984-3

AIMS: To institute a scheme, whereby senior players in all grades and all divisions would be provided with the incentive to win.

METHOD: Each player of a winning team would be credited with a \$1.00 dollar credit for each win that his team achieves in the S.H.A. Competition, Bisley Shield and Bisley Cup finals, and all games in the S.H.A. Cup.

APPLICATION: At the end of each season, each player will have the option of choosing one of the following three (3) ways of using his credit.

1. As a rebate off the following season's fees.
2. As part or full payment for tickets to the S.H.A. Presentation Night Ball.
3. As part or full payment for tickets to the Glebe Presentation Night.

Note: A player can claim a credit for one win only, in any competition round. Credits will be granted, only to those players named on winning match cards.

INCENTIVE FOR COACHES OF GLEBE JUNIOR TEAMS.

AIM: To provide an incentive to suitable top players to take on the coaching of our Junior teams in the Saturday morning competition.

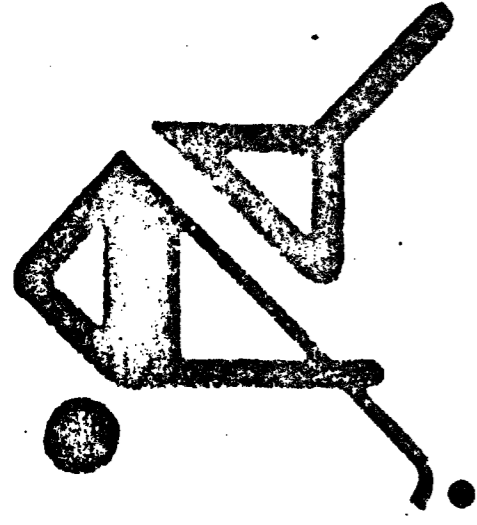

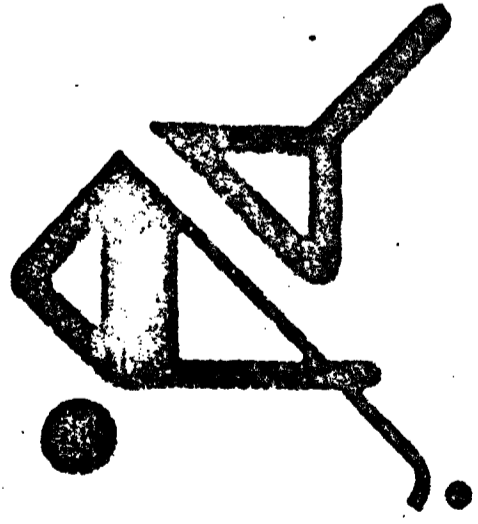
