### **FURTHER TURF NEWS**

On Wednesday 8 July, Leichhardt Council called a meeting for representatives of the Trotting Association, Leichhardt Council, Glebe Hockey Club, the Glebe Society and the Save Rozelle Bay group to canvas opinions about the concept to include an artificial turf playing surface within the track at Harold Park. This would be incorporated in their proposal to extend and up-grade the track (See diagram).

Groups were pleased with this expression of good faith by Harold Park who wish to incorporate another sporting facility within their grounds.

Matters will be further discussed at later meetings and Harold Park hope to complete their development by November 1993.

Thanks to all members and supporters for sending letters to Council supporting the synthetic turf proposal at Federal Park. An unofficial count of them showed 347 for and 90 against. Some of those against complained about a "mini-stadium", "taking up waterfront land", "inability to run the dog" and "inability to play football on Sunday afternoon". The Save



There is no doubt that the Maroons have progressed enormously as the season has progressed and it was pleasing how they made the Whites fight every inch of the way. Callan Gilding, the Maroon goal-keeper, was the best player on the field and was well supported by Yuri and Graham. Robbie Austen was the pick of the Maroon forwards who need to work back harder and take the pressure of the defence.

The Whites found it hard to thread a way through the close packed Maroon defence but took their goal scoring chances very well. Goal shooting was very good in this game, an area where we often fall down. Team combination and some of the short passing were particularly good. One area that needs attention in the Whites is the large gap between the forwards and defence. Often this gap was 30 - 40 metres! Inside forwards need to work back and act as links between the halves, the centre-forward and the wings. Geoffrey Hammett is off overseas to visit his grandparents in England and we wish him a good trip and a safe return. This puts a lot of pressure on our central half-back, Mary Wark, but she is a big strong lass and will no doubt rise to the occasion.
