WELCOME TO THE 1993 HOCKEY SEASON

In particular, we at Glebe District Hockey Club welcome all those new players who have joined us in 1993. We trust that you have a rewarding and enjoyable year. We know that your parents will find the Clubhouse a hospitable place, and that they will take the opportunity to meet other parents, especially those involved with your team.

Welcome to our Minkey players. We trust that you find your involvement in Minkey a fun time, as well as a useful introduction to the skills of hockey.

To all those players and their families who have backed up for another year, it is great to see you all again. You are the backbone of the Club.

This issue of the "Red Rag" is devoted to the draw for the Junior teams, and other information that you need to know about the Competition. So far we only have the draw for the first two rounds, but we will publish the remainder when it becomes available. Please keep it handy. We publish some contact numbers in each issue of the "Red Rag", but this is the only time we will publish full team lists.

EQUIPMENT REQUIRED BY COMPETITION PLAYERS

We remind all new players in COMPETITION TEAMS that they need to obtain their own hockey stick, mouthguard, white shorts, maroon and white (Manly League) socks, shinpads and shoes.

Note that boots with sprigs cannot be worn on synthetic turf surfaces, but are often used by players on grass surfaces. You need flat surface shoes (sandshoes, joggers) on the synthetic turf surfaces.

This year we will also be introducing some new Glebe Hockey shirts to some of the teams. We think it will be best if players purchase these, and keep them. In the past we have provided the shirt, but this has created a lot of problems when they have to be returned. We also think that most players like to hang onto the shirt that they have been using.

ABOVE ALL, DON'T FORGET YOUR MOUTHGUARD

It is also a good idea to make sure that your name is clearly displayed on your hockey stick.

MINKEY PLAYERS

Minkey players should have adequate footwear, but do not require any special clothing or protective gear. The Club has some sticks for Minkey players; however, since the number of minkey players seems to just keep growing, it might be a good idea to purchase a hockey stick, if possible. Minkey players can then use it at home!

Junior hockey sticks are relatively inexpensive — you should be able to purchase one for around \$20. See Jim Oman if you wish to purchase a hockey stick.

TIMES OF GAMES

Competition games are played on Saturdays. The usual times for games are as follows

Under 17	8.00 a.m.
Under 15	10.20 a.m.
Under 13	9.15 a.m.
Under 11	11.25 a.m.

Under 13's and Under 15's play 30 minutes each way; Under 11's play 25 minutes each way.

Sometimes changes have to be made to these times. Please check with your team manager each week.

MINKEY TIME Initially, 10.00 a.m. Coaches and parents may come to arrange other times once Minkey has begun.

TRANSPORT

For away games, we need a minimum of THREE cars to take players to the game. Ideally, we would like everyone to help out at some stage in the season. Transport is not something that should be left to the same few parents each time there is an away game.

If everyone helped with transport, then an individual would need to help out only two or three times a season.

For away games, we normally meet at the Clubhouse about an hour before the game is due to start. After the game, players are then returned to their homes if they live close, or to the Clubhouse if they live some distance away.

Please check transport details with the team manager.

Players who live some distance away from Glebe often go directly to the ground, instead of coming to the Clubhouse. Again, please let the team manager know.

Players should warm up before a game, so all players should be at the ground (home or away) at least twenty minutes before the game is due to start.

Princes Highway; left into Box Road, then right into Sylvania Road North; right into car park (or left into Garnet Street, then left again into Sylvania Road North).

GARDINERS

Wolli Creek Road and Gardiner Road.
(ST. GEORGE CLUB)
Princes Highway; right into Forest Road, left into Wolli Creek Road, left again into Gardiner Road.

Hockey is a game that requires a high degree of skill if you are to maximise your enjoyment of it. So be a "regular" even when the weather turns cold!

TEN RULES FOR HAVING A GOOD SEASON

1. Play for the fun of it, not just to please your parents or coach.
2. Play by the rules of the game.
3. Accept the referee's decisions with grace.
4. Don't mouth off! Your team mates will play better if you encourage them and applaud their good play. Constant criticism by fellow players ruins the morale of a team, and makes for worse play, not better.
5. Work hard to develop team understanding, both on and off the field.
6. Be a good sport. Applaud all good play, whether by your team or an opponent. Thank the opposition after the game. Without them, there would be no game.
7. Don't be a show-off or bully. Don't try to take all the free hits. Show confidence in your team mates by sharing responsibilities.
8. Listen to the coach. Try to put his advice into practice.
9. Turn up to training. You will enjoy the game more if you can see a steady improvement in your skills. It is also an excellent way of showing support for your team mates.
10. Don't blame other players, especially the goal keeper, when a goal is scored against you. Get on with the game. Be positive. Try to lift your own and the team's performance, not criticise others.
