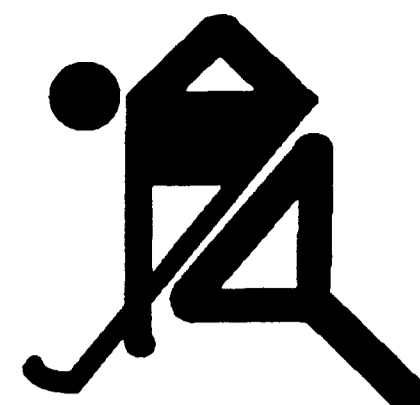

## Hockey Rules

This season there are some alterations to the rules of hockey. The main changes that affect us at the moment are:

### Accessories

No baseball caps are to be worn.

No watches, nose studs, earrings and other jewellery are to be worn during a game (although wedding rings and chains are alright).

### Goalkeepers

Each team must have a goalkeeper with a helmet (at least) and a distinctive shirt. NO HEAD GEAR - NO GAME: It becomes a forfeit.

### Long Corners

A long corner will be awarded for a deflection off a defender's stick (OR foot, subject to advantage, size of breach etc) from *anywhere* on the field.

### 10-Yard Penalty

Instead of a green card, the umpire might move a free hit 10 yards nearer to the other side's goal if there is a breach of rules. This applies between the 25's and examples include: knocking the ball away after a free hit has been awarded and walking back through where the ball was lying and kicking it away. These are not the only breaches in this category, and the umpire will award the 10-yard penalty when appropriate.

## Trivia Night

On the Saturday night of May 27, Glebe Hockey Club held its Inaugural Trivia Night, with a great turnout of almost 150 people. In a battle between senior hardheads, in which there were several lead changes, the Casey family table (and a few others) eventually emerged as "surprise" winners. Various raffles were also held, with prizes including hockey gear from Kenny and Buster being the main attraction.
