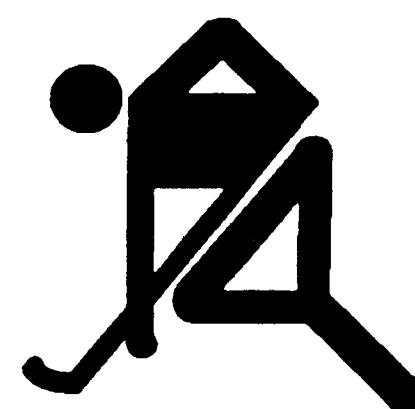

CARNIVALS:

NORTHERN DISTRICTS CARNIVAL

This was held on Sunday 26th March at the Northern Districts grounds in Pennant Hills Park. Glebe entered six teams - two in each of the Under 15, Under 13 and Under 11 age groups. The teams entered did not entirely correspond to competition teams. As this carnival serves as a warm-up to the competition, it was an opportunity for many players to acclimatise themselves to the game and to their teammates. The carnival was run in pools, with the winner of each age division being decided on competition points, and then on points for and against in the case of a tie.

GLEBE WON ALL THREE AGE DIVISIONS! Congratulations to all the players who took part, and especially to the players in the three winning teams.

BANKSTOWN CARNIVAL

This was held at The Crest on Sunday 2nd April. This is not normally a carnival that the Club supports, being the day after the competition begins, and only one week after the Northern Districts Carnival. However, some coaches were keen on playing and three teams were entered. These three teams roughly corresponded to the three strongest teams in each age division, but as some players were unavailable, others came in to fill the vacancies. Thanks to these players for their contribution.

This carnival was a much tougher one than the Northern Districts Carnival, and even contained some Association (representative) teams from Campbelltown, Illawarra and Bathurst. These teams had to give a goal-start to the club teams, and the task of hauling this back was too much for them. None of them made the finals. The format was also different - after playing the rounds, the competition was decided using semi-finals and finals. All three Glebe teams made it through to the final.

Under 11

Won the final against Northern Districts. Scores were level at full-time, as were penalty corners. Glebe won by having gained more points during the rounds.

Under 13

Lost the final to Sutherland. Scores were level at full-time, but Sutherland, with more penalty corners, were winners.

Under 15

Won the final, defeating Bankstown 4 goals to nil.

GLEBE U/19'S INDOOR

A group of greatly talented youngsters, comprising players from last year's U/13's, U/15's, U/17's, and senior age groups, made up the Glebe U/19's Indoor Hockey side which participated in the 1995 Men's Second Division Indoor Competition played at Homebush Sports Centre (on the basketball court).

All team members got on really well with each other and combined at times just as well on the field. Generally, however, the team tended to slacken during low standard games (a few too many Charlie Smogs), but raised the level of intensity for the important games. The main example of this being our great comeback in the semi-final against UNSW, when with only one and a half minutes to go and down by one goal, Steve Sherwood fed a great pass to Aaron Oman who promptly deflected the ball through the goalkeeper's legs to equalise. We sealed the game with thirty seconds to go, when Aaron scored another great goal. In the final, we faced the extremely talented Bankstown side which boasts three State players and two Sydney players. Their youngest

player was 16 - we had two sixteen year olds, a fifteen year old, and two thirteen year olds. Despite a significant lack of experience (compared to Bankstown anyway).

Glebe started the game aggressively but quickly went behind 0-4 at half-time. By general consensus, the team decided to pull its finger out and proceeded to play some very entertaining and often brilliant hockey to come within two goals of Bankstown. Christian Campano saved a stroke to keep us in the game, but unfortunately Bankstown proved to be too good for us.

Regardless, it was a great experience for all players involved, the team combining their youth with flair and exuberance, to produce some brilliant hockey at times. The success of the team proves Glebe's strong recruitment policies of recent years - as this is the first tier of players to emerge and establish themselves from the current generation of juniors.

All players showed a wide diversity of skills and personal attributes, and I have no hesitation in saying that all players have very promising futures ahead of them, and will have no problem in making the transition from juniors in seniors, as several of the younger guys are currently proving.

Christian Campano was absolutely outstanding at times in goals with some amazing saves - he has the uncanny ability to consistently save first-class penalty strokes. Geoff Hammett was our most improved and always extremely reliable, constantly rotating at fullback with the experienced pairing of Steve Sherwood and Adam Campano. Aaron Oman showed off his class at centre-half and scored heaps of goals to boot, as did Mark Baxter. Brook Atkinson and Anthony Wark were our main strikers, with Allan Morris on rotation, who was without doubt our man of the match in the final, inspiring our comeback by setting up our first two goals and making some great tackles when we were in trouble.

It is great to see such old heads on young shoulders, and all players willing to contribute to team talks and introducing alternative plays and strategies. Lastly, but definitely by no means least, the whole team thanks Allan's dad, Roger, for without his services we would have struggled to fulfil our umpiring commitments.
