

Further to the reference to grading of junior players next year in last month's Red Rag, here are letters written to the Editor expressing concern. These are reproduced with a response from the Management Committee.

The Editor

I am writing in response to Terry Kelly's column in the July Red Rag. As a parent of a child who has been a member of Glebe teams who have experienced large losses, I strongly disagree with the thinking of the Convenor and Senior Management Committee — i.e., the grading of players and a graded competition.

After six years of watching junior hockey I am convinced children only improve by playing with and against better players. Unfortunately, losing is part of the process. Everyone suffers big losses from time to time. It is not only part of sport, it is a part of life — just ask the Wallabies.

What is important is how you react to those losses. It really is a measure of you as a person. In my son's case his team is now beating teams by the same big scores they used to get beaten by when they first played hockey.

When you start to think that children only enjoy their hockey by winning, I really think we have lost the plot. If that is the case, why not go the whole hog change our colours from maroon to blue and only pick boys in our teams?

It was with great disappointment that I read in the July issue of The Red Rag -Juniors' News, about the grading of junior players for next season.

It is sufficient to say that the senior grades of both Women's and Men's teams have many ex juniors who are skilful, have represented Sydney, NSW and Australia, and who learnt how to play the game, win with pride and lose with dignity, all from ungraded junior teams.

I know that many others share my views and I hope they will come forward to ensure this retrograde step does not occur next season, by letting our Junior Committee and Sydney Junior Hockey know of our objections.

A discussion of this matter at a special meeting of the committee, attended by all interested parties, seems appropriate.

My boy joined the club in the days when we sometimes had trouble getting one full team of under 11 's together for the match. The team lost consistently week after week in the 11 's - and they always backed up for more, and they always enjoyed themselves. And they started to win. Not all of the original members of the team are there now in the winning team, but most of them are still playing, and still enjoying the game.

Grading individuals will destroy that process, and it certainly won't help the Club.

I'm not totally convinced, but there are probably good reasons to have one team of excellence in each age group.

There are no good reasons to brand other players as inferior.

Children don't need to win. It's nice if they do. If they enjoy the game, and they're not judged harshly, they'll keep playing. If they're branded as losers, they won't play.

I urge the Committee to think again.

Dear Junior Parents

Thank you for voicing your concerns regarding the Club's policy on Junior selection. It is encouraging to see people taking an active interest.

The underlying aim of the Club is always that all players at all levels enjoy their hockey, develop and maintain friendships and refine their skills of the game. To do otherwise would defeat the purpose of running a club.

The Club will continue with its current policy of grading one junior team in each age division. All other teams then being selected according to a mix of maintaining social groups – where this is possible allowing for the logistics of transport, allocation of Coaches and a mix of boys and girls. If the structure of the Sydney Junior Hockey Competition changes some rearrangement may need to occur to maximise our children's potential within their teams.

We hope that this will set your concerns to rest. If not please feel free to approach any member of the Management Committee to air your views, keeping in mind that we are all here with a common aim – the welfare of all our children and the enjoyment of our sport.

TURF UPDATE

We have had verbal advice from Leichhardt Council that the \$200,000 is OK and they will be writing to us very soon confirming this.

The Turf Negotiation Committee of Craig Stubbs & Colin Rochester are still in the process of finalising negotiations with the two turf manufacturers and have presented to the Management Committee an update. The Committee has given Craig & Col delegation to issue a letter of intent when they have agreed on a turf manufacturer.

Rod Hammett (another tireless worker) has been working feverishly to get things in order so the base works package can be put out to tender to a number of Companies. One tender has already been received and is being reviewed at present, and further negotiations will be taking place. Connell Wagner (Rod's Firm) has been appointed to Project Manage the whole project. It is expected that the field will be available for the beginning of next season

When all the prices are in the whole project will be packaged up and Bill Stubbs (thank god for the Stubbses) will present it to the Department of Sport & Recreation for their approval to obtain a loan guarantee from the Government for approximately \$400,000 (final figure is yet to be confirmed).

Harold Park have not yet decided on the future of the Old Tote Building so the Club House design team have been put on hold until a final decision has been made.
