Junior Convenor's Report 1993

On behalf of the Junior Committee I would like to welcome everyone to our 1993 Presentation Day. Today formally brings to a close the 1993 hockey season — a season that by any measure has been a memorable one for the Junior Club.

In 1993 Glebe fielded four Under 11 teams, two Under 13 teams and one Under 15 team. This was the largest representation by any club in the Central Area Competition. A magnificent effort and credit to everyone who contributed, either with direct assistance or financial support.

The accompanying Manager and Coach's reports tell in detail of the many onfield successes enjoyed by the Club through the season. Two Under 11 teams, one Under 13 team and the Under 15 team made the Semi-Finals of the Central Area Competition — the Under 13's and Under 15's losing in the Final and the Under 11 Number 1 team going down in the Grand Final. During the season Glebe also contested three carnivals: Northern Districts, St George and Lithgow. On each occasion we were the most successful all-round club.

However the most satisfying aspect of the season by far was the manner in which our junior teams conducted themselves on the field, almost without exception each and everyone of them were a credit to themselves, their coaches and families.

One of the main reasons for the success and growth enjoyed by our junior teams has undoubtedly the Club's Minkey programme.

Guided by Peter Busch, almost from its inception, it has experienced phenomenal growth year after year — 1993 has been no exception. Under the guidance of Peter, Les Wark and a number of our lady players we have had more than one hundred children registered as Minkey participants. It was not unusual to have an average attendance of 50 to 60 on most Saturday mornings. If this momentum can be maintained and the Club finally secure a synthetic surface on either Federal or Harold Park our future should be secure well into the next century.

In conclusion I would like to thank two very special groups of people.

Firstly, Harry Wark Senior and his magnificent band of ladies, Maureen Paterson, Ann Wark, Cheryl Oman, Lesley Hammett, Chris and Jack who have worked tirelessly in the canteen to make Wednesdays and Saturdays such enjoyable social occasions. Secondly, thank you to the Junior Committee of Mike Tapsell, Marty Howe, Peter Howe, Bob Taylor and the publisher of the Red Rag Eddy Crook. The many hours of time and effort you have freely given have ensured the success of the season. It has been a privilege working with you.

Being involved with the team was no great hassle as this bunch of young women and men always conducted themselves in a fine manner both on and off the field. The side was a young one (all but four players in their first year of the Under 15's) but performed very well as a hockey team.

On top of this we made it to the Final of the competition but went down to a strong Sutherland side. The score (7-0) was not a true indication of the game as we matched the opposition initially but tired late in the second half. Our match against this side earlier in the round game was our best performance all year. The result was 2-2 and was probably the hardest fought game I have seen by a Glebe team in years. The team gave 100% effort and played with tenacity, determination and a "never give up" attitude.

The team was versatile with many players playing in unfamiliar positions and handling it very well and also willing to try out new things such as playing without any positions but roaming free. I think it is fair to say that most of the time we gave our best effort but at times lacked a bit of discipline.

Another pleasing note of the year was to see the support that was given to the side by the number of parents and relatives present at our matches and also by the 1st Graders who came out to umpire some of our games.

For everyone involved with the Under 15's in 1993 it was a top year (and then some)!

Under 13's Reports

Under 13 A

The team had a reasonably successful season in the competition finishing third after the completion of sixteen rounds. At that stage the team had scored 122 goals and only conceded 16 against. In the semi-final Glebe comfortably accounted for St George but were outclassed by Moorebank in the final.

However, the bare facts do not tell the whole story. The team consisted of groups of players who had played together in various Glebe teams in previous seasons, but as a whole had not been in the same team until 1993. Also many of the players had played in Glebe teams which were thrashed by Moorebank, Sutherland and sometime other teams.

This all changed in 1993 with the enthusiasm, determination and commitment of the individuals harnessed by the co-coaches Col Brown and Andrew Goodrich. The team did not drop any points to teams other than Moorebank and Sutherland. They were very competitive against Moorebank and Sutherland, both containing a number of representative players and these matches were close — highlighted by a win over Moorebank at Moorebank.

Over the whole season both the skills of individuals and the team as a whole improved markedly, while the attitude of the players to the game was exemplary. The players respected each other, their opposition and the referees and were a credit to the Club.

The team consisted of the following players:

Alexander Crook

The team's goalkeeper whose importance was most evident after he injured himself. Prior to his injury the team had the best defensive record but after that it was easier for the opposition to score. Alex can continue to contribute to the team by calling his defensive players.

Nick Kelleher

Nick was a solid and dependable fullback who concentrated for the whole match. With improved distribution skills he has the potential to make representative teams.

David Mullins

A vastly improved player, David contributed to the team by continually stopping opposition attacks with one-on-one tackling. David's game will continue to improve as he develops communication with the other fullback.

Sandy Gittins

Sandy is an extremely talented player who demonstrated a particular ability at close man to man marking. While his best position is fullback, he can improve his close skills by playing in other positions.

Kristian Haigh

In his first season of hockey, Kristian played every position on the field, scoring 4 goals in the forwards and then deputising as goalkeeper in Alexander's absence. In all positions he played 100% and has the potential to become a very good player.

Ross Tapsell

Ross was one of the most consistent players in the team and was certainly the best cover defender.

Anthony Wark

Anthony played a dominant but unselfish role at centre-half and inspired his team with creative play. With his increased maturity and improved temperament he will gain higher representative honours, particularly with more experience on artificial surfaces.

Patrick Wark

One of the key players in the team, Patrick contributed both in attack and defence demonstrating all round skills of trapping, tackling and passing. By better holding his position he will dominate the opposition even more.

Robbie Austen

One of the most improved players over the whole season Robbie seemed to play every position. As his skill level increases his enthusiasm for the game will create further opportunities.

Patrick Casey

One of the most consistent players in the team, Patrick ran non-stop — assisting in defence and creating opportunities in attack. The better the opposition the harder Patrick played and will undoubtedly continue to improve.

Melanie Cox

A typical centre forward Melanie loves scoring goals and dominated play in the circle. However, she also contributed to setting up play in general by assisting the forwards and halves as required. With experience in other positions Melanie will improve her centre forward skills.

Douglas Cronin

At inside left Douglas contributed as a team member, providing good passes to his forwards, covering positions as required and back tackling the opposition. With improved fitness levels Douglas will be an important member of the Under 15's in 1994.

Andrew French

Andrew is a dynamic player who used his pace to create attacking opportunities from defensive positions. By combining his athleticism he will develop into an extremely dangerous attacking player.

Sam Everist

Sam was one of the class players in the whole competition. At right wing he scored 37 goals and often inspired the team by scoring some great individual goals. But just as often he set up opportunities for his fellow forwards. By playing in other positions Sam will further improve.

Under 13(b)

Although we finished in the bottom half of the points table and had some convincing defeats, I think the side made some big improvement throughout the year.

We had a squad of fifteen — four girls and eleven boys. For six of the side it was their first year. We played sixteen games with one win, three draws and twelve losses.

To the credit of the team after being beaten by double figures against the top teams, they never gave up and most were back at training Wednesday nights. They backed up again the following Saturday which showed the side had a great spirit.

Damen Jones, Goalkeeper

Damen started as a half and moved into the goal partway through the first round. Damen made some brilliant saves through the year including a stroke against Bankstown in the dying moment of the game which gave us a draw. A big future, lacks a little confidence about leaving his goal to take on opposition forwards.
