I have great pleasure in presenting for your consideration and adoption the following review of your Club's activities during season 1937.

But before doing so it will not be out of place to review the progress the Club has made since it's inception.

In 1931 Brother Mc Carten, a former Indian International, founded the St. James Sports Club's Hockey team which entered the "B" Grade Conceptition and were successfull in annexing the Kippax Cup.

In Season 1932 a Reserve Grade team was entered with like success being Undefeated Premiers.

Season1933 saw the inauguration of the Glebe District Hockey Club to secure District status, 2 teams were fielded A. Grade and B. Grade The A Grade side securing 10th place whilst the "B" Grade shared Premiership honour s with Manly losing only one match during the Season.

- 2 Teams were again entered in Season 1934 the "A" Grade finishing 9th, the Reserve Grade produced another winning competition team again anexing the Pilgrim Cup.
- 3 Terms were entered for the first time in Season 1935, the "A" Grade were runners up to University losing 3 matches, the Reserve continued their Premiership success of Season 1934. The "B" Grade finished 6th.

Season 1936 2 teams from the Glebe Hockey Club and I from the St. James Debating Society were entered, the "A" Grade were fifth, the Reserve Grade were Runners Up to Y.M.C.A. No record of the "B" Grade team were kept.

The Club up to this stage has an unenviable record as the following figures will show-.

Jim Kenny has been the Full Back of the First Grade team for the past 3 years and his game has at all times been of the highest standard.

Jack Andrews has for years been selected to "Rep" with Metrop. teams both in Sydney and Goulburn so as to his ability we need no further mention.

Tom Pearce is the most brilliant and outstanding player produced by the Glebe Club and has gained the Honours that all Hockey players strive for viz- His Australian and State Colours, hoping he will continue the same form in the coming season.

Tom Barklimore ks. Left Winger was the best player who has played in in that position for the Club and only for leaving us to go to the Country I am sure he would have gained Metropolitan honcurs this season.

Jack Quinlan "Our Treasurer" and a very good one, so far has failed to catch the eye of the selectors, a solid player and great team man, one of the never trains but is attending Grace Bros\_Gym this Season so we should see so great games from John Logan this season.
