Mr. Chairman & Gentlemen,

Despite enlistments and military call up, we found it possible to field complete teams.

During the coming season we must expect greater demands than ever and we must concentrate more on our Junior players.

GROUNDS:

1ST. GRADE SUMMARY:

At the conclusion of the Season the 1st Grade team were 4 points ahead of Western Suburbs, so winning the Markham Cup. The Club spirit and team work was again noticable. This we expect from our defence, but our forward line were noted for fine team work also.

At the conclusion of the season the Association again conducted a 5 aside Carnival, 4 teams from Glebe were fielded and the Carnival concluded with a Glebe Final, the old timers winners of 1940, J.
