During the year your Management Committee has been endeavouring to find a solution to the lack of new players, this is something which your club has been suffering from for a number of years now and if something is not done soon the name of the Glebe District Hockey Club could become extinct. We seem to be able to get boys in the 10 to 14 year group but then they move out of the area and we lose them. To this I am afraid there is no solution as our area has gradually become a passing through area where families pause long enough to save money to buy a home and then move on.

With this thought in mind your Committee approached the Western Suburbs Hockey Club with a view of having talks regarding a possible amalgamation of the two clubs. A combined committee meeting was called and held in our Club room. Many points were discussed at this meeting including name of club, club colours, etc. Nothing binding was decided upon but it was suggested at the meeting and is recommended to you by your committee that the incoming committee go into the amalgamation thoroughly this coming year and if necessary call a special General Meeting of the Club to decide whether we amalgamate or not. Unless someone can come up with a better suggestion I am afraid there will be nothing left for us but to combine with Western Suburbs.

Once again we had a successful season on the field, you will see by our records we were Minor Premiers in 1st and 2nd Grades and 4th Grade made the first four. 1st Grade alone were able to carry on and win the competition with 2nd and 4th Grades both being beaten in the Grand Final. We lost the Club Championship this year to Ryde by (1) point so you can see we were up there trying. Our congratulations must go to Ryde and St. George on their successes last year.

REPORT ON 3rd Grade :

Congratulations to Ryde for ultimately emerging as winners of the 1963, 3rd Grade premiership. The standards in physical condition and discipline together with the manner in which Ryde's players conducted themselves, on the field, for the entire competition proved to be too much for all opposition. From Glebe's point of view lets hope our 3rd Grade can match Rydes, in the coming season.

After being premiers of the 1962 season this grade was probably expected to equal its previous years feat. However, many explanations could be offered as to why our particular team was not so triumphant.

In seasons past the Reds have been a blend of experience with youth but this was not the case last season. The youthfulness and keenness were present whereas the experienced players were only limited to the half backs and how could a forward line be expected to function without one seasoned player. This point became evident when Denis Brown, Alan Westacott, Cliff Boyd and Mick Dries combined with Pat Nilan at the Manly carnival - the result was the team reached the semi-finals.

Another major factor which could have turned defeat into success was the club's support especially from the first grade team. In previous years, first graders have given up their time and coached our lower teams along, but in the season just finished there weren't too many of our top eleven on the side line at 12.45. In match after match untold opportunities were not capitalised on. Thus allowing our opponents to gain the upper hand even though they appeared to be inferior in all-round Hockey ability.

I feel sure had these faults been corrected earlier in the season our boys would have given a much better account of themselves and would have gone a great deal further towards taking out premiership honours. Although the Reds failed to qualify for the semi-finals there were quite a few outstanding individuals efforts throughout the competition:-
