Mr. Chairman and Gentleman.

I have great pleasure in presenting for your consideration and adoption the following report of the Club's activities during the season 1940.

The season covered by this report was undoubtedly our most successful since the Club's inauguration, having won the Markham and Walbow Cups (1st. grade), the Pilgrim Cup (2nd. Grade), and the 3rd. Grade side won the M.H.A. Comp., only to be defeated by Kirribilli from the North side of the Harbour for the Kippax Cup after a very exciting game. Our 4th. Grade team although not so successful played the game always, and revealed a wealth of talent which will be well appreciated in the next year or so. The congratulations of the Club are extended to the Kirribilli and Granville teams for their success in their respective competitions.

Despite several enlistments and the calls made upon players by Military Training, we always found it possible to field complete teams as most of our Trainees seemed to enjoy a reasonable amount of Leave, both Bona Fide and otherwise. The fact that our membership stood at the high figure of 60 during the year was also a contributing factor to our success in this direction. During the forthcoming season we must expect greater demands than ever upon our players and it is to the younger players that we look to keep the game going and prevent curtailment of the "GAME THAT GROWS."

#### GROUNDS.

The Home Grounds at our disposal again consisted of St. Paul's Oval and Allen's Reserve, however arrangements may be more satisfactory in the coming season if recent efforts of our Club's Officials prove to be successful. Allen's Reserve and Jubilee Oval were also used for training purposes on Sundays and week nights respectively and the members are to be congratulated on their attendances at such practices particularly the younger players.

#### SOCIAL.

During August 1940 two Club Teams participated in a Carnival held by The Berrima District Hockey Assn. at Moss Vale and despite the fact that we enjoyed only a small measure of success the trip proved to be socially one of the highlights of the Season especially for the members who still maintain a steady correspondence in that direction.

A similar trip was undertaken to Goulburn during September over the Foxall Cup week-end and although again unsuccessful some fine Hockey was played and witnessed. The journey home, both by 'road' and 'rail' will live for ever in the annals of Hockey.

Several Theatre Parties capably organised by the Social Committee proved to be very popular with the Club Members and a steady source of income.

Many Club Members were conspicuous by their non-attendance at the Annual Club Dance held in August, which resulted in a financial failure but for those present the evening proved a social success.

Considering the Sporting, Social and Financial aspects of the season under review, I think that we may reasonably assume that it was the most enjoyable yet experienced by any of the Club Members and I trust that the younger members

will strive to maintain the spirit of good-fellowship which has reigned in the past.

1st. Grade Summary.

At the end of the season the 1st. Grade Team was level on points with Cumberland and West. Suburbs but obtained the Markham Cup because of its superior goal average. This is mainly attributable to the fact that only 15 goals were scored against the side during the season which speaks well for the defence. The combination displayed was probably superior to that of previous seasons and despite frequent changes in the Forward Line the Team Work shown was excellent. At the conclusion of the season the Assn. conducted a 5 a side Carnival in aid of War Funds which was won by a Glebe Team comprising J. Quinlin, G. Mockler, C. Humphreys, T. Taylor and W. Ryan. They defeated the youthful and well conditioned Ryde Team in the final match after an exciting tussle. The Carnival was conducted by Mr. E. G. Foskett and a group of helpers who are to be congratulated on their fine administration.
