Report of the Management Committee and Honorary Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Payments.

To the Office Bearers and Members of the Glebe District Hockey Club: Gentlemen:

I present for your consideration and adoption the Seventeenth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

At the conclusion of Seasion 1949 our club had added further laurels to their already imposing record both on and off the field.

For the second consecutive year we were successful in winning the First, Second and Third Grade Premierships, but only after an uphill fight. Having let the Minor Premiership slip from their grasp, the second grade team played brilliant hockey to win their remaining matches, the grand final producing a high standard of hockey. In the Minor I Semi Final our team surprised their most ardent supporters by holding the powerful Mosman team till the last fifteen minutes, their ultimate defeat by one goal was a grand performance. Unfortunately the Under 16 Competition was upset by transport restrictions, but owing to the good work carried out by Vernon Turner, we have rosey prospects for the future. Having won the Club Championship for the second successive year we must look to 1950 and hope we may be the first club to complete the hat trick.

Season 1949 did not see any noticeable result in our quest for a club room, however at the time of writing, the matter is under discussion and we can only hope for success in this venture in the near future.

FIRST GRADE:

As has been the case now for some years we were once more able to field a First Grade Team which promised to maintain the comparatively high standard of play which we endeavour to preserve at all times in the well-founded belief that good example means much to the lower grade players. Our confidence was not misplaced and it is pleasing to record that our Firsts enjoyed a most successful season, being defeated on only one occasion by Eastern Suburbs.

Contrary to expectations, they even successfully negotiated their semifinal and final games which have often been their downfall in previous years. A Grade Final was not then necessary as our team were the Minor Premiers. It is worthy of note that Eastern Suburbs only lost the Minor Premiership on goal average and appeared to be defeated by Glebe in the Final on their "day off". They are to be congratulated on their consistency throughout the season under review. With few exceptions the general demeanour of the team was excellent, which, combined with a general spirit of co-operation made the Season indeed a happy one for individual team members.

SECOND GRADE:

Although the Second Grade Team were at the "beck and call" of our Senior Team from the point of view of necessary replacements, they successfully overcame this disadvantage during Season 1949, and combined to such good effect that they eventually captured the major honours of their competition. Having commenced the season disastrously with a lost game, this team improved to such effect that they were not beaten again throughout the season, although they were twice held to hard fought draws. Despite their enviable record, their performances were not good enough to win the Minor Premiership which was annexed by the brilliant St. George 2nd Grade Team whose performance was a credit to their club and their win was richly deserved. To defeat such a team in the Final and Grand Final by the odd goal was highly creditable, the standard of play in the latter game being particularly high.

As was the case during 1948 the team comprised a number of players who were pressing hard for inclusion in the First Grade side which had the effect of keeping both sides on their mettle. We shall hear much more of these players in the near future.

THIRD GRADE:

The Third Grade side had the services of no less than twenty four players at different times throughout the year and consequently takes the honours for team disruption throughout the season. Generally speaking this team showed a marked superiority throughout their respective competition and remained undefeated until the last qualifying round when they suffered a narrow defeat at the hands of University, who confirmed their form by winning the final against Glebe by a lone goal. In the Grand Final our boys rose to the occasion and, producing of their best, turned the tables and ran out winners by 2 - 1. University are to be congratulated on their fine displays at the latter end of the season.

It was always a pleasure to watch this team in action as they always seemed to thoroughly enjoy their game and exhibited very fine team spirit and unselfishness, which means so much to the participants.

MINOR I TEAM:

For the first time for many years we fielded a team in the Minor I Competition which did not have a strong nucleus of players with considerable experience. The team comprised several of our 1948 under 16 Team and a number of new members who had not had a great deal of previous experience.

Naturally the team suffered many setbacks throughout the season especially when opposed to more seasoned players, but their progress was highly commendable and they made up in enthusiasm what they lacked in skill and fieldcraft. Although some of their defeats were severe enough to dampen the ardour of the most loyal they succeeded in finishing fourth in their competition, thus winning their way into the semi-finals. They were defeated in this match 1-0 by Mosman Veterans who had previously beaten them to the tune of 9-0 and 12-0. The game was not without its anxious moments for the Vets who ultimately won the Competition, and we could not help being gratified at such improvement.

As with the other teams, their general demeanour was good and we should always foster this above all if the game is to forge ahead and hold the attraction of our small army of supporters.

This cup is awarded to the player who is in the opinion of the Management Committee the most improved and best behaved junior; the latter part being overlooked by some members. Allan Halls is awarded the cup for Season 1949, and is to be commended for his selection and we look forward to the day when he shall make his presence felt in the higher grade teams.

COUNTRY CARNIVALS:

Season 1949 saw us well represented at country carnivals, participating at Moss Vale, Goulburn and Bathurst. Our first trip to Moss Vale resulted in our No. 1 Team returning with the Cup after a number of hard fought battles.

For the first time we dispensed with our usual Saturday evening trip to Goulburn and ventured down in the early hours of Sunday morning, a worthwhile innovation. Once again Goulburn proved our stumbling block and again our No.1 team reached the Semi Finals only to be defeated at the hands of Bathurst. I don't think there is any need to mention that our No.1 Jonah Bill Ryan went to Goulburn.

Fresh from victories in the Sydney Finals a large party ventured to Bathurst by bus in glorious weather and were successful in returning with the Henderson Shield for the second consecutive year. Before winning the Final our No. 1 team proved themselves grand finishers by coming from behind to win their last three games. They also tell me Harry Wark almost came from behind to score.

All transport arrangements for the country carnivals were in the hands of Noel Walker and he is to be congratulated for the efficient manner in which he carried out the task.

XMAS RAFFLE:

Quite a lot of discussion has arisen over the decision of the Management Committee to increase the price of this year's raffle tickets. The object of most efforts of this nature is to return as much profit as possible, and our idea was no exception, thus we arrived at our decision.
