Report of the Management Committee and Hon. Treasurer's Statement of Receipts and Payments.

To the Office Bearers and Members of the Glebe District Hockey Club:-

Gentlemen:-

I present for your consideration and adoption the Nineteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement.

During the existence of the Glebe Club in Metropolitan Hockey Competitions, never before has such a hard and trying season been experienced than that which has just passed. Throughout the entire season, no game went by without more than the average number of players unavailable.

Much praise must be given to our panel of selectors for their wisdom and judgment in framing our teams each week as it was mainly due to their efforts that all our teams reached the Finals. The players must also be congratulated on their efforts and patience, as the many changes that were made in our teams each week proved quite an ordeal, but as usual the good spirit and sportsmanship shown by the members speaks volumes for the loyalty which prevails in the Club.

Although only successful in winning the First and Third Grade Premierships, our beaten teams with any sort of luck could easily have made our tally for the season even greater.
