PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

TO THE OFFICE BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GLEBE DISTRICT

To my way of thinking this grade is the testing ground for junior players. You need a coach and not so much changing around of the team. It is up to members to give it serious thought for the coming season.

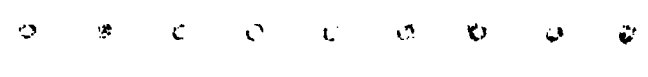
