REPORT ON 2nd GRADE :

It is with great pleasure and pride that I have to write the 2nd Grade Report for 1964.

This team in my opinion was the best 2nd Grade team Glebe and Sydney has ever seen, slightly better than that famous team the "ALL STARS". It takes a lot more than eleven above average players to form a good hockey team, it takes eleven above average players who have the team and the Club at heart and who are prepared to listen to the advice and comments of one man, the Captain. They also have to be keen and train and a very big percentage of the team turned out at every training session. Three players that improved their game out of sight by doing this were Billy Stubbs, Martin Howe and Graham Shirley.

REPORT ON 3RD GRADE :

The teams were entered in the Sydney competition at the end of the season, one in the Under 12, and the other in the Under 10 Division. Our Under 12 team made the Semi-Finals but were beaten by Canterbury after extra time was played. We also entered two teams in the Cumberland Carnival, but they failed to make the Semi-Finals, although the boys had a most enjoyable day. This year to encourage the boys three trophies were donated for the "BEST AND FAIREST" players.

The Committee responsible for the coaching and Management of the boys consisted of P. NILAN, B. GOODRICK, M. HOWE, K. WEEKES., V. ESTACOTT and R. BROWN. The season was quite good, in as much as many new players were introduced to the game and it

is hoped next year not only to increase the numbers but to win the Sydney competition.
