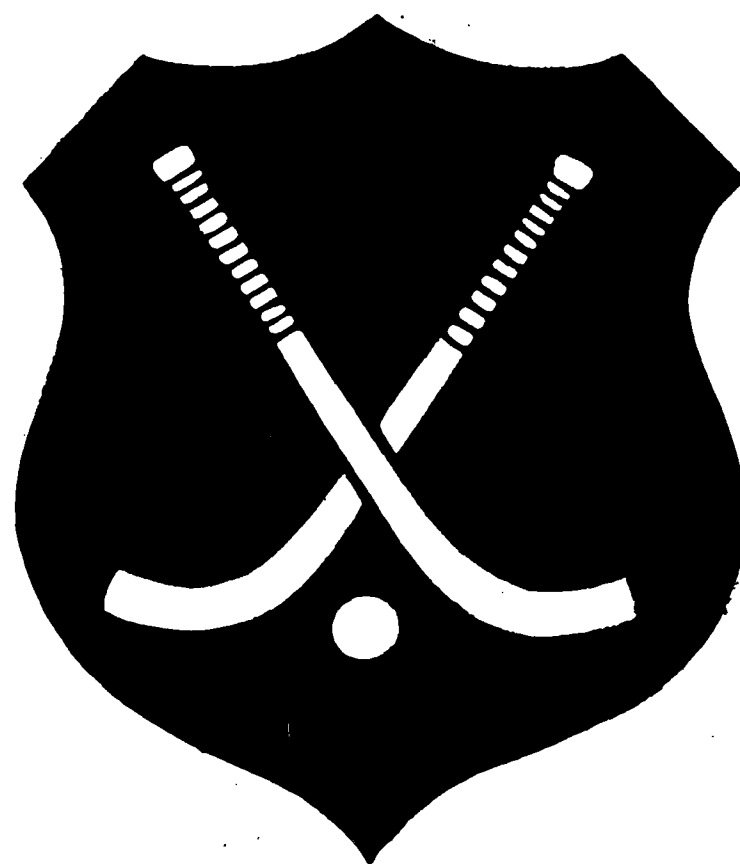

GENTLEMEN :

On behalf of myself and the Management Committee I present to you the 36th Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Glebe District Hockey Club, for consideration and adoption.

1968 was a season of mixed fortune. Our 1st Grade for the second year in succession was defeated in the Semi-Final in which they did not produce the form they had shown throughout the 2nd round of the 1968 season. The difference between the two sides was probably a little more determination by the North Sydney players plus that run of the play luck at the right moment. A determined deserved win by Norths who gave the eventual Premiers Moorebank, a shock in the final. Our congratulations to Moorebank on a fine and well deserved premiership victory.

In contrast 2nd and 3rd grades again won their respective competitions. 2nds their 5th in a row and thirds their 3rd in a row. Well done both teams. Both sides had their moments during the year but as the year progressed they improved immeasurably to become Premiers. A special mention to a new Member, that is Tom Harvey, and a sincere thank you for making a special trip from Melbourne two (2) week-ends in a row to play in the finals.

All the Club members to be congratulated on again winning the Club Championship, our 15th in 21 years (including one joint win with Ryde) and our 5th in a row. Well done.

To Fourth Grade, our commiserations, on a disappointing year, but it is about time we established some way in giving greater support to this grade. The management Committee is at present investigating the possibility of obtaining another ground close to Jubilee Oval so that at least half of their games will be played close to home. Maybe this will help as we may be able to have some supporters attend these games plus the fact that with a bit of organisation we may have a 5th Grade in 1969.

FINANCIAL

Financially the Club had one of its worst in a number of years. Although our expenses were comparative in total with the previous two (2) years our income was more than cut in half. This was brought about by the failure of the Majority of the members failing to attend the few socials provided and in particular the neglect of the members to support the 250 and 100 Clubs the Management Committee attempted to start.

The main reason for decrease in funds is the failure of the Club to raise or produce income and I only hope that 1969 there will be a drive to increase our financial funds.

JUNIORS :

The Club had five (5) teams in 1968. Although the only premiership we won, was by the Under 10 Glebe Team, all teams performed in a manner which was a credit to the Glebe Club. Congratulations to all teams and to the Glebe Under 10's on their 2nd Premiership win in a row. Also to Graham Gilmour their coach, well done Graham.

= To the coaches and main supports and organisers the Club thanks you for the time and effort they put into the Juniors. They were, Graham Gilmour, Pat Nilan, Robert Brown, Colin Brown, John Cowan, Russ Nicholls, Molly Wark and Col Dean. There were others but these were the main ones who turned up most weeks, in fact there was a number who turned up regularly as spectators. Although the roster system helped there was definitely greater interest shown by the majority of the members during the 1968 season. This is good for the Juniors as it will make them keener in the coming years. The best performed Roster Team was that led by Russ Nicholls and a small presentation will be made to his roster team members.

The roster system will operate again in 1969 so to all members where possible, get behind it. A grateful thank you to Glebe Police Boys Club for their assistance in supplying two (2) teams and equipment for 1968. It helped the Club's funds immeasurably.

Finally a special thanks to a couple of the youngsters parents, that is, Cath Casey and Maureen Cowan for their efforts in helping the previous persons mentioned and the Club in raising funds, running socials and washing and caring for the Juniors equipment.

#### SOCIALLY

1968 was probably our greatest season on record. No trip to Valley Brisbane, I believe the greatest fault in not going to Brisbane is because our Senior members (mainly 1st and 2nd grade players) showed lack of interest. I know that there is probably good reason for not going but we have given the Club a bad stigma in not going which will be hard to overcome in later years. Our sincere apologies to Valley for not repaying their 1967 visit in 1968. Lets start saving for the next trip which will probably be in 1970 as Valley has indicated their willingness to visit in 1969.

Most socials were not run at a loss and those who attended had an enjoyable time.

Although West Newcastle Leagues day cost us a few dollars it was one of our most successful socials for 1968. We have to repay the visit in 1969 by sending three (3) teams. Let us all get behind it and go.

The Annual Cabaret was a ripper and our most successful in years. Yes, we made a profit on the night.

To Cath Casey for holding a B.B.Q. at her place to the other members who made their places available. Lets have more well attended socials in 1969.

To the members, their wives and girl-friends who gave their time to help during the year at socials, hockey games and carnivals, and made each of these events successful, I would like to thank all of them on behalf of the Management Committee and the Club Members.

I would like to thank the Management Committee, all Office Bearers, and sundry workers for their help during the past year. In particular to our Secretary, Fred Letts and his wife Carole thank you very much. There are few people in this Club who realise the work that Fred, as secretary, does for the Club even to the extent of this year, attending ordinary committee meetings with the members who have had to appear. On behalf of the members thank you Fred.

Finally, we have had a few set-backs in 1968, let us put them behind us, start afresh for 1969, take a feather out of the cap of those who have shown us that we would all do a little bit of work for the Club, put our noses and shoulders to the ground and let's steam roll the opposition in 1969, both on and off the field. Make Glebe remain on top in 1969 and in the years to come.

In conclusion from the Club members to Pat Nilan and the rest of the Australian Team - congratulations on a wonderful performance in winning the Silver Medal at the games.

I wish every member the best for Christmas and a Happy New Year and every success both on and off the field in 1969.
