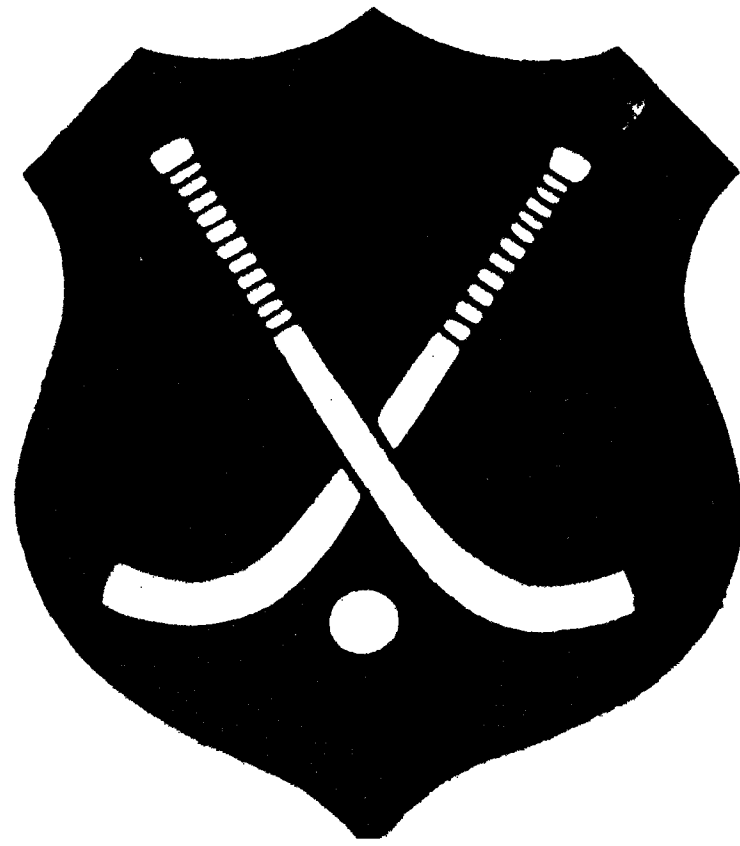

PRESIDENTS REPORT :

1971 p 2

Gentlemen,

On behalf of myself and the Management Committee, I present to you the 39th Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Glebe District Hockey Club, for your consideration and adoption.

In 1971 we fielded five (5) Senior Teams and with no success, even though four (4) of the five teams reached the semi-finals, with 2nd Grade playing in the finals and 5th Grade reaching the Grand Final. As President, it was extremely disappointing to find that our players could not fulfil one of the first requirements in playing Hockey - that is, trapping the ball, which is the first requirement we insist that our Juniors learn to do correctly. The inability to trap the ball, in particular 1st and 5th Grades, most surely cost us a premiership. The seniors will have to take a page out of the Juniors books and learn the fundamentals of the game, which has been drummed into the Juniors by some of our Senior players.

The most heartening feature during the year was the improvement shown by the younger Club members in Senior games. This surely sounds the warning that Glebe is on the march back to the top within two or three years, (I hope sooner) irrespective of the opinions of some St. George players and Club Members.

The Club congratulates all other Clubs, who were fortunate to win a premiership and a thank you to those teams who gave us sporting games during 1971. A special congratulations to St. George on winning for the 3rd consecutive year 1st and 2nd Grade Premiership and the Club Championship.

FINANCIAL

Our financial position continues to improve and our thanks and congratulations to Frank Whiteman for a job well done in controlling and collecting funds. Our Total Liquid funds are \$5,680, which includes Cash at Bank and on Hand \$3,680 and Investments \$2,000. Our Fund Raising efforts were :

Congratulations Juniors and Coaches for another great effort in making us the Junior Club Champions - Again. The Club will for many years to come, be indebted to the Junior Coaches and organisers, as it is apparent that our future strength will develop from these five young and talented teams. Thank you Graeme Gilmour, Charlie Brown, Colin Brown, Garry Manou, John Atterton, Pat Nilan, Kevin Weekes, Molly Wark Paul Casey and to all those other workers and supporters who turned up Saturday mornings to help the Juniors and Coaches.
