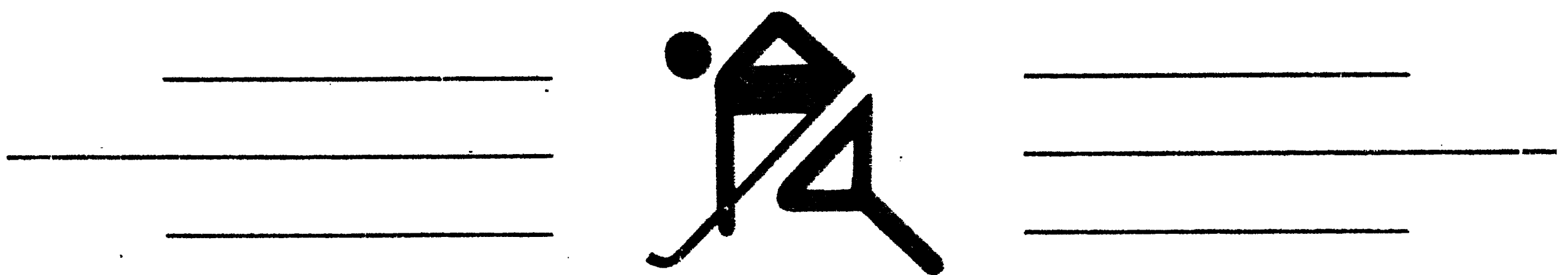

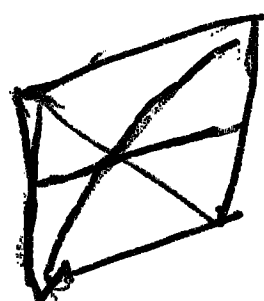

Hon Secretary's Report

I present to you the total membership of The Glebe District Hockey Club, this the 49th Annual Report of the Club. Unfortunately, this report is not up to the usual previous AR's in that it has been hastily prepared. I believe that most members are aware of how this occurred.

In this report I wish to comment on a number of aspects of the Club this year, as I saw and appreciated them.

Juniors: This year saw the poorest junior competition ever in living memory. If the comp is not improved this Club and other Central District clubs, will find ourselves stripped of District Status. Four junior teams are hardly enough to sustain us in the future. All seniors must take a more active part in the juniors any assistance is good assistance!

Hockey: In my opinion, Hockey is a sport of various levels: Rep, Social and competition/premiership. I feel that Glebe this season was unique in Sydney, with 8 senior, 4 junior and 3 womens teams. All levels of our game were to be found in all the three categories. The time is past when a Club such as ours can only cater for one facet of the game.

Club Size: This year the Club had 172 players on the books. I consider myself fortunate to know possibly all members of the Club and I appreciate their support and advice. At this size possibly the Club has grown and reached higher maturity. Should the Club remain at 172 members all up?

Social Life: 1979 wasn't the best for social side of Hockey. The season was fragmented and this lead to little social activity. Those socials that we had were some of the most enjoyable Hockey times - I think. Geoff Patto did a great as soul/sole social organizer. Googah Goodrich, did a terrific job with the 'canteen', Club members and guests did enjoy themselves.

Grounds: Federal Park (Wark Field) remained the focal point for Club hockey as well as being the venue for representative training and the ground for Eastern Districts Womens' Grand Finals. Ken Wark Snr, a little supported job well done. The "Stock Yard" was also used by lower grades - does anybody remember what the good 'Jub' was? In the air are plans to obtain trusteeship over a section of land on the other side of Federal Road, at Glebe Point. Unfortunately, some locals feel that Hockey should remain the poor relation in regards to grounds available and managed in the Municipality.

1980:- Juniors must be assisted at all costs, we will benefit. Training must be well attended, possibly a side that has frequently non training players should be made to forfeit. Club morale must be increased, don't just criticize be a participant. Jubilee Year is 1980 as far as I am concerned First Grade Premiership is not good enough, all premierships and championships must be Glebe's.

To the Club, thank you for 1979. Col Smith Thanks Make.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1979, a very mixed year, a disappointing year, a year of great change.

For the first time since 1971 no Glebe teams as Premiers of the Mens' Grades. For the first time in memory no Glebe teams in a Grand Final. At first look a disasterous year, but, let us look more closely. I personally feel that our playing record is not as bad as the record books show it to be.

The new competition format of the Sydney Association, certainly affected our results, however this may prove to be to our benefit in the future. The bleeding and improvement shown by the young men selected in our third grade team must strengthen our teams for future years. These mainly young players who did not look like making the semi-finals mid way through the season, improved so much as they gained experience and confidence played their way through to the Grand Final. A memorable effort by the players and their success augers well for future years.

With regard to our top team the record shows that we were beaten by North Sydney, the eventual Premiers, in the final. But again, looking closer we note that we lost five players from last seasons Grand Final team. Robert Diviney, Kevin Sweeney both through injuries, Harry "DOC" Wark furthering his career in England, the retirement of "MR HOCKEY" Pat Nilan and the loss to Sutherland of Graeme Lisk and not to mention the the partial loss of John McDonald through business. All these losses left huge gaps to be filled. The return of Greg Corben and the acquisition of Henry Lysaght plugged some holes, but the others whilst were(well)filled by other players and this created further gaps right through the grades, all the way down to our eighth grade.

Our First Division teams, our 4th 5th and 6th grade teams more than held their own against the 1st 2nd and 4th grade teams of their opponents. Glebe I feel adapted themselves to this situation, much better than any of the other Clubs, with one of our teams making the semi finals and being beaten on corners in the finals. The other two grades in first division were just dead unlucky not to play the semi's.

As with first division teams, our third division teams also acquitted themselves well. Often taking the field short of players, with others doubling up, one team made the finals only again to be beaten on a count back of points by the side that finished second on the competition table. Whilst the other team narrowly missed out on the semis finals.

Our Womens teams this year increased their numbers to field three teams. For better or for worse they decided to split their competition and one team remained in the North Shore comp and two teams entered the Eastern Districts competition.

The North Shore team played their way through to the Grand Final and after a draw at the end of playing time commenced a Penalty Stroke play-off for the Premiership, only to be beaten for year in succession. Our teams in the Eastern Districts also performed creditably in their respective competitions, although I feel they were both over graded.

Thank goodness for our Juniors, our Under 14's Premiers, and all other grades having successful seasons. Where would we be without John Diviney and his assistants coaches - thank you all from the rest of the Club.

FEDERAL PARK

This year we again played the majority of all our home games on Federal Park, soon we hope it to be renamed "WARK FIELD". Federal Park is now one of the best playing surfaces in Sydney. For this each and every Hockey player in the Club owes a huge debt to Ken Wark who continues almost single handed to maintain and improve the surface. May I tactfully suggest that each and every one of us "PULL THE FINGER OUT" and support Ken by helping him where possible and attending the Working Bees when called.

INDOOR HOCKEY

The Club again retained the Joe Krepp Trophy for the Super 8 Competition. Again playing with the kind sponsorship of the TOTAL OIL Company, the Total-Glebe team were

too strong for University of NSW in the Grand Final.

Whilst I may have been amiss in my role of President of the Club in not being more forceful with many members, I hope to improve next year if you the Members re elect me for a further year.

On behalf of all members I would sincerely thank all those members both playing and social who run the raffle at the Toxteth Hotel each week. These members keep this Club solvent and help to keep the fees at the present level. I again request the assistance of any member who can attend these raffles to please do so and whilst attending please also assist.

To all members, wives and friends who assisted the Club during the year I thank you on behalf of the Management Committee and members and also congratulate all our representative players during the season.

In closing let me remind all members of the Club's slogan and motto "A CHAMPION CLUB - A CLUB OF CHAMPIONS". Let us all get together and work together for the betterment of the Club: Glebe back at - No 1.

Thus it was hard for us to settle on a regular combination and the continual flow of players coming through the team, set Pat a difficult task. However, congratulations must of course be given to all the young players who rose to the occasion when called upon to play 1st grade. Their performances augers well for Glebe's future in the competition.

Congratulations also to North Sydney on their long awaited Premiership.

A Club survives and gains strength from its First Grade side and we need a concerted effort from everyone, not just a loyal few.

The answers, from an old man are:

- (1) Most definitely. They have proved that more than others who have been in the Club a lot longer, by accepting their criticisms and acting on them.
- (2) They are good enough - providing that the Senior Members of the Club - Selectors etc do not bring them through the grades too quickly and run them out of steam which some would gladly do without thinking too deeply about it.

Dennis Brown and Barry Howe who when asked at the start of the season would they be prepared to be members of this very young team of players through the whole year and not be available for any other grade and said yes, this is a really superb Club attitude especially when these two Club members have to pay full fees and are prepared to turn up and not play or whatever to help these young people to be better hockey players. Thank you very much Dennis and Barry on behalf of the team for your generous and unselfish help - it's a pity there aren't more like the two of you and, now to the young. Many Club members may not know, that, in this team of young people we have two Captains of the NSW Under 16 side - namely Danny O'Brien and Craig Stubbs. Two other NSW Juniors - C Rochester and C McPhee and the other four are all Sydney Representatives Players. All I thought were a little surprised at the competition but after adjusting to the faster pace played quite well throughout. The times we ran into trouble were when we held onto the ball too long or we worried too much about the Umpires. It is very hard to single out individual players, but I think that Craig Stubbs

had an excellent season. We most definitely will see Craig around for a very long time. Craig McPhee also had a very good season - there is a lot more that we will hear about him.

To Danny O'Brien - the Vice Captain, a huge job for such a young man thank you very much. Once again, Dan had quite a good year and was consistent all the time.
