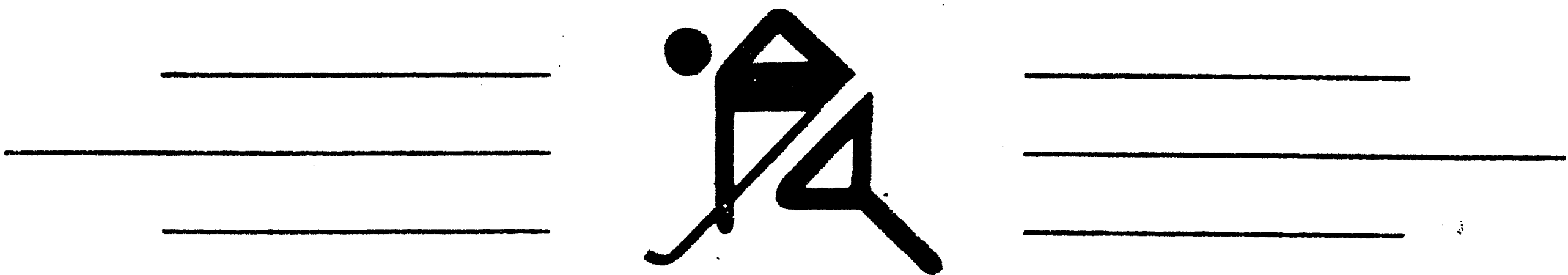

1980, Our 50th Year has come and gone with limited success on the playing field. However a vast improvement from 1979. We regained "Our Trophy" the Brian Halse Cup for being Premier Division Club Champions and annexed a new trophy when the Savage Seventh's won their premiership.

This year our Junior Teams continued to prosper under the guidance of our convenors John Diviney and Warren Dell. What a great job these gentlemen are doing along with the coaches etc in continually providing junior talent and pushing them through into grade. Their job is being made harder by first the lack of help from some senior members in Coaching, transporting etc and also by the difficulties that we are having in attractin young boys to this great sport. Any help that you can give our juniors will truly be appreciated and not only will it help our Juniors but it will build the Club back to its rightful place as the top club in Sydney and help maintain it there.

Womens Hockey

At last years Annual General Meeting the Club voted to disassociate themselves from womens hockey and this has been done. However, it is very pleasing to see that the women have continued on and annexed a Premiership and were Runners Up in another.

Equipment Report

1980 - p 30

This being my first year as equipment officer there were many areas that I was not sure of how to deal with. Thanks to the help of a few people who were able to give me guidance I became more assured.


REPORT OF THE AUDITOR TO THE MEMBERS
