REPORT OF THE AUDITOR TO THE MEMBERS

I have examined the Books and Accounts of the Glebe District Hockey Club.

In my opinion the Balance Sheet and Revenue Statements show a true and fair view of the Club's activities for the period ended 30th September 1981 and of the year ended on that date.

However, I would like to point out two highlights:

- (i) Loss on Insurance claims - Lawnmower - \$760.00.  
The lawnmower stolen during the period has been written off in full. If the Insurance Company reverses its decision either in part or full, the benefit will be shown in the year the income is received.
- (ii) Loss on equipment trading - \$1,270.00.  
This loss was mainly incurred as a result of the playing shirts being sold at half price. However the sponsorship received from the Toxteth Hotel was to compensate for this loss. Senior sponsorships income received was \$1,200.00.

It should be noted the Club achieved a net surplus of \$1,792 while in cash terms the cash at bank and Interest Bearing Deposits increased by \$4,018 from \$10,445 to \$14,463.

As recommended in my 1980 report, management should review the current cash position and it may be necessary to put further funds into Interest Bearing Deposits.
