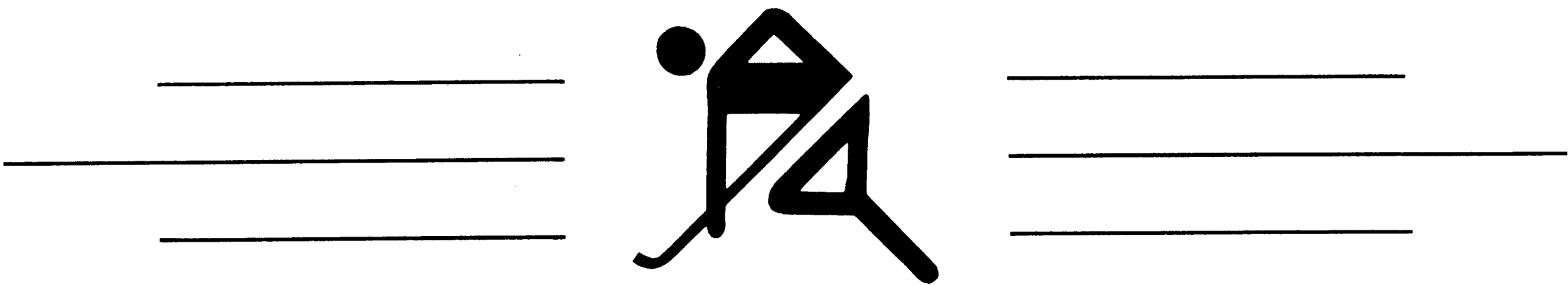

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1982

It is difficult to know where to start this year's report because of all the achievements that the Club has had through the year, so I think the best way is, to congratulate all on a really fine effort.

The year, as always, started with the indoor competition. The Club fielded four teams, namely, Super 10 A&B, Under 21's, and one other side at Taren Point. The Taren Point team won the knockout but were beaten in the Semi-final of the Sydney competition. The Under 21's just missed making the Semi-finals and the Super 10B side were beaten in their Semi-final. Well done to all these teams and it must be noted that the Under 21's had a lot of new players. Then came the announcement, that Pat Nilan was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in the New Year's Honours List. I know every Club member is proud of you Pat, and think that there is no one more deserving than you and am sure that they all join with me in congratulating you on your award, which I hasten to add is long overdue. Well done mate.

Next is the competition. This year saw two changes to the system. The first was that the Under 16's team was altered to Under 17's and entered into the same competition as Premier Division, secondly, the Veteran Competition was started.
