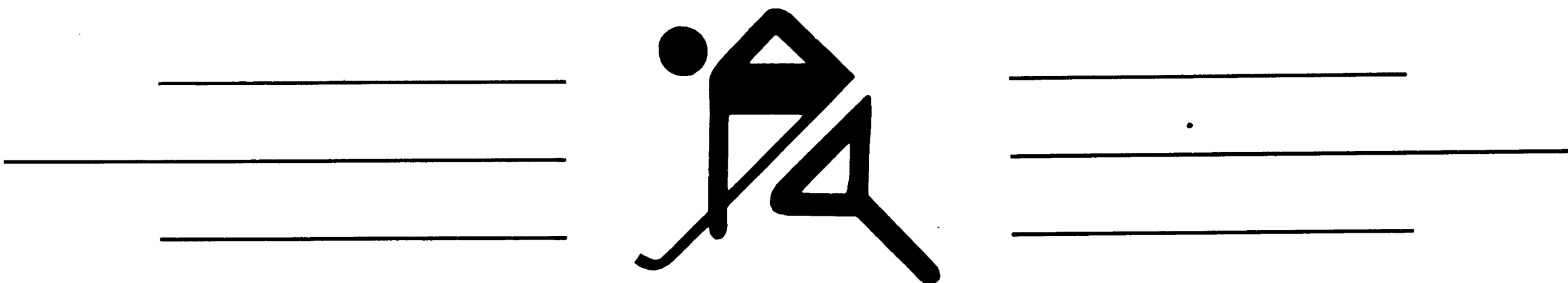

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1985

Gentlemen, I present to you the 55th Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the 1985 Season.

As you will be aware, this year has been my initial experience in serving the Club in any managerial capacity and I have been honoured to serve as President.

The Glebe District Hockey Club is one of which we can all be justly proud. The continued success of the Club has been achieved by the effort put in by the Management Committee coupled with the strong support given by the team coaches, players, social members and supporters.

However, it is most disconcerting to note that the support from the Club members has been limited to a small band of willing workers, as has been the case in past seasons. To these loyal members I can only say that your efforts have not gone unnoticed and are most appreciated. To those who have not contributed I trust that you will discard your apathetic attitude and give something back to the Club by participating in the future.

On the playing field the Club had a very successful season, resulting in two Senior Premierships with 3rd and 4th Grades winning the B2 and B4 competitions respectively. Furthermore, the under 17 side won their competition for the third time in the four years the competition has been run. Congratulations to all the players and coaches of these teams.

This year the Club fielded 6 Senior and 5 Junior sides. The overall achievements were:-

This is quite an impressive record I feel, for a Club limited in playing numbers and I extend further congratulations to all the players and coaches concerned.

The Club's Representative contingent this year has not been as successful as in past seasons, however special mention is given to Kenneth Wark Jnr. and Warren Birmingham for being selected in the Australian Team to compete in the Malaysian Tournament to be held in November/December this year. Well done Ken and Buster. Congratulations are also extended to Dave Bass who was selected in the Australian Veteran Team to play in Singapore.

There is a possibility that next year the Club may obtain sole rights to Jubilee Oval for which proposals have been put forward to the Leichhardt Council by Keith Paterson. Part of Keith's proposal is that the ground be modified to provide for two playing fields. We should be able to give you a progress report on the presentation night.

The Club achieved a "break-even" result in our finances this year. Major income was received from Telephone Book deliveries and the Toxteth Hotel raffles. It was supplemented by way of sponsorship and bar/canteen receipts.

Many thanks to Col Rochester for organising the raffles and to our Sponsors Video Bug and Raine & Horne. A special thank your to Jan Martin for her assistance in the bar/canteen.

This "break-even" result is considered most unsatisfactory, however, there are two major contributing factors to the Club's lack of fund raising.

- 1) Internal upheaval caused by resignation of Treasurer Neville Gullickson and;
- 2) Discontinuance of social functions due to lack of interest by members.

Obviously a much greater effort will need to be made in the future if the Club is to remain solvent.

In closing I would like to thank the Management Committee for their support during the seasons and in particular Keith Paterson who on an Administration level has been the "backbone" of the Club.

To all members and their families, I, on behalf of the Club, wish you all a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT 1985

In 1984 I listed seven (7) pertinent points which needed airing. The same matters are still relevant and the same criticism still applies.

4.----Jubilee Oval

This year we were able to restrict Rugby League to 9 days only, but by mid-season, the ground was so chopped up that we had to re-locate to Federal Park and Rugby League vacated the ground completely. As a result, we are now led to believe that Rugby League will not be played on Jubilee Oval in the future.

Federal Park

Partly due to the removal and dismantling of sections of the fence on Federal Road the ground was vandalised by cars and motor cycles.

Our lease on Federal Park expires in September, 1986 and while negotiations were in progress to re-new the lease, Council was informed that Federal Park was being taken over by the Maritime Services Board. This move was initiated so that the Goat Island workshops could be re-located to that section of the mainland adjacent to and including the hockey field, on the north side of the viaduct.

On your behalf, I have now submitted to Council a proposal that Jubilee Oval area be modified to adequately contain two (2) hockey fields and a turf cricket wicket.

So far, this proposal is still with Council, but from discussions so far, it is being favourably considered. The proposal also contains the laying down and grassing of a new grass field for juniors on the south side of the viaduct.

In this regard, I have now invited the Mayor, Bill Brady and Alderman Brian Thompson to attend our presentation night. I hope that they will have good news to report on that night.

5.----Ballguards etc.

These requirements apply from grades A1 down to B4. Fines for not complying with these by-laws cost us over \$400 in 1984. Our bill for this year is \$170. \$100 of this was incurred on 29/6/85 by B4 grade. I have challenged the account and will report later on the result.

Other fines for cards etc. were over \$400 in 1984.

Total for this year is \$37.00.

7.-----Sponsorship

Due to great work by Danny O'Brien, we received a healthy sum from 'Videobug' which allowed for the purchase of new shirts for the whole club. Raine & Horne have also honoured the promise of 1984 and donated a further \$250.00.

However, due to the costs at Homebush Bay, we will have to reconsider the budget for 1986, if further sponsorship is not available.

Generally, this year started off with a good field at Jubilee, and a good field at Federal Park. By half way during the season, all had changed. Jubilee Oval was destroyed by Rugby League and everybody had to share Federal Park.

As of now, we have virtually lost Federal Park, but we may have two fields at Jubilee Oval.

The increased takings from the Toxteth raffles reflect great credit on Col Rochester and his helpers.

My thanks go to Peter Howe for taking over the compilation of the total report due to my hospitalisation.

I now submit to you, for your adoption, this, the 55th Annual Report of the Glebe District Hockey Club.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING
30TH SEPTEMBER, 1985

As at the time of preparing this report the Revenue Statement and Balance Sheet are with the Honorary Auditors for examination. Consequently I am not in a position to report in detail on the year's financial achievements and will provide a general report only.

The Club made a small profit this year, however, the revenue returns have been effected by the following:-

- 1) Random Breath Testing - still being a major contributor to depressed Bar Trading.
- 2) Non attendance at Social Functions arranged during the season. Arthur Moir had to discontinue organisation of the functions due to lack of interest by members.
- 3) Non payment of fees by members.

The above was offset by income received from Telephone Book Deliveries and Sponsorship supplemented by Toxteth Hotel Raffles. Many thanks to all those members who were involved in these fund raisers.

There is a possibility of two fields being available on Jubilee Oval next season and if so, all five teams should be playing there every consecutive week. In such an event there is every reason to expect an increase in Bar/Canteen receipts as well as more participation in Socials by members.

No doubt there will be much discussion on the financial position of the Club at the A.G.M. when at such time I will look forward to any proposals to alleviate our present problems in raising revenue.

CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT - 1985

With the restructuring of the competition this year and the subsequent regrading of some of our teams it became a difficult task to assess how Glebe would perform in 1985.

We had the usual influx and exodus of players to and from the Club but when the dust settled we were left with six senior sides to enter in the competition.

Our first achievement of the year came when we had three teams (1st's, 3rd's and 4th's) competing in the Alan Yates Memorial Shield/Cup for the top two teams in each grade as at the end of the first round.

All games were against North Sydney and despite the beautiful sunshine and playing surface we were unable to achieve the results we would have liked.

Fourth Grade fell victim 2 - 1 as did Third Grade while First Grade unluckily lost in a flick off, after drawing nil all.

Next came the semi-finals with only 6th Grade unfortunately unable to gain a first four position. First and Fifth grades played in the minor semis while 2nd, 3rd and 4th Grades played in the major semis. Results were:-

Despite losing their minor semis both 4th and 3rd Grades fought their way back in to the Grand Final with wins of 2 - 1 and 3 - 2 respectively against Macquarie University and Liverpool.

This set the scene for a big day as the U/17's also qualified for the Grand Final. Due to heavy rain the scheduled day for the Grand Final was postponed to the following Friday night on the new Supergrass pitch at the State Sports Centre. This created more excitement and raised questions on whether this would suit our sides or disadvantage them. Results were:-

Fourth Grade proved to be too superior and were never really troubled in a game that didn't reach any great heights.

Third Grade was without doubt one of the most drama/charged, action packed games in years. The game had everything with them being down and seemingly out trailing 2 - 0 at half-time. However, right from the start of the second half the team rallied and with 11 seconds remaining in the game scored the equaliser, and the decider in extra time.

Second Grade unfortunately met a very hot Sutherland Second Grade side (one we never saw before all year) and were not disgraced in going down 5 -2.

Despite the fact we had a couple of the teams finish as minor premiers we were pipped in the Club Championship by North Sydney. There was only a few points separating the Clubs and hopefully next year we can capture the trophy that I'm sure we all feel belongs with us.

Off the field it was very disappointing to see the lack of support by the players in performing duties asked of them by the Club.

Two areas in particular were:-

- 1) Setting up of the goals, ball surrounds and getting umpires and ball boys. We all know what a "B" of a job it is but yet we still will not share the workload but rather leave it to the same few people and flog them to death.
- 2) The telephone books again this year produced attendances which were nothing less than miserable. TREASURERS REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER 1985

Gentlemen,

This is my first report as Treasurer since taking office in May 1985. At the date of this report, the club has 18 life members, 75 playing members and 23 social members.

The year resulted in a surplus of \$1,292, a slightly more healthy surplus than the \$800 budgeted. Significant variations from budget were firstly, poor bar trading resulting in a shortfall of income of \$3,000. Secondly, the loss of income did not allow the much needed expenditure on club house improvements.

The Bar/Canteen turnover in gross receipts was 52% down on 1984 and 84% down on 1983. The main cause being very poor patronage of the clubhouse. Without this continual cash flow from the bar the club will realise a much smaller profit for 1986.

The Club has a new sponsor in Video Bug and many thanks to them. Hopefully, Video Bug will support the club in 1986. Other sponsorship would also be welcomed. We also received sponsorship from Raine and Horne, Glebe for the under 17's, Thank you.

The Toxteth raffles even though down on last year proved very successful once again. Having assisted with the raffles on a few Friday nights, it is understood, and appreciated, how hard it is for them to be successful. More assistance is definitely needed next year to continue these raffles. Thanks to the Toxteth Hotel for allowing us to run them and to the persons who assisted in running these raffles during the year.

Equipment trading, even though realised a loss was slightly higher than last year. These stocks are still present but are of very little value.

Social and Carnivals this year were very poor. Our attendance at North Sydney and Tamworth gave a no win result. We must look at the future Carnivals with the entering of a full first grade side so that the resultant prize money can be won.

The Club again handled the telephone book deliveries resulting in almost \$4,000. But, however, too few people helped in this task. Because of this we may not be given the delivery contracts from Telecon next year.

Referring to fees: at present approximately 20 members remain unfinancial. Their names will be published, if needed. If fees are not paid on time then the clubs cash flow will become very critical at vital times during the playing season. This occurred in 1985 and if it was not for the support of one life member the creditability of the club would have seriously been impaired, which may have resulted in C.O.D terms. Accordingly, stricter controls will be required in 1986.

Major expenses for the season were as follows.

The club can expect a small profit in the next year, however for the surplus to remain, a 100% effort from ALL Club members, not a select few, will be needed. This also includes support for the phone book deliveries. To increase and develop higher profits, tougher controls are needed to be kept through bar trade, equipment trade and more importantly more bar patronage. Further, more social functions, raffles (at Toxteth and at Clubhouse) can increase the very moderate surplus.

I have budgeted for an increase in playing fees in 1986 to cover a forecasted 12.5% increase in S.H.A. fees due to Homebush Bay.

In conclusion, many thanks to all members of the Club Management for their complete support and especially my two assistant treasurers, firstly Carl Francis and secondly Neville Gullickson, who assisted in the completion of the accounts for this report. Thanks guys.
