- Is our method of selection adequate/obsolete?
- Should club functions/duties be on team basis rather than fall on individuals?
- 5. Sponsorship- Necessity
- If not necessary what are we going to do to raise funds?
- 6. Training - How much importance should we place on it?
- What nights - do we assess each team and arrive at a night which suits the majority?

I hope we all look at these matters and give due consideration to each one with the view to us formulating a policy which we as a Club can implement on a short term basis (say 2 - 5 years)
