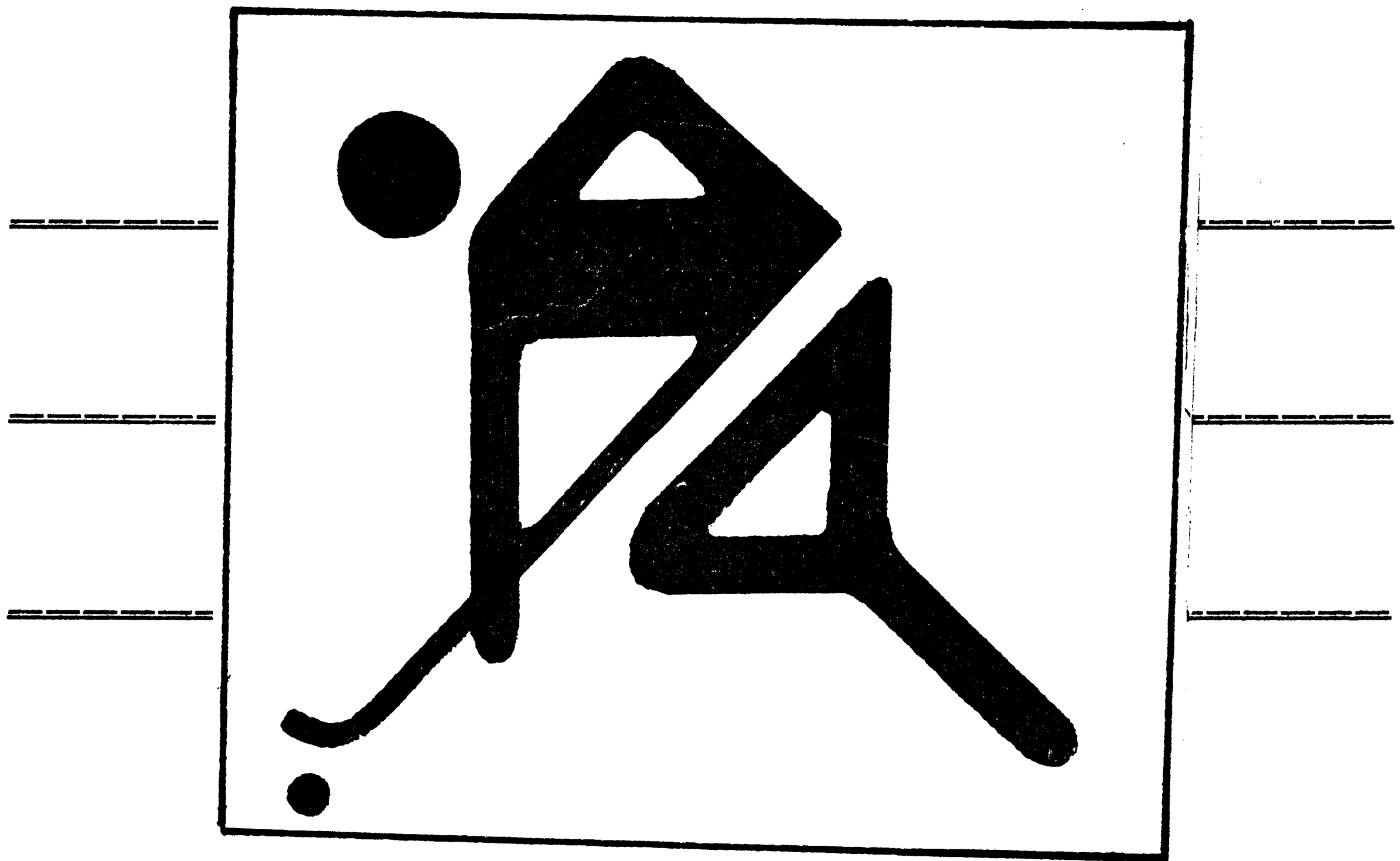

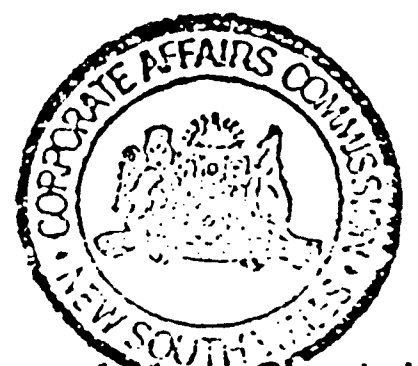

As with every club continued success lies with their junior base, and as with Sydney Seniors, Sydney Junior numbers are dwindling and although we are doing our part in building junior numbers with our great success of our Minkey programme which is a credit to Peter Busch and his undoubted expertise in this area. It will be a few years before we see full strength in our 17's age group and this must continue at all our junior levels.

Umpires: As the President I have been disappointed with the Clubs out look towards Umpires. We must have more discipline both on and off the field and more compassion for a thankless job.

I assure you Umpires realise they make mistakes, that is the human factor, and whether they get paid large amounts of money, as in Rugby League or Test Cricket mistakes are made, so our adjudicators are not alone in this area.

To this end every effort should be made by this Club to participate in having player umpires, so rather than criticise, let's get on with raising the level of consistency in umpiring and creating a better playing environment for all hockey players.

Thanks to our many lady volunteers behind the bar and Harry Wark Snr, our Bar Manager for their continued work both on Wednesdays and Saturdays, as can be seen by our bar trading account, we cannot run the club and continue financial support for all to benefit unless we continue to support the Clubhouse where ever possible. As I mentioned before, the example set by the juniors of a Wednesday night has brought the Club to life again, with a regular Barbeque and a few soft drinks and I feel that the Seniors could carry this on after training on a regular basis to lift our Club spirits and team morale.

In closing I would like to thank my wife, Maureen for her continued support and involvement this year. I hope to see everyone again in 1993 and to have an enjoyable and successful year.

TURF REPORT

It has been a year of chipping away at the bureaucratic and political walls.

A Club Person mightn't have seen much for his dollar up front at present, except a plan on the notice board, a partition to sign, or a meeting to attend when the call was made to rally around the Glebe banner.

All these things have helped the Turf cause. The Council have become very supportive of the Glebe District Hockey Club finding a suitable field to accomodate the Turf and has a new respect for the Club's Heritage and the relationship to the people in the Glebe area.

The Hockey Club with Council Support has approached the NSW Harness Racing Club to allow us to place a field in the middle of the trotting track. This was highlighted when the Annual Report of the Harness Club showed the hockey field in their new track extensions.

Further discussions have taken place with the Harness Racing Club's architect to discuss the Glebe Club's requirements ie. Field location, lighting, seating, amenities and future Club House. The Development Application (DA) for the track extension, which will include the hockey field and amenities is to be submitted to Council by the 1st February, 1993.

As the Council is basically supportive of the proposal, the DA is expected to be passed after the required administrative procedures have been addressed.

The only obstacle that could hold up the starting of the track extension which would include the hockey field, would be if re-zoning of the land near the canal is required. If this is not required, work should commence in early 1994.

The Club now has to organise for the challenge of funding the Turf in 1993.

I would like to thank my Committee for all their support and help. When things looked down and out, one would come up with an idea to start progressing again. Without them the Club would not have been this far along the Turf brick road to get to artificial land.

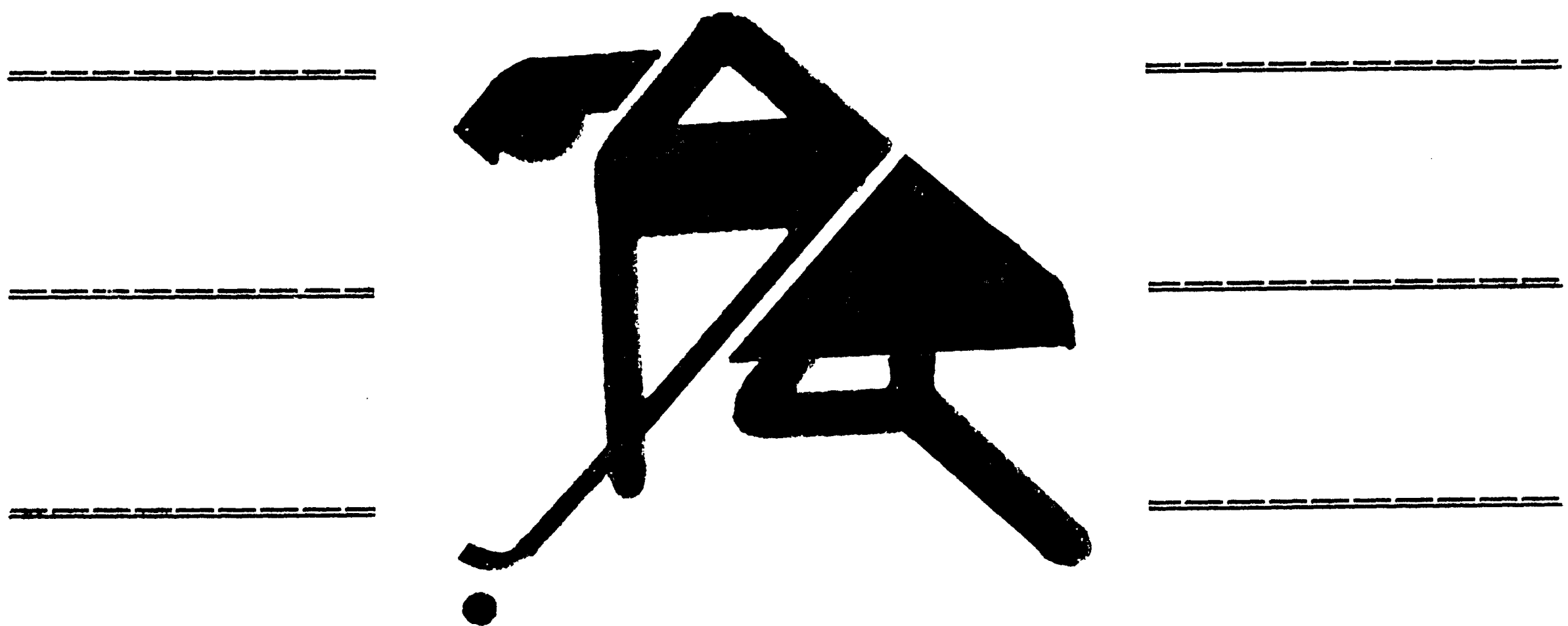

--- TREASURER'S REPORT ---

1992 SEASON

Dear Members,

On behalf of the of the Club's Executive I present herewith the audited accounts for the year ended the 31st. December 1992, incorporating a deficit for the year of \$ 5,984.00.

On the surface this looks to be a very disappointing result, but the Executive decided that 1992 should be the year to lock up some old " Gorillas" and thereby ensure that we return to a surplus position in 1993.

The following resume' will hopefully explain some of the problems resolved in 1992 and contributed to the operating position.

INCOME

For the year, our receipts were \$ 3,294.00 ahead of forecast and this can be almost entirely attributed to the Bar profit of \$ 6,050.00 which is a major turn around from the previous years loss of (\$ 83.00). Harry Wark, the Ladies from the Juniors and all of the other "helpers" who made this result possible, should be congratulated.

The Glebe Ladies and also our Juniors made sizeable contributions to our income this Season and their continued support is most welcomed by all Members.

On the down side, our income was seriously depleted without the proceeds of an expected \$ 2,500 - \$ 3,000 from our major raffle. Ground fees were way short of expectations, in part due to a repayment problem and over budgeting.

EXPENDITURE

As previously mentioned the Executive decided that some outstanding finance problems needed addressing and decided that the 1992 Season had to be it. These problems had a major effect on our forecast being \$ 7,087 over budget.

Depreciation has increased by \$ 1,635 to cover playing equipment purchased in previous years and shown as stock. In last years accounts \$ 4,800 was shown as closing stock and can't be accounted for. To remedy this problem we have with the assistance of our Auditors transferred this excess to The Balance Sheet and will depreciate it out of our account books over this and the next two years.

The Development Application for our proposed synthetic turf was \$ 771 over budget, due to an additional and unexpected account

Senior playing costs for the Season amounted to \$17,206 which was \$4,200 over our original forecast, a major part of this excess, \$ 2,744 in fact was paid to Leichhardt Council covering outstanding lease payments for Federal Park dating back to 1987. We also received an account from the Sydney Umpires Association for approximately \$ 566 covering umpiring and late card fines from the 1991 Season.

The only remaining item well over budget is Junior Expenses, resulting from Turf hire, amounting to \$ 602 and advertising \$ 304.

Regarding the forecast for the 1993 Season, I feel confident that a surplus of \$ 4,000 is achievable, provided the Bar trades along the lines of 1992 and we undertake the proposed " Raffle".

The expenses for this Season allow for the explained increase in depreciation and a reduction in Senior playing costs in line with the abnormal payments last Season.

Parramatta Carnival:

The pre-season training at Federal Park commenced on Sundays in early March and were well attended. Initially we had a squad of about 20 in the Under 13 age bracket, not enough for two teams but too many for one. The Junior Committee in its wisdom decided to enter two teams in the competition and fill the gaps with older Under 11 players. As the season drew closer, six or seven more starters for the Under 13's arrived and fielding two teams became no problem. Should the two teams be of approximately equal strength or should the teams be graded according to ability? This was the question which occupied the minds of the selectors for some weeks prior to the commencement of the competition. After vigorous debate and on a 3-2 decision, the sides were selected on ability, with a couple of exceptions due to transport and family reasons.

The Under 13 White team was fortunate in having their shirts donated by Mr Fred Falzon, who is in the shirt, hat and jumper business and I would like to thank Fred for his generosity.

It was clear after the selections that the white side of 1992 was a better outfit than the Under 13 side of 1991 who made the semi-final. Martin Smith, previously from Canberra, and Sam Everest, previously from Shepparton in Victoria, added considerably to the playing strength of the team. Of the thirteen players in the squad, five were from last year's Under 13 team and six from last year's Under 11's.

Our first game of the season was against St George at Jubilee on 4th April which we won 10-2. It was clear even in the first game that we had an accomplished set of forwards, but our defence was going to have a few problems as the season progressed. The forward line of Eddie Johnson, Aaron Oman, Doug Cronin, Anthony Wark, Simon Bracht and Sam Everest had plenty of pace and always looked as if they could put the ball into the net. The side scored in every game they played this season, which was an outstanding effort. Unfortunately they were not as keen on tackling back as they were on shooting for goal and there was often a big gap between our halves and our forwards. Our mid-field is where we lost it this season and our style of play was unbalanced in many games, the classical W formation did not exist despite constant instruction from the coach! Bunching and not using the full width of the field were probably our two

biggest failings. The defence of Alex Crook, David Mullens, Martin Smith, Kim Rizzo, Mary Wark, Lewis McKeown and Geoff Hammett toiled hard and improved considerably as the season progressed. They needed a little more confidence in their own ability and a determination to win the "50-50" balls. With a bit of a sprint and a bit of confidence those "50-50" balls turned into a "70-30" chance. During the season we concentrated on four fundamentals of the game: take the quick free hit; tackle, tackle, tackle; don't let the opposition run with the ball; and keep the ball wide. By and large the side endeavoured to comply with this advice and in our fourteen competition games we were competitive, looking as if we wanted to play hard and fast. On occasions the defence tended to put their heads down and blast the ball down the middle of the field, more in hope than in expectation, when a well directed short pass to a teammate would have been a better option. At times, players tended to float around the edges of the play rather than involving themselves in the thick of the action.

Sutherland were the stand out team in the competition and only had six goals scored against them in fourteen games, of these Glebe White scored four. Our short corners for most of the season were pathetic, but around semi-final time they came good and added a new dimension to our attack. Against the better teams in the competition the side showed grit, determination and tenacity and in only one or two games did not give their best.

The team were capable of, and usually showed, the good old fashioned Glebe spirit and were a credit to the Club. On the odd occasion there was a bit of bitching between this or that player, but for the most part the players' conduct was exemplary. Many friendships were cemented during the course of the season and the players enjoyed each other's company. The side did not abuse umpires, did not indulge in sledging the opposition and were well mannered and well behaved. It was a team of fine young men and women and the Club can be justly proud of their efforts.

Gary Cronin umpired most of our games and did an outstanding job. He is one of the best umpires in Sydney. Jim Oman has a great talent as a manager, social worker, psychiatrist, transport executive, Junior Committee man, etc, etc and organised the team with military precision. Everyone knew what was happening and where to be at what time. Bevan Ineson coached the team periodically at Wednesday night training, at Thursday night turf training at Homebush and helped to prepared the team for the semi-final and final. Bevan made a significant contribution to the vast improvement displayed by the team during the season. Many of the parents made the effort to come and watch our games and their support on the sideline was appreciated by the players. It was by no means unusual for there to be forty to fifty Glebe supporters watching the matches on a Saturday morning.

The Junior BBQ was a great success both socially and financially. Over 200 persons (men, women, children and babies) attended and over \$1,500 was raised. Thank you families for supporting our socials as, without your support, we could not have a Junior Hockey Club. Wednesday night training was well attended and it was usual to get eleven of the thirteen players at the training session. The after training BBQ developed into a grand affair and was well liked by everyone. Thank you Maureen Paterson, Cheryl Oman, Maggie O'Sullivan, Anne Wark, Andrew Goodrick, Bob Reddy and Mick Tapsell for making the BBQ such a great success.

At the Parramatta Carnival, Glebe entered an Under 13 team consisting of four players from the Maroons and seven players from the Whites. The Carnival was well organised and enjoyed by all. The players had plenty of hockey and the composite side acquitted themselves with distinction, finishing runners-up to the Northern Districts. Competing teams were Warringah, Ryde, Northern Districts, Baulkham Hills, Parramatta and Glebe. The final against Northern Districts was a thriller and the team displayed a fantastic fighting spirit in trying to claw their way back into the game after Northern Districts took an early lead.

In summary, the team had an enjoyable and rewarding season both on and off the field. Good luck to the players moving up to the Under 15's next year and thank you to the Junior Committee for the outstanding job they did this season.

Player Profile

Alex Crook	Goalkeeper	Enormous improvement this year under the guidance of Andrew Goodrick. He covers the angles well and will now attack the oncoming forward and reduce the angle. His reading of the game is good and frequently takes the right option. Had a couple of runs on the field against weaker teams and nearly scored on one occasion.
David Mullens	Fullback	A quiet lad by nature, but a popular member of the team none the less. David was a keen trainer and always work hard and gave his best. He developed well as the season progressed, his field position was excellent and he hit the ball sweetly all season.
