One reason is clearly that not all players were available at the same time, especially when the big games occurred. In all, 27 people took the paddock for 3rds this season. No way can a team perform well under these situations.

Other reasons I feel that caused difficulty were

- lack of player dedication to play for a team to which they committed themselves to for the whole season. Say you will play, then play, with a full season in mind.
- poor skills and fitness training. Why go if you don't want to do them well?
- lack of training all together.
- not heeding peoples advice, particularly the captain or coach, on and off the field.
- the need for respecting those with more experience, or the captain.
- the need for enthusiasm 100% of the hockey time. This includes supporting the other grades and encouraging them to support us. Club spirit has to be made, not expected, you know.
- a need for a non player to organise substitutions during the game. Doing this role at the same time as playing I am sure did not help my game or my team mates.
- not remembering that we are playing in the 3rd highest grade in SYDNEY hockey. Always think of what you do and say on and off the field. It helps to progress the game, and demonstrates a pride in the club and the game you represent.

Half the team could possibly say that those items above, in general, were observed. And from that half two members shone out for the future.

Dean Benfield, our goalie, made the best of his chances to perform, and even encouraged his girlfriend along to the games. With good guidance Dean will continue his improvement.

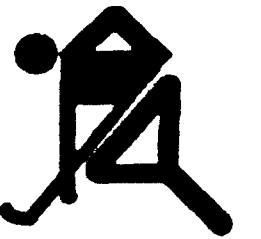

His performances at the 'discipline demanding' left half became better and better. Some people thought he would collapse under pressure. Some should watch Adam under pressure, and LEARN.

When all was said and done though I still look back and say that it was truly an honour to be able to captain / coach a Glebe side in the Sydney competition and I thank those who gave me the opportunity.

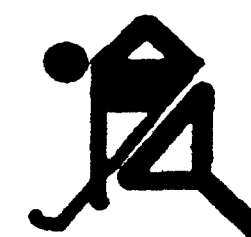

TREASURERS REPORT 1993



Dear Members

On behalf of the Club's Executive Committee, it gives me a great deal of pleasure to present the 1993 audited accounts, incorporating an operating surplus for the season of \$5,909.

The overall operating or cash surplus for the year was in fact \$8,775 before finally depreciating all of the remaining playing equipment carried over from the 1992 Balance Sheet.

This is a fantastic result for the Club and supporters. Turning a deficit the previous year of \$5,984 into a profit of this calibre highlights what can be achieved, even in recessionary times, with dedicated people, solid support and good management.

INCOME

For the year we were \$4,756 ahead of forecast and each section of the Club made sizeable contributions.

Again the bar traded very well recording a profit of \$6,350 for the year. Who knows how much extra profit was lost through the untimely break-ins? Let's hope next season we enjoy better luck.

The ladies again demonstrated how well they manage their division of the Club, contributing a \$1,903 surplus from their various in house fund raising activities during the year.

The Juniors were also very active during the season. Their various fund raising events last season allowed them to contribute \$2,697. Also an additional \$1,100 was raised through increased Mum and Dad social membership.

The sale of equipment realised a profit of \$587, which is a major turn around compared with previous years, but the big winner for the Club was the social and raffle area where we recorded a magnificent profit of \$4,547. The major component of this profit comes from the raffle and if you cast your mind back to 1992 when we didn't run a major Club raffle our profit from this area was only \$615 - Say no more.

EXPENDITURE

For the year this was \$2,847 over budget, due mainly to the increased depreciation previously covered, an unexpected cost with our development of the turf and increased Junior costs arising from the additional teams we entered in the 1993 Competition.

Concerning the forecast for 1994 and reflecting on our achievements in 1993, the projected surplus of \$6,650 may be considered conservative, however a lot depends on the continued support of our social and raffle programme. The bar contributions from within the Club are a vital and welcome part of our profitability, but at the end of the day without contributions of \$4,000 - \$5,000 annually from socials and raffles our result becomes very modest.

The only other area of Club fund raising that could improve our position is sponsorship. Our past performance in this area has not been good and 1993 was no exception.

Finally, congratulations to all of the members and supporters, who through their efforts and contributions made 1993 a year to remember.
