GENERAL BUSINESS - :

1. Report on Turf - The D.A. with Town Planner will progress to Aldermen. The Lease - Heads of Agreement has been signed by Glebe DHC but not by Harold Park. Turf companies have been approached for preliminary pricing.

The World Cup being staged at Homebush should help our chances with obtaining a grant from Sports & Recreation. The Turf was discussed and questions raised.

2. Harry Wark and Max Solling presented a summary of the proposed book they have written and the information compiled. The 1993 results would be included and the preliminary copy should be ready in approximately 8 weeks.

Eddie Crook to obtain firm quotes, preliminary investigations indicate the cost at being \$5,000 - \$6,000 for 500 copies. The book would be about 150 pages with approximately 50 photographs.

All members present were invited to view the draft copy at the conclusion of the AGM.

Colin Rochester - The Club should be using the book to attract potential sponsors.

General agreement that the Club should be involved financially and publishing should proceed, with the book being used in selling the Club to sponsors.

3. The difficulties experienced in collecting playing fees was raised by the Treasurer and after discussion it was moved that the Team Captain's should be responsible for this.

4. Problems in respect to the Summer Competition were raised by Shane Nilan. Two games have been played, B Division Team players short (9), no selectors or 1st Grade Coach at matches, no SHA officials at Homebush or Little Bay, problems at Little Bay with lights and times. Concern that there was little to no training, suggested the possibility of forgetting the Summer Competition. After agreeing Colin Rochester suggested there was lack of organisation by SHA, the Meeting discussed the problem and the following conclusions reached.

- i. A letter be sent to SHA expressing concern re Summer Competitions.
- ii. Possibility of training on Monday nights be suggested to members.

5. State League - Cost of entering a Team, the travelling and the benefits to the Team were questioned by several delegates. The general discussion concluded that if the Competition was meant for the best Teams in the State, then Glebe should be represented and that they have an obligation to compete. The costs and time involved was agreed to be considerable and participation in future should be reviewed.

6. Peter Mitchell asked if Glebe DHC were going to book a block of seats for the World Cup of Hockey in November. Geoff Paterson will follow up with World Cup officials.

7. Ken Wark Senior mentioned that Kelvin Dickey, a past President had past away and this had not been noted in the report. The Secretary apologised for the omission.

8. Fred Letts commented on the quality, support and the history of the Red Rag.

Closing address by President Geoff Paterson.

With the successful launch in mid-October of "Under the Arches" book by Dr Harry Wark and Max Solling we now have a product in which we can reflect on our history and proudly show to new comers and Juniors alike. It reflects also the ability of people within the Club to produce such a professional product. To Eddy Crook and Marilynne Smith and to Dr Harry Wark never before has such a project of this scale been attempted by a Hockey Club and it will certainly be a milestone itself in the Club's great history. However our winning percentage in this year's Grand Finals is totally unacceptable for our great Club. There are no easy answers, but each and every Club member should think of ways we can start to turn this ratio around. Certainly having our own turf in the near future is a step in the right direction.

As the turf at Harold Park comes closer to realization I would urge all Club members to become more involved and support the social and fund raising activities of the Club, not just the Saturday games. To make our new field a success the burden must and should fall to all Club members not just a few as in past years.

Looking back at 1994 and forward to 1995 there are some issues I would like to raise for our future:

- Wednesday night's training is dying a slow death. We all could use a little extra physical fitness to help our games. Try and make it along.
- Club functions are an essential part of our Club's social and financial operation and deserve to be better attended.
- Playing Fees :- The collection of playing fees still remains a problem and every player should try to have his playing fees paid as soon as possible each year.
- The Club's Image is also something that has been called into question in recent years. Whether playing or supporting our great Club we represent the Club and all members young and old. Negative and abusive comments towards umpires or other teams are of no benefit to our Club or to the game as a whole.

I hope that these points can provide some food for thought for all Club members both young and old.

In closing I hope that everyone had a happy and relaxing off-season and is ready to face the challenges afresh in the 1995 season. While I will be unable to offer my services as Club Captain in 1995, I offer my support and best wishes to the incoming Management Committee.

JUNIOR CONVENOR'S REPORT 1994



In a year that was crammed with great achievements, the winning of the Central Area Club Championship and regaining the Gladall Shield after 16 years was surely the highlight. The victory is even more astonishing when it is considered that since 1978 the Club has been greatly disadvantaged, not only by the introduction of the synthetic playing surfaces, but also by the dramatic fall in the population base from which we draw our Juniors. This shift in population has resulted in other inner city sporting clubs struggling to survive and local icons such as the Balmain Tigers and the Glebe Rowing Club disappearing altogether. Our success makes us unique.

During 1994, we fielded 8 junior teams (two Under 15s, two Under 13s and four Under 11s) with 118 registered players, and remain at the top of the Sydney Association. Although our minkey numbers were down on the last two years, there were still 35 or more children turning up each Saturday morning. This fall-off was more than compensated by the number of children who opted to play team hockey (an increase of over 20% on 1993). Once again, our Club Captain, Peter Busch, and a group of ladies from our women's teams ran their usual well-organized minkey sessions for the children. Peter's six years of hard work were rewarded this year with Glebe winning both the Under 11 A and B Division Central Area Premierships. Many of Peter's ex-pupils were prominent in both teams. The minkey programme has been critical in the development of our juniors and this club is indebted to Peter and Bob Taylor, who were responsible for getting the concept off the ground. A special thank you to Mike Newton, who, over the past two years, has done a magnificent job as minkey co-ordinator. His organizational work behind the scenes has taken a lot of pressure off both Peter and myself.

1994 has also seen the introduction of a hockey programme in a number of primary schools. Glebe has worked in partnership with the Sydney University Club in a pilot scheme to introduce children to our sport. Local schools - St James, Forest Lodge Public School, Glebe Public and Annandale North took part. The co-ordinator, Peter Mules, did an outstanding job. In the ten weeks of the programme he was able to build some fine skills in children who had never played hockey before.

It is pleasing to see clubs like Sydney University, who have had the luxury of not having to fund Junior teams at last supporting clubs such as Glebe, who have put so much time and effort into Junior development. This year has also seen the introduction of a number of new awards, namely the Terry Reece Shield, the Arthur Stubbs Trophy and the Brother Maurice McCarten Keegan Cup. The Terry Reece Trophy was a joint initiative of The Entrance and Glebe Hockey Clubs and will be competed for annually by the two clubs. Terry Reece, whom the trophy honours, was a long-time stalwart of the Glebe club. An ex-Australian player, Terry has built an association with The Entrance Club since his retirement to the Central Coast.

It was a great honour for Glebe to win the trophy in its inaugural year.

The Arthur Stubbs Trophy was donated by Bill Stubbs in 1973 to the Glebe Police Boys' Club to honour his late father. In those days, the Glebe Hockey Club had an association with the Police Boys' Club and actually played in their colours. Unfortunately, the association ended in 1982. This year the management committee of the Police Citizens' Youth Club very kindly decided to return the trophy to Glebe so that it can once again become a living part of our history. It will be awarded to the Under 15 player who the Junior Committee feels has demonstrated outstanding potential.

The Brother Maurice McCarten Keegan Cup is a trophy I have donated in order to honour the founder of our club. It will be awarded for the first time this year to the Under 11 player who the Junior Committee feels has demonstrated the qualities McCarten Keegan instilled into Glebe teams, qualities coaches who have followed in his footsteps have preached ever since, i.e. to play an unselfish team game, always supporting your team mates, never giving up but at the same time accepting defeat graciously and realizing the only dishonour in being beaten is when you don't give of your best.

Unfortunately, due to work commitments, I will not be standing for the position of Junior Convenor at the next Annual General Meeting. It has been an honour and a privilege to have been associated with such an amazing group of people who make up this incredible club. It would be impossible for me to try and thank all those individuals who over the last couple of years have been a source of tremendous support and inspiration. There are three people, however, who deserve particular mention. Firstly, Geoff Paterson, our Club President, who has been a continued source of support on the Management Committee and despite the many onerous demands the position made on him, was still available to put his time into coaching the Under 11s. Secondly to Mick Tapsell, who has become a great friend and whose initiative to resurrect The Red Rag has had an enormous impact on the smooth running of the Juniors. The guidelines he has written on overage players should be adopted by Central Area and be used for many years to come as a measure of commonsense and fair play. Finally, to my wife, Cheryl, I would like to give a special vote of thanks for her understanding and acceptance of the amount of time spent working for the hockey club.

As we look forward to 1995 with the recent approval given by Council to the Harold Park Development and with it our Turf Proposal, one can only see the future as a very exciting prospect. I think Harry Wark Jnr. sums it up perfectly in his just released work on the history of the hockey club when he says: "Hang onto your hats, the best is yet to come!"

I look forward to seeing you all back here next year.

SECOND GRADE REPORT 1994

An excellent worker off the ball, Jeff made the most of some deft feeding, scored 21 goals and was the competition's leading goal scorer. Furthermore, Jeff was also voted Second Grade's "Player's Player" and his vote tally of 149 points, with Hannibal Hield being his closest rival on 108, also reflected Jeff's outstanding year.

In summary, I believe 1994 proved to be rewarding, fruitful and enjoyable for all associated with Second Grade, however, without winning, I unfortunately can not say it was successful. TREASURER'S REPORT 1994



Dear Members,

1994 was another very successful year for the Club in financial terms. Our audited figures incorporate a further surplus of \$4,790 for the year ended the 31st December.

The actual operating profits before depreciation was \$6,096, but we have now totally depreciated all of our assets amounting to \$1,306.

During the year the bar contributed a profit of \$7,586, Socials and raffles \$4,218 and the equipment sales \$854. The ladies section of the Club chipped in with another generous donation of \$2,800 and the Juniors \$1,000.

Again we should congratulate the Members and supporters for their efforts, because without these funds the Club would be in a soory state.

Also, during the year we received an unexpected refund from the Sydney Hockey Association of \$2,024. This amount was previously paid to SHA in relation to the turf situation (not ours) in the form of a levy and has not appeared in our previous accounts.

An area of major concern for the Club is that playing fees for both men and women are not covering the costs levied by the Associations and other playing costs. The reason for this escalation is we now have more teams, both men, women, Under 17 and Juniors training and playing on synthetic surfaces.

As you all know we don't charge Juniors fees. The figure of \$2,669 mentioned above represents money collected on junior turf training nights along with various raffles and clubhouse activities. We also raised \$960 from various Mums and Dads who joined the Club as social members, which is not included in the above figures.

As I've stated in previous reports the bar, raffle and social activities are vital to the Club's existence financially, but we now have an additional challenge, our book "Under the Arches", was launched late last season, the "Book" generated a profit of \$1,745 but we still have copies in stock to the tune of \$11,063, which have all been paid for. We have forecast profit from sales of \$4,000 in 1995. With a forecast surplus for the year of \$4,320 our book sales will represent a major contribution.

The 1995 Season has some major challenges for the Club, both on and off the hockey field. In true Glebe tradition and total member support I'm sure it will be a big season in both areas.
