# **TREASURER'S REPORT 2000**

---

I am pleased to report that the club recorded a record surplus result for the year ending 31st October 2000 of \$25,486.01.

Financial highlights for the club this year in comparison to last year included:

- An extra \$10,600 raised in sponsorships this year
- An extra \$5,300 raised in Fees - Playing and Social
- Reduced Men's Playing Costs: approx. \$4,800 lower

Once again, the Canteen Trading contributed significantly to club revenue, despite limited senior opportunities to utilise our club's facilities. The Junior Carnival proved a major windfall in this area.

Equipment Trading returned a surplus return of 15% on cost, and with over \$5,000 worth of quality stock on hand, a better return can be expected next year.

The club returned over \$5,800 surplus on social functions in comparison to \$10,000 last year. This year was our 70th anniversary, and some of the functions were geared around "celebration", rather than making money.

Junior playing costs increased by over \$6,000 this year. Most of this overspend was updating goalkeeping equipment and repairing the nets & goals.

The club has experienced no costs this year in relation to turf development. Whilst this is refreshing in comparison to last year, some costs will be incurred next year as we encroach on a court appearance.

The GST has had a relatively minor impact on our club this year, as most of our income and expenses related to the period prior to 1/7/2000. However, based on next year's forecast, we can expect the GST to have an approximate effect of \$2,000 on our costs, but more importantly, a major impact on our cash flow.

Finally, I'd like to thank the many people who assisted me in administering the club's financial affairs this year.

# CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT 2000

---

It would be fair to say the year 2000 wasn't a particularly good one for us. We failed to win a premiership, failed to reach more than one grand final, and failed to make the semis in 3 grades. We simply weren't good enough.

Unfortunately, I don't believe we failed through any lack of ability but rather due to a lack of commitment, particularly in regard to training. It would appear that we have become lax in this area and as club captain, this was very disappointing.

We all know the world is a very busy place and that there are many demands placed upon us. But as the Glebe Hockey Club, should we accept anything less than 100%? The short-term response (especially when you are struggling) is that you cannot afford to enforce this, because we would seriously weaken our sides. But is this the answer for the long-term? I know the other clubs in the top four place a great deal of emphasis on this aspect. In fact, the premiership-winning side insisted on it as a prerequisite to selection.

Possibly, we should be adopting more flexible practices. This may mean that we have several training sessions at various venues on various nights? Or, maybe we provide players with individual training regimes and then periodically monitor them? Given our record of only 3 first grade premierships in the last 19 years, it would seem obvious that we must change the way we are doing things.

On this point, I recommend each player seriously review their own performance this year. Included in that, review your mental toughness.

How well did you accept those losses?

Did you look to apportion blame to the umpires, your coach or even your fellow players?

Or, did you firstly analyse your own performance and the game itself?

How well did you handle adversity?

Did you drop your head, curse, criticize your team-mates and/or adopt your own game plan?

Or, did you, metaphorically speaking, grit your teeth, dig your toes in and fight on, encouraging your team-mates to "keep the faith"?

I simply offer the above thoughts as an opportunity for all of us to reflect on this year with a view to how we can turn our fortunes around in 2001.

Whilst we experienced disappointment, it would be remiss of me not to report on the many wonderful individual achievements in 2000.

To the above, congratulations.

Due to the Sydney 2000 Olympics, our Hockey Season began much earlier than usual. The Junior Registration Day, Pre-Season Training, and the start of the Central Area Competition were all bought forward by one month. The early start to the season did not dampen the enthusiasm of our Junior Teams, and although some changes were required from the A Division to the B Division in the first half of the Competition, our overall results were again most pleasing. # CLUB MANAGER'S REPORT 2000

---

The Games of the 27th Olympiad impacted on all levels of Sydney life in 2000, right down to the running of the Glebe District Hockey Club's catering arm.

The nature of senior competitive hockey in Sydney now is such that both men's and women's competitions are played entirely on synthetic surfaces. Senior teams skills' training is also conducted on artificial surfaces. Consequently, activities at Jubilee Oval consist of Junior training, both skills and fitness, on Wednesday evenings; and their home games on alternate Saturdays. Seniors also train for fitness on Wednesday evenings, with wildly fluctuating numbers, depending on the state of the competition or even the state of the coach!

The domestic season was a little shorter and finished earlier this year, due to the aforesaid Olympics. That fact, combined with the less than 50% home game bias in the draw (in spite of the best efforts of our representatives on the Central Area Committee) left us with a modest level of Saturday trade.

Net profit from the "Bar" was within a couple of hundred dollars of the numbers for the last couple of seasons, coming in at around \$9,000. Allowing for the modest trading activity, this figure was enhanced by the generous donations of stock by the Toxteth Hotel, who gave us a significant quantity of both chips and soft drinks. These donations, in being sold at or just below usual prices, do not have a "cost" built in to them, making our net takings much more impressive.

Two other businesses that helped to enhance our "bottom line" are Galluzzo's, the greengrocers of Glebe Point Road, and Byers Meats, Darling Street, Rozelle. Not only was their produce of high standard, the price was always right! Thank you.

The Junior Carnival was the other big contributor to our "bar" profit, and its success both on and off the field for our visitors and ourselves, makes it imperative that we continue to stage it.

The running of the Canteen is not a "one person" job, and could never have been the success it was without the large group of willing workers, week in and week out, who gave of their time.

I salute Harry Wark (snr), the Clubhouse Manager and my father-in-law, whose enthusiasm and commitment to his club knows no limits.

I have decided to retire from my involvement in the running the Clubhouse as of the end of this season. I thank everyone for their help over the years, and most of all for their custom — it couldn't have been done without customers!

Lastly I wish to thank my own family for their enthusiastic encouragement and help with the small but many tasks required to ensure the smooth running of the Clubhouse.

# SYNTHETIC TURF COMMITTEE REPORT 2000

---

Since the synthetic turf at the State Sports Centre Homebush became available in 1984, the Glebe District Hockey Club has been trying to secure a site within the Glebe area, which would be suitable for the installation of a synthetic turf, to replicate this facility for our Members. In 2000, it is an unfortunate fact of life that without a synthetic turf, men's and women's competition hockey will not be played in the Glebe Area.

The Club submitted a Development Application to Leichhardt Council in November 1987, for a synthetic turf at Federal Park, Annandale. Negotiations with Council on the Federal Park site continued for several years, but Council, under pressure from a vocal local resident group, were extremely reluctant to approve the site for the development of a synthetic turf. Leichhardt Oval number two field, Lambert Park Leichhardt, Jubilee Oval Glebe, Leichhardt High School, Glebe High School, the Rozelle Bay Railway Shunting Yards, a site next to the Leichhardt Bus Depot, Callan Park (off Glover Street) and the Wentworth Park infield were all considered as alternative sites to the Federal Park site, but in the end discussions regarding these sites came to nothing.

During the first half of 1992 the NSW Harness Racing Club approached Council with a view to extending the Harold Park Paceway on to Public Parkland and building a new access road to the facility across Public open space. Council recognised that the Harold Park infield would be a better site for a synthetic hockey field than the Federal Park site, and actively encouraged the Hockey Club to begin negotiations with The Harness Club. It was Council's intention that the Harness Club would acquire the necessary open space to enable the track extension, on the proviso that the Hockey Club got a lease over a site for a synthetic turf at the Harold Park infield..

An Agreement For Lease was signed between the Harness Club and the Hockey Club in July 1995 over a site for a synthetic hockey pitch at the Harold Park infield. The Harness Club was to give the Hockey Club a lease over the site, when the Hockey Club had acquired the funds with which to construct the field.

After the Agreement For Lease was signed, the Hockey Club attempted to acquire the necessary funding and Council approvals to enable the Hockey Club to fulfil the conditions of the Agreement For Lease.

The Hockey Club had its Building Application for the synthetic turf approved in 1997, and informed the Harness Club in July and August 1998 that it had the funding in place with which to build the synthetic turf. The Costings and Funding Document provided to the Harness Club in July 1998, contained detailed quotes for all building work and full documentation of the Hockey Club's funding arrangements. It was the expectation of the Hockey Club that it was the Harness Club's legal obligation to provide the Hockey Club with a twenty-two year Lease, with a twenty-two year Option, over the proposed site at the Harold Park infield. The Harness Club disputed the Hockey Club's funding arrangements and has failed to provide the Hockey Club with a Lease.

The Synthetic Turf Committee were faced with two options: either abandon the Harold Park infield option, or commence legal proceedings against the Harness Club in an attempt to secure a lease over the infield site. After canvassing the views of Club Members, and extensively discussing the situation at the 1999 Annual General Meeting, the Synthetic Turf Committee decided to institute legal proceedings against the Harness Club, with a view to acquiring a lease over the Harold Park infield site. The legal firm Clayton Utz have been acting for the Hockey Club, and the Club is extremely grateful for their help. Legal proceedings were commenced in November 1999.

Since 1992 the Hockey Club has spent over \$55,000 on turf development costs and in 1999 spent \$26,500 on legal fees. This year the Hockey Club paid nothing in turf development costs, thanks largely to Clayton Utz's generosity. In the coming year, the Club may be called upon to fund Court Fees, which may be of the order of tens of thousands of dollars, if the case against the Harness Club proceeds to trial. It is also possible that a negotiated settlement may be reached with the Harness Club, in which case the money spent on legal expenses would be substantially reduced

The Hockey Club has been preparing its case and has exchanged letters with the Harness Club. On 4 August 2000 the Hockey Club registered a timetable with the Equity Division of the Supreme Court, and the discovery process of the court proceedings has now begun. The Hockey Club provides the Harness Club with its evidence, to support its claim that it should be given a lease; and the Harness Club provides its evidence, supporting its claim that the Hockey Club should be denied a lease. This stage, the Discovery Stage of the legal proceedings, is proceeding slowly, as it would appear that the Harness Club is in no hurry to expedite the process.

After viewing the Harness Club's evidence, the Hockey Club will file an Affidavit with the Court and similarly, the Harness Club will file an Affidavit after it views the Hockey Club's evidence. It is envisaged that the Hockey Club and the Harness Club will present for a Directions Hearing at the Supreme Court late this year or early 2001. It is likely that at the Directions Hearing, the Court will arrange a mediation meeting between the Harness Club and the Hockey Club. If no settlement can be reached between the two Clubs, then a Judge lists the case for a Court Hearing. If the case does come to Trial it will probably not be heard until mid to late 2001 at the earliest

The Hockey Club's Statement Of Claim includes an amount for Damages, Lost Opportunity and Legal Expenses

The construction costs to build a synthetic turf in 2001 would be in the order of \$1.1 million. This is a large amount. But the Hockey Club is convinced that the construction of the synthetic turf can be funded.

It is the view of the Synthetic Turf Committee that, for the Glebe District Hockey Club to survive in the long term, the Club needs to have a synthetic turf in the Glebe area, to train and play its home games. The Club celebrated its seventieth year in 2000; but without a synthetic turf, the Glebe District Hockey Club's future is bleak. Of the five top teams on the first grade competition table this year, Glebe, who finished third, was the only team that does not have a home turf. The teams that finished sixth and seventh in the first grade competition were the two University teams, Sydney University and the University of Technology Sydney (UTS). The University teams pay very low fees, have professional administrators to assist with secretarial and treasurer tasks, hand out sports scholarships and do not field junior teams, giving them a distinct advantage over District Clubs. In the 2000 season, non turf teams in the first grade competition, apart from Glebe, were outclassed. It seems that one or two non turf District Clubs face extinction at the end of the 2000 season, to be replaced in Premier Division by the University of New South Wales. How long will it take before Macquarie University replaces yet another District Club, who does not have a home synthetic turf?

The Synthetic Turf Committee, a Sub Committee of the Management Committee of the Club, is striving to the best of its ability to secure a site for a synthetic turf in the Glebe area. The Committee is acutely aware that The Glebe District Hockey Club is the only outdoor sporting Club left, which represents the District at the highest level of a sport, Premier Division, and at the grass roots, the Minkey Squad. The Glebe Rugby League Club, the Glebe Rugby Union Club, the Glebe Cricket Club, the Glebe Harriers, the Glebe Lacrosse Club and the Glebe Bicycle Club have all become defunct. A synthetic turf is essential if the Glebe District Hockey Club is to avoid extinction.

The Synthetic Turf Committee is comprised of an able, harmonious group of people, who labour without complaint, for the benefit of the current Club Membership and for the benefit of those children as yet unborn, who will be given the opportunity to play hockey with their mates.

Let's hope that in the next twelve months, with a bit of good luck and good planning, the Hockey Club secures a lease over a site suitable to build a synthetic turf.
