5. Minutes of Annual General Meeting held on 26 November 2000

6. Matters arising from minutes of Annual General Meeting 2000

Item 6 "There was a view that anyone who had played more than 200 games should be included in a separate list. Generally agreed that it should be done. Harry J Wark was asked to do a list of past players who have played more than 100 or 200 games."

This was not detailed in this 2001's Annual Report, but should be done in the one for 2002.

7. President's Address

Bob Taylor referred the meeting to his report contained in the Annual Report.

He congratulated the retiring gave to the retiring members of the Executive Committee and thanked them for the work they have done for the club: Liz Howard, Treasurer; Danny O'Brien, Club Captain; Carmen Byrne, Associate Executive; Arthur Moir, Equipment Officer; and Mary Wark, Assistant Treasurer/Secretary. Eddy Crook, secretary and Amrat Parbhu, Assistant Club Captain, were also standing down from their positions, but would stand in other positions in the Executive committee for the coming season.

8. Treasurer's Report

Because of problems with regarding figures from the auditors, detailed accounts were not available. Attendees of the Annual General Meeting will be posted these as soon as they are available.

Provisionally, it appears that there is a small loss of \$1600 for the past year. On speaking to the auditor, he said that this is not a problem and might not actually be a loss. GST is a problem and merchandising is not included in the accounts at the moment. Legal fees have affected the profit and at the date of the AGM amount to \$8213.

Looking at the future, if we want a larger profit we need to look at the fees canteen and other income structure.

We still have money invested.

Next year the effect of GST must be addressed, possibly be included in the fees.

The accounts went to the auditors on Melbourne Cup Day.

Our income, apart from fees, included \$15634 in sponsorship, the Raffle, Trivia Night and the Junior Carnival. The final figures will probably be better than indicated at the moment.

After an eventful year, Liz Howard thought that for the Treasurer's position a member of the men's team or someone strongly involved with hockey would understand the structure of the club and it would help in the duties of Treasurer.

Liz Howard gave particular thanks to Ron Cheong and Lee Farlow, Amrat Parbhu and Danny O'Brien, Amrat and Michael for their help during the year.

The following questions came from the floor:

Jim Oman asked what affect had GST has had on our finances. Liz Howard replied that we had already paid out \$277. Bob Taylor emphasised that on the turnover of our fees alone, GST would amount to around \$3000 extra.

Les Wark asked if the \$1500 of sponsorship went into "bottom line", had we lost this. Liz Harlow said that the cheque account balance was \$19 to 20,000 at the moment. Bob Taylor added that

this was probably not so bad as the balance of about \$21,000 compares with \$6000 in the cheque account at this time last year.

Martin Howe asked if we were here to make a profit or to play hockey.

Jim Oman said that our fees were low compared to other hockey clubs and without a turf our expenses for using other clubs' facilities was expensive.

Bo Taylor mentioned that the cost to us at Cintra Park (Briars) was over \$8000. Next year this will be higher.

There being no written report with accounts, the verbal report was not voted on.

9. Acceptance & Endorsement of Annual Report

Thanks to Eddy Crook and Marilynne Smith for production.

Eddy Crook mentioned that two of six women's team reports came in. Getting all reports in on time is difficult and makes the compilation and collation of the report harder.

Bob Taylor suggested that team reports be left out of future reports.

Les Wark suggested that team reports be included in the web site.

Jim Oman pointed out that NSW Indoor representation was not included.

Eddy Crook said that if any discrepancies we noted, the Executive Committee should be informed.

It was moved that the Annual Report for 2001 be accepted.

11. Year 2002 Fees

Bob Taylor informed the meeting that our fees have remained the same for two years. There have been significant increases in playing costs, insurances, GST impact and other fees. It might be difficult to assess the fees for the coming season without more details about oncoming costs.

The discussion on fees for 2001 was opened.

Ron Cheong suggested that a Special General Meeting be held to look at fees when we know more about the turf, Sydney Hockey fees, Umpires costs et cetera.

Bob Taylor said that Sydney fees might be up 25%. He has also been advised by Danny Munk, CEO of Balmain Leagues Club, that the third year of their sponsorship agreement might not be forthcoming. In addition, the sponsorship from the Toxteth could be lower.

Bob Taylor also pointed out that Sydney Hockey charges \$3067 per men's team. This comes to around \$277 per player for an 11 player team each year. Our current playing fee is \$220 per player (plus insurance, social membership and turf levy the annual men's fee is \$300).

The costs of Juniors playing in senior grades also would need to be addressed.

Eddy Crook, Jim Oman, Martin Howe and Liz Howard all supported Ron Cheong's suggestion that a special General Meeting be held to decide on the fees for 2002. Martin Howe added that the new committee must examine the costs in detail.

Les Wark asked why is Sydney Hockey charging by team, whereas Hockey NSW goes by player registration. Bob Taylor said he would check Hockey NSW figures. He also pointed out that umpires are now paid, which adds to the cost.

A motion was put that any decision to set fees for 2002 is deferred until a Special General Meeting is called when the incoming Treasurer analyses to financial situation.

The motion was carried.

11. Turf Report

The history of the quest for an artificial turf at Harold Park is detailed in the minutes of the Special General Meeting of 9 July Report.

Following is a chronicle of the legal proceedings between the Harness Club and the Hockey Club since then and until this meeting reported by Harry J. Wark, Convenor of the Artificial Turf Committee.

The Harness Club, sort to appeal the decision of Justice Santow, in the Court of Appeal Division, of the Supreme Court. On Thursday 9 August 2001, the Harness Club's Application For Leave To Appeal was heard before Justice Stein and Acting Justice Brownie, who dismissed the Appeal, awarding costs against the Harness Club.

On Friday 10 August 2001 the Hockey Club solicitors presented to the Supreme Court Registrar Mr. Berecny, a timetable for the subsequent conduct of the legal proceedings. The Court approved this timetable. This timetable ordered, among other things, that the Harness Club "file and serve its lay evidence in response to the Plaintiff's affidavits on or before 21 September 2001"

On Friday 21 September 2001, the Harness Club applied for and was granted a six-week extension of the deadline, for filing their affidavits(s). The Harness Club affidavits were due on 2 November 2001. Despite having had their deadline extended once, the Harness Club asked for and was granted four more days to prepare and submit their affidavits. At the end of the extra four days, the Harness Club asked for an additional two weeks.

The Hockey Club's solicitor advised that the time had come to approach the Court and ask it to direct the Harness Club to file and serve its affidavit(s). On Thursday 15 November the Hockey Club motion was argued before Court Registrar Mr. Graham Berecny, by the Hockey Club barrister Mr. Richard McHugh. Mr. Berecny directed that the Harness Club's affidavits had to be submitted by Wednesday 28 November, otherwise: "the Defendant would not have been permitted to lead any lay evidence at the trial". At 1650 hours on Wednesday 28 November, 10 minutes before the deadline, the Harness Club filed one affidavit with the Court. In its affidavit the Harness Club's witness Mr. Peter V'Landys outlined why the Harness Club has refused to grant the Hockey Club a lease over the infield site.

The next step in the process is that the Hockey Club has to present its expert and damages evidence to the Court late January, early February 2002 and in the same submission, will have to respond to the claims in the Harness Club's affidavits. The Harness Club is then given the right of reply to the Hockey Club submission and this will be the Harness Club's last submission. The Hockey Club has the opportunity to reply to the Harness Club's last submission, after which it can then apply to the Court for a final hearing date. It is unlikely that the final hearing (trial) will occur until October/November 2002.

On Tuesday 14 November the Harness Club applied to the Court, asking for the Hockey Club to put up a surety of \$207,000, to cover its legal expenses, in the event that it wins the legal proceedings with costs. The Hockey Club opposed the Harness Club's application that a surety of \$207,000 be lodged with the Court and filed two affidavits to support its case. This matter came before Court Registrar Mr. Graham Berecny Court on Monday morning 3 December 2001. Its barrister Mr. Richard McHugh and solicitors Jason Lazarus and Ross Foreman represented the Hockey Club. Harry J Wark, Jim Oman and Harry A Wark attended the hearing, prepared to give evidence if required.

As one of the Hockey Club affidavits was only submitted to the Court on the morning of the hearing and because he wanted more time to assess the affidavits submitted, Registrar Berecny held the surety matter over until late January, early February. If the Court directs that the Hockey Club must put up a \$207,000 surety, the Hockey Club will need to put its financial machine into overdrive, as the legal proceedings will not progress, until the money is deposited with the Court. Currently the Hockey Club has about \$100,000 in the "kitty" and it will need to raise an additional \$100,000, if the Court finds in favour of the Harness on the surety matter. Of course, if the Hockey Club is successful in its case against the Harness Club for a Lease, then any surety money will be returned in full to the Hockey Club.

A Special Annual Meeting was held at the Clubhouse on Monday 9 July 2001, for Club Members to be brought up to date with the "situation relating to the building of the synthetic hockey field for our Club". A 5-page handout was provided for Members to read, explaining the various options available to the Hockey Club. The Members were asked to vote on the following motion "That Members of the Glebe District Hockey Club Inc. support the legal action being taken against the NSW Harness Racing Club to gain the Lease for which the Glebe District Hockey Club has fulfilled all the conditions in the Agreement to Lease." There were approximately 50 Members at the Meeting and the motion was carried unanimously.

The Special General Meeting also voted that a Contingency Fund should be set-up and that Members be encouraged to contribute to this fund. By mid November 2001 there was approximately \$10,000 in the Special Contingency Fund.

Having received the support of the rank and file Club Members, the Club's Public Officer and Secretary Eddy Crook, on 13 August 2001, signed the new legal agreement between Clayton Utz and the Hockey Club. The new agreement with Clayton Utz limits the Hockey Club's liability in the event that it loses the case against the Harness Club, but allows for the full payment of fees with 25 % uplift, if the Hockey Club wins the case. The costs that will be generated by the Hockey Club barrister, Mr. Richard McHugh are additional to the Clayton Utz costs.

On 12 November 2001 Clayton Utz was awarded the NSW Law Society's 2001 Pro Bono People's Choice Award, for its outstanding contribution in providing free legal work for the Hockey Club over two years. This prestigious award is a fitting accolade for a firm of solicitors that has provided the Hockey Club with outstanding legal help, free of charge. Without the help of Clayton Utz, the Hockey Club would have had to abandon long ago, its quest for a synthetic turf hockey field at the Harold Park Infield.

Discussion was then opened to the floor.

Bob Taylor mentioned that the special Contingency Fund now stood at around \$10,000. He also mentioned that Harold Park has probably left it too late to get surety, but we would have to wait and see.

Harry J. Wark said that when we get our our turf, it would be better for us and fees might drift down.

Geoff Paterson asked if the \$200,000 from Council was still secure. Harry replied that this is still allocated to us.

Lex McPhee said that if it is still \$200,000, should not this be factored up to meet increased costs. Jim Oman pointed out that this is part of our damages claim.

Colin Rochester wished to know what the present costs for a turf would be. Harry replied that we are borrowing \$350,000 for Harold Park (or Leichhardt 2, which is still under negotiation). With \$200,000 from Council, and our own money, estimated cost was around \$650,000. The cost now is over \$1 million. The increase is covered in our damages claim plus legal fees and any other extra costs to the club.

Kathy Farrawell would like to mention the committee and how people are standing up for our club and asked the meeting if she has permission to refer to us in the book she is writing.

This was put to the vote and passed.

12. General Business

Sydney Hockey Presentation

Pat Nilan mentioned that there was no representation from Glebe at this year's Sydney Hockey Presentation night.

Bob Taylor said that the problem was that it was on a Friday night. Normally there is a huge Glebe attendance. This year was also a \$40 a head charge. He raised this with Clive Harrison and will do so at the next Sydney Hockey Board of Management Meeting. He agreed that there should be a strong Glebe representation.

Pat also brought up the "Pat Nilan Rising Star Award". He was somewhat disturbed that Sydney Hockey had not had the courtesy to let Pat know that they wished to use his name in an award title. He is also in the "Hall of Fame" with Gladys Yates, which Sydney Hockey also did not inform Pat about.

Bob said he would look into these points.

Payment for Women's Coaches

Carmen Byrne said she wished to bring to the attention of this General Meeting the decision by the Women's Division to pay the top coaches and this would be incorporated into the women players' fees.

The amount would be in the order of \$1500 per annum for the first and second grade coaches if possible.

Bob Taylor asked who this would affect the fees.

Carmen replied that they would rise from \$290 to \$330 per annum to cover the coaches' payment (an increase of 15%).

Bob Taylor said that he was not for the paying of coaches as there can be pitfalls. He pointed out that Glebe is one of the last clubs to ask first grade players to pay fees.

Carmen Said that this payment would be to help cover expenses occurred by coaches (such as petrol) and is similar to other clubs. There would be a selection procedure and a minimum performance expectation.

Colin Rochester asked if the positions would be advertised, and Carmen said that they would.

Lex McPhee wanted to know if there would be a contract set up. He also was concerned that if a coach should leave, could they take players with them.

Carmen said that this was being looked into.

Jason Taylor asked if this should be a decision of the Management Committee, and Carmen said that this could be decided by the women themselves.

Harry J. Wark Wanted to know why the captains of the first and second grades could not be more involved with the running of the teams. He pointed out that our club is run on volunteer principles. Why do we have to pay?

Les Wark said that the captains could not do playing, coaching and administration at once.

Steve Sherwood agreed with Les.

Bob Taylor said there seem to be no main objections. It might be OK if we have our own turf, but we need to look at the club as a whole. Also, why do we have to look outside for someone to fill these positions? It is probably not the right time for us to do this.

Carmen said that this would be an experimental year.

Mike Bougoukas pointed out that this was a discussion about a possibility, nothing appears to be said about paying or not paying.

Charging of Juniors Playing in Grade Teams

Mike Bougoukas wanted to know if juniors should be charged. He also mentioned that there should be strong encouragement for parents to join as social members. There might be a case for charging insurance.

Bob Taylor said that this would be discussed by the new committee, and a policy about social membership and encouragement of parents be done. Getting income from the raffle and the Junior Carnival to cover junior costs would be examined.

Jim Oman pointed out that the money for the contingency fund was 75% from the junior division. In addition, \$10,000 from the canteen and \$3000 from the raffle could be attributed to junior contributions. Further promotion for sponsorship needs to be done for 2002.

Future AGMs

Peter Mitchell was against holding the AGM on Wednesday evening. It did not seem to have achieved much in attracting attendance.

Bob Taylor said this new approach was tried to see if we could attract more as attendance has been dwindling at AGMs. Sunday is a family day and many would not come because of this. The new committee would discuss this and make a decision closer to the time. It would be a good idea to get the AGM held as soon as possible after the end of a season.

There was no further business and the meeting closed at 9.20 pm

TREASURER'S REPORT 2002

It gives me pleasure to report on the Club's financial position at 31 October 2002 and on its financial operations for the past year.

The Club began the year in a sound financial position and ended the year the same way. The result for the year was a small profit, which is what we aimed for, while keeping fees down.

Several matters affecting the year's result were:

- Miscellaneous income of \$3,500 includes one-off write-back of stale cheques \$2,500 and GST refund \$1,000
- Men's playing costs included costs of the previous year of \$2,500
- Women's playing costs include payment to coaches, covered by increase in fees
- Legal fees for the court case and mediation of \$11,500 exceeded the turf levy collected by \$4,000
- Insurance costs for the club and players were up by \$2,200, only some of which was budgeted

Our long term sponsors Toxteth Hotel and Richard Ware continued their support. Encouraging results from the canteen, raffles and social functions contributed \$16,000 which is a great effort. Equipment trading was affected by the previous year's stocktake by \$2,000 and otherwise contributed well. Without these activities, fees would have been higher for each player. Contributions from Juniors in the form of memberships, canteen, donations and the very successful Junior Carnival continue to cover Juniors playing costs.

I must thank the large number of members who have helped during the year to make my job easier – Ron Cheong and the helpers in the canteen, Maureen Paterson with socials and in conjunction with Michael Carey the successful Rotary raffle, Jenna Price's raffle and all the helpers at the Junior Carnival. Mick Bougoukas and Jimmy Wright, Neale Lawson and all the Women's Committee for collecting fees and Amrat Parbhu for organising equipment. Thanks too to Liz Howard for help in setting up the systems .

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT 2002

Season 2002 resulted in a very successful year for the men's teams. Gaining 4 teams into the grand finals, unfortunately we had little success in the finals. However this is a very promising lift to the club that had not been in a 1st grade grand final for 5 years.

1st grade performed very well this season having a very stable squad of players. The effort in the grand final was excellent. The game twisted and turned but unfortunately for us it went to a very well drilled Liverpool team.

2nd grade must be looking back at the season as the one that got away. They had a very strong team all year. With players pushing up into first grade. To be in a grand final and leading by three goals you should never be beaten. I can only hope that they can show the same form for next year and take the experience from this year and win.

3rd grade is a very hard grade with the time of playing varying greatly and players moving up and down. As the depth of the players grows I am certain that 3rd grade will become a very strong team.

In saying that they did not have the best of seasons they almost made the semi finals which would have been a great effort. A coach needs to be in place and training has to be attended much better to improve.

Training

Turf training started with a flurry of players training, pushing for positions. To start we shared the time with the women having a whole field for one hour. This was unsuccessful with the men as we needed more time to train. A compromise was made with the women, sharing half of the field and having two hours to train. The men then gave priority to the top 2 grades. 1st grade getting the circle for the first 45 minutes then swapping with the 2nds and then leaving thirty minutes at the end for all other grades. This worked out quite well. As the season went on the number of players attending slowly decreased. At the end only 1st and 2nd grade were attending with maybe one or two from the other grades.

I feel if Glebe want to win 1st grade they are going to have to put more effort / priority into training.

Training once a week is not enough. They need to be training twice a week with 1st grade having one session on the turf by themselves for at least one hour.

Fitness training was one area that I tried to improve greatly as the club captain and 1st grade captain. I was very disappointed, let down by the number of players at fitness training on Wednesday night. This comes back to the commitment to themselves and to the team. It was not only 1st grade players who were missing training but the players who wanted to push for a 1st grade position as well. In making these training sessions it will not only improve skills and fitness it will improve camaraderie and team unity.

Fees

I found this part of being the Club Captain one of the hardest. There must be a better system than letting players play half a season then hitting them with a \$380 bill. Maybe an option is to get \$100 as they sign up to play then 4 weeks into the year another \$100 etc. So that by half way through the season they have paid their fees.

One thing that I have realised is that it takes a team of people to get the money from the players. It should not be left up to one or two people.

Club House

The club house is an integral part of our club. We have not been utilising this enough. This year I decided that it was time to revamp, clean it up and start using it. Shane Nilan and I spent much time talking and organising working bee's to get it cleaned and re-painted. I think that has done a lot to invite more people back to the club for beers and a chat after the games. We ended up having nights at the club for the semi finals and finals. It turned over a nice amount of money for the club and it is really a great place to go to and have a beer and a laugh.

I hope that next year there will be nights organised each month that all the players can come back and have a cheap beer and a BBQ. You could also have mugs for the player's who have won players player over those 4 weeks.

General Comments

In this being my first year as club captain I enjoyed it and learnt a lot. I could not have done it without the support of Mick B who was always there to help me. Also to Shane for his commitment to first grade and the club.

At the start of the year I wanted to set some sort of platform that we could build on so in time we would start going forward not behind. I believe getting 1st grade into the grand final is a huge step. I can only

wish that the other players take a look at what has happened this year and improve on it for next year. They must have drive and passion about glebe and winning. They have to make sacrifices to give their all, not only to themselves but to the team.

I will be looking on the website next year with great interest and expect to see some great results, and information.

Nathan went on to umpire at this year's U/15 NSWJHA State Championships in Lithgow and subsequently umpired right throughout the CAJHA Finals series, culminating in the U/13 "A Division" and U/15 "B Division" Grand Finals. I know a number of our Junior children are now expressing a far greater interest in Umpiring,

and are very serious about obtaining their SJHA Umpires Badge,

hopefully during the 2003 Season. I will speak with the Sydney Junior's Umpires Association and ascertain if they would like to help and Coach interested children.

Synthetic Turf

Every year I ask Harry Wark Jnr., the Chairman of the Glebe District

Hockey Club's Synthetic Turf Committee to compile a Report as to exactly where the Club stands in our ongoing quest for a Synthetic Turf Playing Surface. Many of you are aware of the immense amount of time and effort that the members of this Committee put into the quest for the Synthetic Field and as our Court Case against Harold Park is in the final stages, I am sure all will find Harry's Report compulsive reading.

Fund Raising & Sponsorship

Season 2002 was somewhat of a disappointment for the Club with regards to Sponsorship, as the Balmain Leagues Club notified the Club that it could not fulfill its final year of our three Sponsorship in full. My understanding at this point is that we will receive a tenth of what our Sponsorship agreement set down and this is extremely disappointing. The Junior's long standing sponsor, The TOXTETH HOTEL, in Glebe continued to support the Club and my sincere thanks to the Murphy Family for their ongoing support of Glebe Junior Hockey.

Over the past few seasons, the company that I work for, The JourneyMasters Pty Ltd, a Corporate Boutique Travel Management Company operating out of Paddington, in Sydney's Eastern Suburbs has provided "State of Origin" Tickets to be raffled at our Annual Junior Carnival, and on a number of occasions return airfares to the Gold Coast with Accommodation for Presentation and Trivia Nights. Due to my involvement, I have until now been rather uneasy about promoting the Company that I work for but they are now a major sponsor of the Glebe District Hockey Club and have this year also sponsored two of our Junior Indoor Teams competing in the Sydney Junior Indoor Hockey Competition, by providing special Glebe Indoor Hockey Singlets.

With our other Sponsors, Richard Ware Real Estate and Galuzzo & Sons, The Club has once again been able to continue with its most long and proud tradition of never, ever, having charged our Junior Players a Registration Fee to play Hockey since the inception of the Club in 1930. This situation may change as we

strive for our Synthetic Turf, but I do not think that there would be one parent who would complain if the Executive Committee decided that we might have to consider charging a Registration Fee for the first time in our Seventy-Three Years for a child to play Junior Hockey with Glebe.

Special mention as always to Maureen Paterson and Michael Carey for their annual effort in the organization of the Rotary Raffle, which provides a substantial Income base for The Club. Maureen took over from Lee Farlow this year as our Social Officer and in her own unique style was as you would expect from Maureen an instant success.

A big thank you to all Club Members who attended the Matthew Wark Special Fund Raising night to raise money to help Matthew tour South Africa with the Australian All Schools U/16 Team. Robert and Robyn Wark, Matthew's parents are eternally grateful to all those Club Members and Supporters who attended on that night.

In Conclusion

Although Premerships were hard to come by in Season 2002, I sincerely believe it was still a most rewarding, successful and happy year for the Glebe Junior Hockey Club. Our presence in the CAJHA Finals Series was strong, the Mickey Squad continued with the groundwork of our future grade players, The St. George Carnival was a Glebe "Whitewash", whilst our own Junior Carnival is probably (I have been a little bit biased), the best Club Carnival in New South Wales.

Again, our Junior's excelled themselves in their representation for Central Area, Sydney, NSW and Australia. Congratulations to Mark Paterson who was selected in the Australian U/18 Team that toured New Zealand this year. As always a full and comprehensive list of all Glebe Junior Representative Players is contained within this report.

The Glebe District Hockey Club Executive Management Committee is represented by all three Groups within the Club – Mens, Womens and Juniors and each group's representatives do a fantastic job, considering that we are all volunteers. I would like to make special mention of our Club President, Bob Taylor. Bob influence and enthusiasm for the Club is

awe inspiring and he does bring at times a calming direction at the monthly Executive Management Meetings.

SYNTHETIC TURF COMMITTEE REPORT 2002

Synthetic Turf Committee Members: Peter Adrian, Eddy Crook, Rod Hammett, Jim Oman, Marilynne Smith, Bob Taylor, Les Wark and Harry Wark (Convenor)

The history of the Hockey Club's search for a synthetic turf hockey field is set out in previous Annual Reports, and will not be repeated here. Suffice it to say that the Hockey Club is involved in legal proceedings against the New South Wales Harness Racing Club in relation to an Agreement for Lease signed by the parties in July 1995 in relation to the infield of Harold Park.

Since the last Annual Report, the proceedings have progressed well, if slowly. On Friday 8 March 2002, Supreme Court Registrar Graham Berecny refused the NSW HRC's application for security for costs against the Hockey Club.

On Tuesday 18 June 2002, a mediation between the parties was unsuccessful.

At this stage, it is likely that the Hockey Club will apply for a hearing date in November 2002, with the hearing itself likely to be in the first half of 2003.

I would like to thank the Synthetic Turf Committee Members for their hard work and enthusiasm in trying to secure for the Hockey Club a site on which to build a synthetic turf. Members of the Committee over the years have attended countless meetings and helped when called upon, to assist in negotiations with State Governments, Local Council and the Harness Club. Many financial estimates and business plans have been prepared. Providing our legal team with appropriate documentation and appropriate "background briefing" information is a time consuming, but necessary task. No one person could ever hope to undertake the volume of work that is necessary to be performed for the Hockey Club to present its best case..

I hope my 2003 Synthetic Turf Report next year will be my last, as I believe the court case will be held in mid 2003. Time will tell whether I am right!! Members can rest assured that the Committee, aided by its legal team, is preparing the best case that the Hockey Club can prepare, in preparation for the hearing.
