# Treasurer's Report 2003

---

It gives me pleasure to report on the Club's financial position at 31 October 2003 and its financial operations for the past year.

The Club began the year in a sound financial position and ends the year the same way. The court case set down will affect our resources but we are confident of a positive outcome to the case.

The result was a profit of \$333, this was in line with our overall expectations, though several matters affecting the result were :

- improved memberships with more encouragement for junior families to join
- a higher level of donations than expected
- a great result from the canteen which includes several nights at the clubhouse for the club's senior players
- reduced administration costs, notably insurance costs having returned to a more realistic level after the concerns of the last year.
- Junior playing costs reflecting higher costs of using Jubilee Oval, but we are recovering some of this cost from Sydney Junior Hockey, and higher numbers of players for registration. This augurs well for the future of the club
- the biggest impact was the legal fees paid during the year. The total of \$18,600 included \$14,500 in relation to the Simos case. This total was \$8,600 over budget and left legal fees \$11,000 over the levy collected from players

We are to contribute \$60,000 towards the legal fees for the court case, which is scheduled to commence 1 December 2003. This amount has not been included in the result for this year and will reduce the funds available as shown in the Balance Sheet. After this payment the club will have sufficient funds to continue to operate as it has in the past.

We continue to receive good financial and other support from Toxteth Hotel, Richard Ware, Journeymasters and Galuzzos. With social and other fundraising efforts, we have been able to keep fees as low as possible. Canteen operations, raffles and social functions contributed over \$18,000 which is a great effort to help the club financially and has produced some entertaining nights. Contributions from Juniors continue to be significant and covers its costs.

I must thank the large number of people who have contributed this year to make my job easier. It is a sign of a healthy and growing club when so many people offer to help. Ron Cheong and the ladies in the canteen who have done a great job, the Men, Women and Juniors who each organised a social function this year, Michael Carey the raffle, Michael Bougoukas collecting fees and raffle monies, Amrat Parbhu fees, raffle and organised equipment and Neale Lawson and the Women's committee for collecting fees.

# Club Captain's Report 2003

---

My first year as Club Captain was a year of rebuilding. This was particularly evident in 1st grade, where the side trotting out each week looked significantly different to the side that were narrowly beaten by Moorebank in last year's grand final. ## Season 2003 – Seventy Three Years On!!!

---

2003 began with much promise. The Glebe Juniors increased their Team numbers by one, with

nine teams contesting the Central Area Junior Hockey Association (CAJHA) Competition and our Under 17's competing in the Sydney Hockey Association (SHA) "A Division Competition.

In the CAJHA Competition, Glebe Junior Teams qualified for all Age Division Finals Series, a wonderful effort by all players, coaches, managers and parents. Our Under 17 Team had a terrific season which culminated in a Grand Final Victory on Friday night, 29 August at Cintra Hockey Field, Concord.

On Sunday 24 August after a tough, hard Semi-Finals and Finals series of Matches, Glebe Junior Teams played in four CAJHA Grand Finals, unfortunately it was not to be "Glebe's Day", as we lost all four Grand Finals, two of which went into extra, extra time. Congratulations to the four Glebe Junior Teams that contested these Grand Finals:

As mentioned above, our Under 17's won the SHA "A Division" Grand Final. Once again their opponents were Sutherland, and after a hard fought first half, converted Penalty Strokes to each Team, Glebe emerged the victors, the final score been 5-2. A sensational effort by the players, Les Wark

(Coach), Geoff Bortfield (Manager) and all the parents of the players. A very pleasing aspect of that night was the number of Glebe Junior parents and players who turned up to cheer on the older boys. This greatly pleased Mark Noller and myself as at times the Glebe Juniors forget that the Under 17's are part of the Junior Club because they play in a different competition than that of CAJHA, however that Friday night certainly showed that the Glebe Junior Club was totally united and our sincere thanks go to all those Junior players and parents who came out to Cintra to cheer on the boys.

One of the great tragedies of the year involved the Under 15 Redbacks who finished second in the Under 15 "A Division" CAJHA Competition to the South West Strikers (prior Finals Series). The Under 15 Redbacks were the only team to beat this team in the whole season (4-1), and after a scoreless draw in the Major Semi-Final (no extra time allowed) was hit extremely hard by the dreaded flu and subsequently lost the Final to Sutherland. The reason I mention this, as The South West Strikers (SWS) late last year applied for entry to the CAJHA Competition, although they are not a member club of CAJHA and in fact the team was the Under 15 McCarther No. 1 Team (less one Penrith Representative Player). Glebe was the only Club in CAJHA to vote against their inclusion. I trust the other CAJHA Clubs will see the error of their initial decision and veto the SWS from competing in the 2004 CAJHA Competition. The SWS Strikers openly admitted that they only wished to play in the CAJHA Competition for the betterment of their players. What they did not admit to was they saw it as a means to "harden up" the McCarther Under 15 No. 1 Team for the 2003 NSWHA Under 15 State Championships. These comments are my personal feelings. The SWS are NOT a Club Team, they are a team made up of Representative players from the McCarther Association. To put the situation into perspective, it would be like CAJHA accepting SJHA Under 15 No. 1 Team into the CAJHA Competition.

As many of you know the CAJHA is comprised of six clubs – Bankstown, Glebe, Moorebank, Randwick, St. George and Sutherland. As has been the case for a number of years now, Glebe and Sutherland are the two dominant Clubs and this year again Sutherland won the Club Championship by four points from Glebe. I must, however, state that I was extremely disappointed in this final result as the Competition Secretary took it upon himself not to take into account the first six rounds of the combined Under 11 A/B Competition before the two Glebe Teams were graded into separate A and B Division Competitions. After these first six rounds our Under 11 Redbacks were undefeated which would have clearly resulted in the Glebe Club winning the CAJHA Association Club Championship (Gladall Shield). I make mention of this as I do not believe that you can merely dismiss six Competition Rounds because one person decides that these games are for grading



purposes only. People may label me a sore loser, but Glebe definitely won the CAJHA Club Championship and should have rightly been awarded the Gladall Shield.

# SYNTHETIC TURF COMMITTEE REPORT 2003

---

Members of the Synthetic Turf Committee: Bob Taylor, Les Wark, Michael Newton, Rod Hammett, Eddy Crook, Marilynne Smith, Peter Adrian, Harry Wark (Convenor)

A history of the Hockey Club's quest for a synthetic turf hockey field within the Club's traditional heartland can be obtained from previous annual reports and from the Club's website [glebehockey.org.au](http://glebehockey.org.au).

Since my report last year the Committee has been predominantly occupied with the Hockey Club's legal proceedings against the Harness Club. Solicitors Clayton Utz, who have been diligent in the preparation of the Hockey Club's case, represent the Hockey Club. Barrister Richard McHugh has assisted the Club at several directions hearing in the last 12 months and has a "good handle" on the lengthy history of the dispute between the Harness Club and the Hockey Club.

The Hockey Club first met with the Harness Club, to discuss the possibility of building a synthetic field at Harold Park, in April 1992, close to 12 years ago. Since this time, much water has flowed under the bridge, and the Hockey Club has endeavoured to clearly present its case, supported by appropriate documentation.

The Hockey Club placed a caveat on the Harold Park Infield in July 1998 and in 2001 the Harness Club asked the Hockey Club to lift the caveat, so that it could alter its financial arrangements. The Hockey Club declined to lift the caveat. The Harness Club commenced proceedings in the Equity Division of the Supreme Court in March 2001. The Hockey Club lost a Supreme Court Hearing before Justice Simos and was ordered to pay the Harness Club's costs.

In November 2002, the matter of costs for this hearing was finally settled. The Hockey Club was ordered by the Court to pay \$15,096, plus \$875 for the court appointed costs assessor.

In March 2003 the Hockey Club went before the Court to obtain a trial date, but due the Court caseload, the Hockey Club case was stood-over until 12 June 2003. At the 12 June call-over, the Hockey Club was successful in securing a two-week time slot (10 sitting

days) from 1 December 2003. The case will be heard before Justice John Bryson, an experienced Judge of the Equity Division of the NSW Supreme Court. Interested members of the Club might like to observe the trial from the public gallery.

On Monday 13 October 2003 a pre-trial directions hearing was held before Justice Bryson. Procedural matters regarding, the calling of witnesses, the filing of outstanding affidavits and the exchange of documentation between the Hockey Club and the Harness Club were finalised. There were no surprises emerging at the pre-trial directions hearing.

The Synthetic Turf Committee is still liaising with Leichhardt Council about Leichhardt Number Two, but progress is bogged down by the Leichhardt Park Pre-Master Plan Preparations. In addition, the Health Department have been reminded that the Hockey Club is still interested in a site at Callan Park. On 8 May 2003, the Glebe and Forest Lodge areas were transferred from the Leichhardt Council to the City of Sydney Council. After the transfer, there were discussions with the City of Sydney Council about a suitable site for the installation of a synthetic turf hockey field. At this stage discussions between the City of Sydney Council and the Hockey Club are at an embryonic stage.

Realistically though, the chances of the Hockey Club acquiring a signed lease, at an appropriate site, before the scheduled 1 December 2003 commencement of the trial are small, but the Committee is still out there "beating the bushes".

The Hockey Club's legal proceedings against the Harness Club are approaching a conclusion and hopefully the matter will be concluded before I have to write a report for next year's Annual Report.

If Club Members have any suggestions for the Turf Committee, or would like to clarify any matter in relation to the legal proceedings, please feel free to ask a Synthetic Turf Committee Member.
