Treasurer's Report 2006

It gives me pleasure to report on the Club's financial position at 31 October 2006 and its financial operations for the past year. The Club remains in a strong financial position. The result was a profit of \$16,036.

We had decided on a small fee increase for 2006, but with lower numbers of Men players and a higher proportion of juniors, Men's fees were down. This also reflected in lower playing costs with one less team registered. Women's player numbers were higher with a higher proportion of students while juniors increased the registration fee.

We rely on fundraising from social and other functions to keep fees as low as possible and competitive with other clubs. Contribution from these activities has been reducing for several years due to difficulties in organising, as people are so busy. These functions need a fresh look, across the whole club. A successful trivia night, Senior Presentation and Rotary raffle helped socials income. The 2005 results include the 75th Anniversary Dinner.

Bar Trading was impacted by a reduced number of Saturday games played at Jubilee, though junior's numbers remain high. Some social functions were held at the Clubhouse. Ron's efforts to keep purchase costs down has yielded great benefits.

Equipment trading is a service to members and not expected to make much money. As these were becoming very difficult we have decided to write-off, for accounts purposes, the 75th year glasses that cost totalled \$3,004. We still intend to sell these as and when we can. Apart from this adjustment, equipment trading would have returned a profit of \$888, which is a good result.

Interest income has benefited from use of a cash management account.

Men's and Women's playing costs were down on last year as 2005 included cost of shirts provided to players. A credit from 2005 and lower ground costs due to one less Mens team registered has reduced Men's playing costs. Lower fees and repairs included in 2005 brought juniors costs lower for this year, though we didn't replace some equipment as we had expected and this will need to be done in 2007. Administration costs include cost of providing glasses to juniors at registration.

We continue to receive great financial support from Toxteth Hotel, Journeymasters and Galuzzos. I must also thank the large number of people including Kylie Lawson, Graham Brown, Danny O'Brien, Amrat Parbhu, Mark Noller and Ron Cheong and the workers in the Canteen who help regularly with fees, equipment and canteen to ensure that money is collected and banked and the Club can keep fees low.

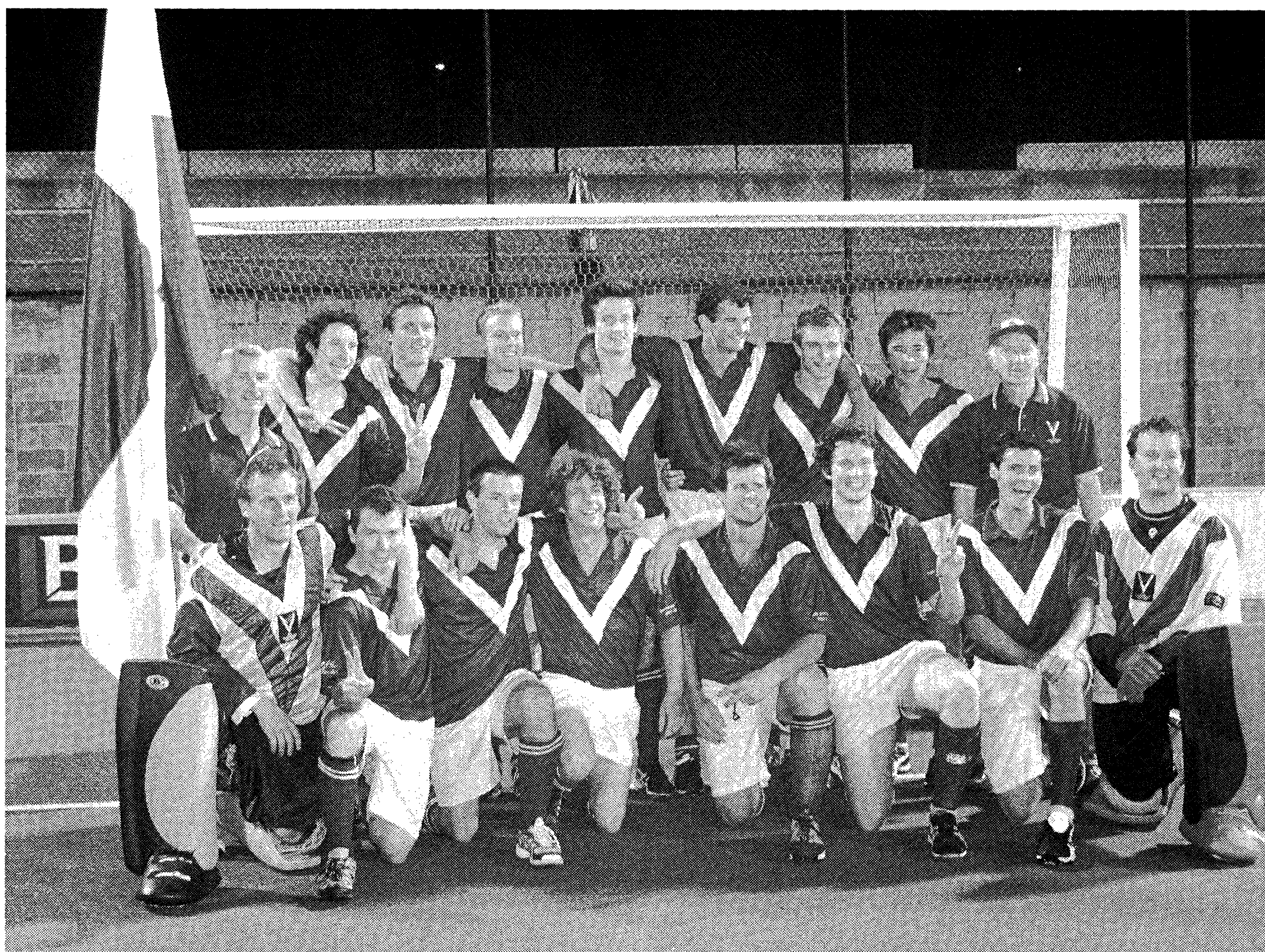

Let me start by firstly thanking the hockey club for the opportunity to make such an important contribution to this unique organization. I definitely learned a few things about coaching this year and the experience has proved invaluable in my development as a coach.

I would also like thank Helen Howe for all the work she has done the season. Without her monumental efforts making sure we had a full team every week and not too many substitutes. This was made more difficult than I had anticipated by a disturbing lack of commitment displayed by many club members, making selections a real chore.

When I first offered to coach at the close of last season I made my commitments abundantly clear regarding training and matches- in particular at beginning of the year. With my own commitments to Hockey NSW making it difficult at best to be at Tuesday night training sessions, I had higher support expectations than was received. In the end Helen had to manage the sessions herself as she tried to train. Her game did not benefit at all from this far from ideal situation. Due to the unfortunate situation with training and the lack help in managing the sessions, the drills and progressive exercises I had designed to advance the skills and understanding of players did not take place.

This is perhaps the largest contributing factor to the poor results achieved and inconsistent nature of our play. I must take some responsibility for this failing as I was the coach and needed to be more demanding that this situation did not continue.

In short, not all objectives were achieved this season but some definitely were attained, like the introduction of the “sliding press”, the concept of “pocketing and turnover” plays and some other counter attacking concepts involving midfield transfers and rotations of the forwards. All these things need continuing development and in my opinion should become an integral part of the Glebe style of playing hockey.

Some areas that I feel warrant urgent attention within the ranks of players and also needs to be embedded as a part of club culture are: attitude, commitment and work ethic. When athletes speak of attitude they are referring to having a positive mindset in games and in particular at training. Making mistakes is a necessary part of the learning process; it only becomes a problem when players keep repeating their mistakes instead of overcoming the problems and moving forward.

It also means always encouraging each other to do their best and not being satisfied with mediocrity in the execution of skills. Many of our players seem far too willing to accept less than 100% from themselves in this area. To understand why I would say commitment is a problem all you need to do is look back at the selections and the difficulties faced by those responsible for getting a full team on the paddock every week. I could not believe that on a number of occasions 1st grade almost couldn't field even a 12 player squad, any other club, players would be climbing over one another for the opportunity to play at what is the pinnacle of women's club hockey in NSW.

Work ethic is to put it simply, the willingness to do the work required to give you the best chance of success. This applies more so to fitness and conditioning than it does skills training. To be physically capable of performing required skills at a high standard you first need to be fit, this in its self only calls for self-discipline and hard work. Many players felt it too much when they were asked to allocate 6hrs of an entire week to their hockey and their team-mates, and they spend part of that time playing their game. That's 6hrs out of 168hrs of the week! If we are going to be taken serious about our intension to compete at the level we wish to attain, it has to be realized that this time requirement to the club and our selves is minimal and not enough to see the necessary standards of fitness and skills execution.

It is my hope to that I can stay involved in the development of players within the club but the immediate future will see me based in Goulburn attending the police academy there, so my time will be severely

limited and at this stage I doubt whether I will even be able to play hockey next year myself. I wish you all the very best of fortunes and hope the players are able to put the past year behind them and move forward in a professional manner to a more profitable future with the club.
