#### **Note 1**

The 1934 and 1935 teams played as the Saint James' Sports Club Women's Hockey Team.

Jack Dwyer and Dennis Donovan were Office Bearers of the Saint James' Sports Club. The Saint James' Sports Club Men's Hockey Team (1931-1932) became the Glebe District Hockey Club in December 1932.

#### **Note 2**

Since November 1990, the Women's Club has been a division of the Glebe District Hockey Club. Prior to 1991, the Women's Club was a separate entity to the Glebe District Hockey Club. After 1990, the Women's President's position was referred to as the Women's Convenor's position. The responsibilities were the same, except that the Women's Convenor reported to the Management Committee of the Glebe District Hockey Club, in the same way as do the Junior Convenor and the Social Convenor.

### **WOMEN'S CONVENERS REPORT**

The 2012 Season saw Angela Wark and I take on new roles within the Committee, effectively running the Club for the first time while previous Convenor, Helen Howe, took a year off. The year was very much a learning experience for Angela and I, who had both been involved in the Glebe Hockey Committee for years, but had yet to run the show.

We were supported from the get-go, by a determined Women's Committee in Amy Lovegrove, Alex Glading, Terrie Iglasis, Sara Bala, Sue Brady, Martin Bishop and Leonie Smallwood. We met early in the year to start planning and work toward a successful season.

The Committee's work in the off-season immediately paid off at the start of the Women's 2012 season. We had a coach for every one of our four grades confirmed early and were excited to welcome new coaches in Sue Brady and the pairing of Alison Cheong and Charlie Brown. Our pre-season matches against each other as well as other SWHL clubs, showed we were ready for the start of the season. Our results in the first few weeks of competition, one week recording a win for all four teams, showed we had prepared properly and would be very competitive this year.

One of the major changes that Angela and I introduced this year was incorporating fitness into the Tuesday training regime. Player surveys conducted after each season identified that girls felt the space on the turf at training (half a field for four teams over a two hour period) was too tight. Limiting training to two teams for one hour each also didn't suit ladies with differing work schedules. I worked with Mark Noller to secure another ¼ of a field during Under 17s training, giving the ladies ¾ field from 6.30-7.30.

Angela made up a schedule for each coach every week to allocate times that each team had the circle, the mid-field, or went off the field for fitness. By allocating a team 30 minutes for fitness off the pitch, other teams were able to use the space, which meant more drills were available to players and coaches. First Grade player, Lynsey Askew, was also approached to run the Thursday fitness training this season. She ran extremely useful fitness sessions that were well attended at the beginning of the season. She also ran timed sessions that helped Bish and Ange select their teams. Keeping ladies interested in fitness for a whole season remains one of the challenges in running a Club, but I believe fitness was something we improved on this year, especially at the start of the season.

One of the big differences this year to previous ones, was the amount of girls interested to play. We welcomed a record amount of new girls, but also saw teams returning almost unchanged from 2011. This allowed us to have some consistency across all four teams as well as welcome strong new players into each team. What was a very crowded beginning of the year, evened out towards the middle of the season due to injury, pregnancy and people enjoying overseas holidays. Third Grade was a good example of player movement. The team started the season with nearly 17 players and towards the end was struggling to make 11.

Our success on the field, outlined in Angela Wark's Club Captain report, will mean that we will officially apply to compete in the ML1 and ML3 divisions. Our Fourth Grade side will also be promoted to ED3 after winning the Minor and Major Premierships. We are also hoping to attract new players currently playing in for Glebe Juniors, to make sure we are providing a great hockey experience for ladies of all ages. We welcomed two junior girls this year and hope the number increases next year.

The Glebe Women's Committee, although strong, still need new members, as the Registrar role and the Web/Publicity role were not filled this year. The Women's Committee will approach potential members in the off-season to hopefully fill these roles. We will also be taking many of the learnings from this year into next year to hopefully build on our success.

Once again, thank you to the Committee, Coaches and Mangers that helped us field four teams every week!

### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

It gives me great pleasure to report on the Glebe District Hockey Club's financial position as at 31 October 2012 and its financial operations for the past year. The Club remains in a strong financial position. The result for the year was a Profit of \$6,909 (2011 – Profit of \$6,819).

Player Fees were increased by a moderate amount in 2012, and the penalty for late payment widened. Men's fees were stable, reflecting lower numbers, with one less team this year. Women's fees increased slightly, reflecting a small increase in player numbers and the moderate fee increase. There was an increase in Member's and Junior's fees with higher registrations and more junior teams. The junior carnival was unfortunately again cancelled (for the 4<sup>th</sup> year in a row). Although improved, fee collection is still difficult and time consuming for a small group of players.

Sponsorship, Donations, and Other Income increased overall for a variety of reasons. The prior year included contributions from Chemika and Aussie Home Loans, and both years reflected ongoing support and assistance from Just Hockey and Galuzzos (a club supporter for many years). There were increased and greatly appreciated donations in 2012, and also the return of a successful Bunning's BBQ's fund raising event. The lack of a major sponsor for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year in a row (formerly the Toxteth Hotel) is impacting the club's finances, particularly the ability to fund junior development.

Social Functions and Raffles income (net of associated costs) was similar to 2011. The band night and club raffle were very successful. The presentation was well organised and enjoyable, though ran at a small loss.

Bar Trading was up slightly versus 2011, though lower than budget. Takings were impacted by rain, with trainings and games washed out. The clubhouse recently moved back to the original arch, and still offers a variety of food and drinks at reasonable prices. Unfortunately, bar and equipment takings were impacted by theft – a number of arches were robbed, though security has subsequently been improved.

Equipment Trading is considered a service to players and is not expected to be very profitable; hence the result this year was pleasing. The prior year loss was due to the change in uniform and stock adjustments.

Interest Income was slightly down when compared to budget and prior year, as interest rates decreased due to economic slowdown and uncertainty.

Playing Costs were up versus prior year. Men's costs decreased with one less team and less players – 2011 included a credit from the SHA, relating to an accumulation of excess funds. Women's costs increased with higher player numbers. Junior costs increased, reflecting more registrations, greater team numbers, and increased turf related costs. The accounts include a provision for Jubilee Oval hire, which may not be required.

Other Expenses other than Playing Costs and Social Function costs were lower than budget, but were slightly higher than prior year. Again there were no turf and legal costs; however the Turf Committee has reformed recently. The clubhouse is expected to require funding in 2013, to become more comfortable for members and to encourage better patronage.

In Summary, the Club remains profitable and is in a good financial position. The Club needs to be financially viable, yet keep fees as low as possible and competitive with other clubs. However, fee revenues continue to be exceeded by playing costs, particularly for juniors, highlighted as numbers have increased this year. The ongoing lack of major sponsorship is impacting performance. The Club remains profitable only due to other revenue sources, such as investment income, bar trading, sponsorship, and fund raising. Investment revenue remains volatile, and dependent upon interest rates and economic cycles. The membership needs to be more active in securing and maintaining sponsorship, and in supporting fund raising.

Thank You, once again, to the large number of members who have contributed to the financial operations of the Club. This includes those who have collected fees, raffle, canteen, equipment, and social function income, and collated invoices and other expenses, and contributed to the banking of monies. Amongst a large group, I would like to highlight the efforts of Terrie Iglesias, Alex Glading, Angela Wark, Lou Tapsell, Bobby Taylor, Danny

## **CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT**

### **PREMIER DIVISION/1<sup>st</sup> DIVISION**

I believe that 2012 was a defining year for the Men's Club and a significant milestone in the development of a number of young up and coming players. I am very happy with the overall effort put in this season by the higher grade training group and with the efforts of the coaching staff. I would like to think that the combined efforts of Danny O'Brien, Secretary and I, ably assisted the players, captains, managers and coaches in successfully working through various challenging situations this season.

The 2012 season saw a new SHA administration in place, which brought a new body of persons with which to communicate the club's needs, which was often extremely challenging at times. Hopefully, we can foster a clearer and higher standard line of communication with SHA next season, which is essential given that there are significant changes afoot with the competition structure planned for 2013.

1<sup>st</sup> grade placed 7<sup>th</sup> on the table this season, but managed to beat all of the top 6 sides except for Moorebank (the undefeated Minor Premiers) and Gordon-North Sydney (an aberration). The impressive development of a number of talented players aged under 21 was crucial to the season campaign and to the club's future at the elite level of competition. Glebe has found and developed strikers, in the notable absence of Mick Wark, capable of getting the team in a position to score on average about 4 goals a game, which is enough to win more games than not. Furthermore, Glebe developed a lethal short corner battery, which went from being (easily) the worst performing combination in 2011, to one of the best in 2012, particularly significant given that there was no stand-out designated drag-flicker.

The team's success was built on the back of warrior like performances from their NSW fullback and some inspired goalkeeping performances, notable in the absence of both Paterson boys for much of the season and the Captain, who had ongoing work commitments. Congratulations must go to Dean for the many hours of training and preparation he puts into coaching this team. Onwards and upwards for 2013, particularly with the return of a number of key players to the side – competition for spots will possibly be the most intense it has ever been since the late 1990's.

2<sup>nd</sup> grade were the outstanding team of the Glebe Men's Club in 2012. A fantastic senior support structure, including a number of recent ex-1<sup>st</sup> grade players, with probably about 1000 1<sup>st</sup> grade games experience between them, was the basis for the success of this side. Coach Mick Bougoukas coached the boys to their strengths and was responsible for the fast-track development of some 3<sup>rd</sup> grade players, two of whom ended up scoring fantastic individual goals in the team's Grand Final triumph against Moorebank. A number of the players in this team have the potential to advance, or to return to 1<sup>st</sup> grade in 2013, if they can put in a big pre-season. Mick was ably supported by Geoff Paterson as Assistant Coach and by George Ribarovski as Manager.

One issue with the SHA administration was that two of our players were excluded from playing in the finals series, despite players with similar situations from rival clubs (albeit who had their 1<sup>st</sup> grade teams playing in finals) being granted exemptions to play in their finals campaigns. These boys were as much part of the final result as anyone who played in the grand-final. One could argue, that as a result we played two (genuine 2<sup>nd</sup> grade) strikers short in the Grand Final and we still won!

3<sup>rd</sup> grade went from the penthouse to the s\*@\$house in the space of a season. From Premiers to last place. What went wrong? Our best players from the season before either retired, went overseas, got injured, or were promoted to 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. The team that was left behind did not have the capability (although they certainly did and do have the talent) to score enough goals to win games when it counted. The team did not consistently defend as a unit often enough and as a result there was constant pressure on the defence to continually defend fast breakaway situations. Peter Busch provided great guidance and support as always as Captain-Coach, and some terrific young talent came into the side towards the back end of the season to show enough that they would be demanding a full-time place in the side next season if they have the dedication to training. A disappointing season ended on an up-note when we convincingly defeated UNSW, the minor premiers in Sydney League 2, in a scheduled 'classification' (read promotion/relegation) game. While it is unclear as to what 2013 holds for Glebe 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, it would appear likely at this point that the team will be relegated a division.

4<sup>th</sup> grade had a 2012 season of peaks and troughs not entirely dissimilar from their experience of last season. After another poor start to the season, Glebe made a terrific surge mid-way through with a series of hard-fought wins, due mainly to strong leadership and play from the co-captains and enterprising play from a couple of the young guns coming into the side. However, after these wins a number of key players were unavailable for the next 4-5 weeks, which adversely affected the side's performance. The players who turned up to training consistently throughout the year clearly benefited the most and will post strong cases for inclusion in the 2013 3<sup>rd</sup> grade squad. This team had great harmony and unity, if not quite the overall commitment, again a result of good captaincy and support from senior players.

5<sup>th</sup> grade after a very poor start to the season, got their act together and were undefeated for about 15 games (according to Dr Cullen) leading up to the Grand Final which resulted in a disappointing loss to Moorebank following sudden death extra-time and a penalty stroke off. The team was primarily made up of the core of the 2011 Premiership winning 6<sup>th</sup> grade team and proved to be equally effective in the grade higher, with the addition of a talented 15 year old and some talented 40 something's. A number of these players turned up to training reasonably consistently throughout the season, which was great to see, as this is something I do not recall occurring previously in my considerable playing experience with the Glebe club. Captain Googa instilled a killer attitude within the team, which appeared to have rubbed off on the players based on their remarkable charge to the finals. The players were always looking to improve their games and achieved this. Well done lads.

6<sup>th</sup> grade - A tough decision was made at the start of the season to do away with our social and highly successful 7<sup>th</sup> grade side, a team generally made up of beginner and more senior players, simply because we did not have the playing numbers to sustain another team. In hindsight, this was a good decision as player numbers were relatively consistent all season and I did not have to work too hard to fill teams. While a number of last season's 7<sup>th</sup> graders went into temporary retirement, a number of others decided to stay on and do their best playing for 6<sup>th</sup> grade in Sydney League 6, which were effectively two grades higher than what they were used to playing.

As a result of having a good core of experienced senior players in George Manou and John Mac, along with an enthusiastic Captain McKeown, these guys worked and played hard and actually improved their hockey throughout the year, to the point where they were highly competitive in most games. In all honesty, their overall results surpassed my expectations and I thank all you guys for your efforts and to Adrian for his great efforts in bonding the team and making hockey as fun for them as possible.

I would like to thank the efforts of Mark and Deb Noller over the past decade or so in running the junior club so professionally and creating an environment for local kids wanting to come and play hockey. Some of these kids are just now beginning to filter into the men's grades and are of a standard which suggest that our 1<sup>st</sup> grade ranks will be prominently made up of local juniors for at least a while to come. The reality is that without a strong Junior Club, we are nothing, given that we remain an amateur sporting club in an environment in which most of the other clubs we are competing with are operating on a semi-professional level.

With the systems and coaching support structure we have now developed at 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade level and with the level of playing depth currently available, Glebe should now be in a genuine position of strength to be successful in the Sydney Hockey Premier League and Sydney Cup for at least the next five years or so. It would be nice to be able to retire from my position knowing that the club is in good hands and well positioned to continue to perform successfully in the foreseeable future (at least my life time).

See you all again in 2013.

2012 was a real mixed bag as far as results go, we showed great character and skill beating many of our opponents who finished the season much higher on the table but then we lost games to teams who were not considered to be the better team on the day. Some players seemed to struggle with distractions such as poor umpiring and aggressive or poorly behaved opponents during games and they seemed to have difficulty staying focussed on the job at hand when challenged this way. This will be an area of great importance moving forward for Glebe to improve its standing in 2013.

Our results in each game this year were I think closely tied to our ability to move the ball into the attacking 30 and keep it there. While for most of year the defence of our own circle was of a high standard, being able to build pressure on the opposition over greater periods of time was a key factor in our playing strategy. A great deal of time and effort was committed throughout the year on improving the understanding and co-ordination of our defensive structure and execution in the attacking 30, the philosophy was “we’ll take the fight to them” and it became a corner stone of our play proving very effective when properly executed.

Our goals for and against improved this year when compared with last year, with the team scoring 77 goals (only 4 teams scored more goals than we did) and conceding 74 goals (6 teams in the competition conceded less goals than we did), giving us a goal difference of plus 3. Last year it was 62 goals for and 75 against so this was a step forward for both attack and defence. We scored a total of 35 competition points finishing in 7<sup>th</sup> place falling just 1 point short of 6<sup>th</sup> position and a finals birth under the new system.

Our commitment to training was improved on last year with much better turnouts to skills training on both Tuesday and Thursday nights and as a result the standard of hockey for most of year was very high. Fitness training was conducted under the watchful eye of Ben Farrawell this year and proved very successful for all those who regularly participated and I think they enjoyed the shift away from typically mundane sessions of the last couple of seasons, instead doing a lot of boxing and sled sprints. There were patches of good attendance but generally Ben’s sessions were only fully utilized by a minority of players and the level of fitness across the team as a whole was still below where it needs to be if we are going to be competitive for the full 70 minutes every week.

Injuries, work commitments and representative duties all created havoc this year making it almost impossible to achieve consistency in our line up week after week. As a result the team did not settle into a rhythm that would allow them capitalise on some convincing wins against strong opposition seeing us elevated to 3<sup>rd</sup> position on the ladder for about a month coming into the second half of the season. Disruptions to the team's line up and having to move players from positions they had become accustomed to in order to accommodate players coming up from 2<sup>nd</sup> grade proved to be too much for some and the team faltered on the run into the finals.

I feel the responsibility for this decline in form lies squarely with me as coach and if faced with the same set of circumstances in the future I would not make all the same choices when selecting players for particular positions.

Overall I was quite happy with the progress many players made this season and with the patches of hockey brilliance seen throughout the year, I think the team is showing signs of being very strong in the near future. Thanks should also go to the team's manager, Danny O'Brien for his invaluable contributions this year. He did a brilliant job this year under what were at times, very difficult circumstances. I look forward to seeing all of these players realize their playing potential next season if they so choose.

## **WOMEN'S FIRST GRADE REPORT**
