

JUNIOR CONVENOR'S REPORT 1994

 On behalf of the Junior Committee, welcome to the 1994 Presentation Day. To-day formally ends a season that has been one of the great ones in the history of the Junior Club.

In a year that was crammed with great achievements, the winning of the Central Area Club Championship and regaining the Gladall Shield after 16 years was surely the highlight. The victory is even more astonishing when it is considered that since 1978 the Club has been greatly disadvantaged, not only by the introduction of the synthetic playing surfaces, but also by the dramatic fall in the population base from which we draw our Juniors. This shift in population has resulted in other inner city sporting clubs struggling to survive and local icons such as the Balmain Tigers and the Glebe Rowing Club disappearing altogether. Our success makes us unique.

During 1994, we fielded 8 junior teams (two Under 15s, two Under 13s and four Under 11s) with 118 registered players, and remain at the top of the Sydney Association. Although our minkey numbers were down on the last two years, there were still 35 or more children turning up each Saturday morning. This fall-off was more than compensated by the number of children who opted to play team hockey (an increase of over 20% on 1993). Once again, our Club Captain, Peter Busch, and a group of ladies from our women's teams ran their usual well-organized minkey sessions for the children. Peter's six years of hard work were rewarded this year with Glebe winning both the Under 11 A and B Division Central Area Premierships. Many of Peter's ex-pupils were prominent in both teams. The minkey programme has been critical in the development of our juniors and this club is indebted to Peter and Bob Taylor, who were responsible for getting the concept off the ground. A special thank you to Mike Newton, who, over the past two years, has done a magnificent job as minkey co-ordinator. His organizational work behind the scenes has taken a lot of pressure off both Peter and myself.

1994 has also seen the introduction of a hockey programme in a number of primary schools. Glebe has worked in partnership with the Sydney University Club in a pilot scheme to introduce children to our sport. Local schools - St James, Forest Lodge Public School, Glebe Public and Annandale North took part. The co-ordinator, Peter Mules, did an outstanding job. In the ten weeks of the programme he was able to build some fine skills in children who had never played hockey before.

It is pleasing to see clubs like Sydney University, who have had the luxury of not having to fund junior teams at last supporting clubs such as Glebe, who have put so much time and effort into junior development.

This year has also seen the introduction of a number of new awards, namely the Terry Reece Shield, the Arthur Stubbs Trophy and the Brother Maurice McCarten Keegan Cup. The Terry Reece Trophy was a joint initiative of The Entrance and Glebe Hockey Clubs and will be competed for annually by the two clubs. Terry Reece, whom the trophy honours, was a long-time stalwart of the Glebe club. An ex-Australian player, Terry has built an association with The Entrance Club since his retirement to the Central Coast.

It was a great honour for Glebe to win the trophy in its inaugural year.

The Arthur Stubbs Trophy was donated by Bill Stubbs in 1973 to the Glebe Police Boys' Club to honour his late father. In those days, the Glebe Hockey Club had an association with the Police Boys' Club and actually played in their colours. Unfortunately, the association ended in 1982. This year the management committee of the Police Citizens' Youth Club very kindly decided to return the trophy to Glebe so that it can once again become a living part of our history. It will be awarded to the Under 15 player who the Junior Committee feels has demonstrated outstanding potential.

The Brother Maurice McCarten Keegan Cup is a trophy I have donated in order to honour the founder of our club. It will be awarded for the first time this year to the Under 11 player who the Junior Committee feels has demonstrated the qualities McCarten Keegan instilled into Glebe teams, qualities coaches who have followed in his footsteps have preached ever since, i.e. to play an unselfish team game, always supporting your team mates, never giving up but at the same time accepting defeat graciously and realizing the only dishonour in being beaten is when you don't give of your best.

Unfortunately, due to work commitments, I will not be standing for the position of Junior Convenor at the next Annual General Meeting. It has been an honour and a privilege to have been associated with such an amazing group of people who make up this incredible club. It would be impossible for me to try and thank all those individuals who over the last couple of years have been a source of tremendous support and inspiration. There are three people, however, who deserve particular mention. Firstly, Geoff Paterson, our Club President, who has been a continued source of support on the Management Committee and despite the many onerous demands the position made on him, was still available to put his time into coaching the Under 11s. Secondly to Mick Tapsell, who has become a great friend and whose initiative to resurrect The Red Rag has had an enormous impact on the smooth running of the juniors. The guidelines he has written on overage players should be adopted by Central Area and be used for many years to come as a measure of commonsense and fair play. Finally, to my wife, Cheryl, I would like to give a special vote of thanks for her understanding and acceptance of the amount of time spent working for the hockey club.

As we look forward to 1995 with the recent approval given by Council to the Harold Park Development and with it our Turf Proposal, one can only see the future as a very exciting prospect. I think Harry Wark Jnr. sums it up perfectly in his just released work on the history of the hockey club when he says: "Hang onto your hats, the best is yet to come!"

I look forward to seeing you all back here next year.

Centre half: **Edan LACEY** (Captain), our most experienced player and showed his overall ability, was everywhere in defence and ran the ball up in attack, never gave up tackling, and as captain set a good example for the younger and inexperienced players to emulate. Will be a big asset in the Under 13s.

Half: **Jack WEBB** was one of the senior players in the team. He played mostly in the half line, but was injected into the forwards when needed. He played well throughout the year but could work more on his positional play.

Half/forward: **Alice DIXON-WILMSHURST** (a new player and her first year in hockey) had a quiet start. Improved as the season progressed. She tried hard and tackled well. Needs to work a bit more on her ball skills.

Half/forward: **Thomas DE LAUNEY** (a new player) improved as the season wore on and toward the end was involving himself more. His tackling improved and he tried hard to deliver the ball up front to his other forwards.

Half/forward: **Damion CASTELLINI** (a new player) was sometimes played as a half but preferred to play in the forwards as he likes to go forward. Played well throughout the year, but could work more on his ball skills.

Forward: **Peter BUCKWALTER** was our most experienced forward and always looked dangerous when in control of the ball, his dribbling and passing to his supports were first class, was always trying to go forward. Had a good season and will be an asset to the Under 13s.

Forward: **Andrew Fox** (a new player) worked on his game throughout the season, involving himself more and showing good stick skills and trying to deliver good passes to his supports. Played on both wings and inside forward, as the youngest player in the side if all goes well for next season.

Forward: **Nicholas DIXON-WILMSHURST** (a new player) played inside forward and was one of the real finds of the season - never stopped trying, whether in attack or defence, and is also one of the fittest players in the team. Only needs to perfect some dribbling skills and goal shooting instincts to perfect his game: an excellent season.

Forward: **Kate MORAN** played right wing and showed that with a bit of determination and concentration, beating opposition players was not that difficult. Her centres were well directed. Needs only to develop some goal shooting ability to be a very dangerous forward.

Commentary on the Season

Bill Turner as manager of the team did an outstanding job and his wise counsel and balanced personality had a positive impact on the teams attitude. Steve Casey officiated as umpire throughout the season and his even handed, mature approach was appreciated by all. Adrian Howe as assistant coach had a positive, constructive, cheerful style which brought the best out in the team. Bevan Ineson and Robert Wark often helped out with coaching on a Wednesday night and their help was most appreciated.

A special thanks must go to clubhouse manager Harry Wark snr and his dedicated "bar girls" for the outstanding way the clubhouse "ticked over" this year. The clubhouse was an enjoyable place to have a drink and a chat on Wednesday nights and Saturdays and the ambience under the arch was almost palpable on occasions. The four carnivals we attended were extremely popular and enjoyable, great practise for the team. Lithgow is a cold, windy old hole between the mountains, but the Lithgow carnival is well organised and very competitive, which makes the two hour trip all worthwhile. We had only one bad game during the season and that was our semi-final loss to Sutherland Blue. In the other 20 games throughout the season (including the Entrance game), the team played to its potential and acquitted itself with distinction. This team was "blessed" with some of the best talkers and some of the "worst" listeners that I have been associated with for many years.

In the final wash-up, the team members matured as people during the season, had plenty of exercise and had a great time socially, which is what sport and hockey is all about.

Leigh Brown: Utility player. First season of hockey and acquitted himself with distinction. His stick and ball skills developed well during the season. To help the team out on about five occasions, against some of our more formidable opponents, Leigh donned the pads and became our custodian —Thank-you, Leigh.

Max Francis: Full- Back. Improved greatly as the season progressed, possesses a good tackle and hits the ball at a million miles an hour, when he connects. All opposition forwards had trouble getting past Max and he was the corner stone of our defence.

Elly Williams: Full-Back. One of the teams most consistent triers, always did her best and was a great example to her team-mates. Her tackling technique was good, she was reliable, unflappable and read the game well. She will be an asset for the team she plays in next year.

Maira Williams: Full-Back/Half. Achieved a lot this season and contributed to the teams success. Her skills improved greatly, she developed a vision for where she should position herself and always listened to instructions politely and courteously. A solid performer.

Rebecca Howe: Half. Fast and committed, Rebecca made the transition up from the U/11's very well. She is tenacious in the tackle and some of her runs down the right hand side in attack brought the crowd to its feet. Towards the end of the season she developed more cunning and guile in her game which will stand her in good stead for the U/13's next year.
