Junior Convenor's Report 2014

A Year in Review

I am pleased to present the 2014 Annual Junior Report of the Glebe District Hockey Club.

Glebe had 9 junior teams playing in 2014 in the Central Area (U11s to U17s) and Sydney Metro (U15A & U17A) competitions. Our 2014 U17A team was a combined team with Briars (given both clubs had insufficient player numbers to field a U17 team in the Sydney Metro U17 Div A competition) and the combination was highly successful – see below.

Glebe also entered 1 team in the inaugural Central Area “U9 Super Series” (a ¼ pitch, 6 a-side round robin tournament for U9 players) which was introduced in 2014 as a stepping stone between “Minkey hockey” and the full field U11 competitions run by the Central Area.

Last, but by no means least, Glebe ran its successful and very popular Minkey program on Saturday mornings (9:30am to 10:30am) at Jubilee oval throughout the 2014 season – a big thank you to Vernon Howe for the incredible effort he puts into teaching our youngest players (children ranging from 5 to 9 years) the key skills of hockey!!

Six Glebe junior teams made the Semi Finals - the Glebe U11A Redbacks, the Glebe U11B Strikers, the Glebe U13A Redbacks, the Glebe U13B Hornets, the Glebe U15B Strikers and the U17A combined Glebe-Briars team.

Four of those teams made their Preliminary Final – the Glebe U11A Redbacks, the Glebe U13A Redbacks, the Glebe U13B Hornets and the U17A combined Glebe-Briars team.

Two of those teams made their Grand Final – the Glebe U13A Redbacks and the U17A combined Glebe-Briars team.

The *Tudor-Noller Challenge Cup* (played annually between the Glebe and Northern Districts U11A & U13A teams) was won by Glebe in 2014. The Cup was conceived 4 years ago and has become a special & highly enjoyable event for both clubs. Glebe and Northern Districts do not play each other in these age groups in ordinary competition (as Glebe plays in the Central Area junior hockey competition & Northern Districts plays in the North Area junior hockey competition) and the annual event gives the young players from each club the opportunity to meet & play each other and begin to forge long lasting hockey friendships across regions.

As many of you know, 2014 has been a watershed year in the administration of hockey in NSW. Hockey NSW (HNSW) has been implementing a reform process across NSW with the goal to seek to unify & standardise the number of men, women and children in each

hockey association operating in NSW and reduce the current 57 associations down to 23 associations. This reform is to address (amongst other things):

- the requirements of the Australian Sports Commission and Hockey Australia to have gender inclusive Associations;
- ensuring Government funding criteria is met; and
- having more efficient Associations with a development focus.

As part of the HNSW Association Reform, a new association – “Sydney East Hockey Association” – has been created and will be responsible for the development of hockey in central and eastern Sydney from 2015 onwards. Let me begin by first thanking all the parents and the players for their efforts this season. I thoroughly enjoyed my time coaching a great bunch of kids over the last couple of seasons.

Secondly I would like to thank Alasdair Brown the team's Assistant Coach and ever relaxed umpire for his help at training and on game day. It is great to have someone to rely on to umpire every week and handle training or match day duties if life gets in the way.

Thirdly a big thank you to Mel Mannering for taking on the managerial duties for the season. In what is always a time consuming job, Mel was always very helpful in organising extra players when we were short and making sure everything ran smoothly behind the scenes. She was also a handy back up to keep the kids in line.

The 2014 proved to be a season of what could have been for the under-15 Redbacks. With many of the side backing up for their second year I felt that the ability was always there for us to beat the top sides but the application week in week out wasn't. One week we would more than match it with one of the top sides and then the next we would struggle against a lower ranked side. In my opinion every player in the side has the ability to play outstanding hockey but the team let themselves down in their approach to games and thinking on the field. In saying that I believe the side improved greatly from the initial training session through till the end of the season. The players should not look back on this season as an unsuccessful year but rather one where I hope they have learned what it takes to win. Three of our last three games were against top opposition and we almost one each game but fell at the final hurdle.

I would like to thank the players for their hard work throughout the season but would encourage them to work even harder next season. Some players will go up to the under-17 level and others will remain in the under-15s and each and every single player needs to take with them the attitude

and determination they exhibited in the last few games of the season if they wish to enjoy a more successful year next season.

Looking forward to next season I believe this team can continue to improve and can produce the kind of hockey to play in the finals. For this to become a reality a few little things must happen. A greater attendance at training is required so that they can continue to work on their team structures and players need to think more about what they are doing on the field. All this requires is some application and players realising often that they have more time than they think on the ball.

Thank you to under-13s players Tim Pritchard for filling in and helping us out on a couple of occasions and to Taylah Mannering as well who was always on hand to help out when a few players were injured and or suffered from illness. They both displayed tremendous skill and never let the team down.

I hope everyone enjoys the off-season and comes back to the hockey season refreshed and injury free!

Sam Alexander-Prideaux, CH/IF: Is a player with plenty of skill and potential. Always a threat in attack, Sam was hampered by a hamstring complaint for much of the season but soldiered on and was always there when needed. Moved to inside-forward towards the end of the season, he displayed great pace and elimination skills. At times he needs to slow himself down and gain control before trying to use his pace and skill.

Angus Baird, IF/FWD: A very skilful player with plenty of potential and consistently one of our go to forwards. Angus needs to find that balance between when to run and when to pass. A good rule of thumb passed on to me by Club legend and Triple Olympian Pat Nilan was to always use your skill to get yourself out of trouble and not into trouble. I have no doubt Angus will develop in to a fine player.

Grace Dallen H/FWD: Grace possesses good skill and a powerful shot. She progressed all the way from half to the forward line this season and I am repeating myself from last year's report but I believe if she backed herself more she would surprise herself with what she could accomplish.

Litiana Field, FB/CH: Our rock in defence. Without a doubt our best defender and arguably in the club, which is confirmed by regular spot in the Women's 1st grade line up. When Litiana moved to CH this year I thought she added a great balance to the team and controlled the game with her passing and vision.

Ryan Howe, W: Played the season up front this year and finished off some great lead up work from his teammates and also had a hand in setting up his other team mates as well. Ryan has great hand eye coordination and displayed this on numerous occasions pulling off some great traps. Never say die attitude.

Kloe Mannering, GK: One of the best junior keepers I have the pleasure of watching and kept us in games when we should have been out of them on many occasion. Never afraid to advance and snuff out an attack before a shot could be made, Kloe has continued to demonstrate that she has bright future in front of her. The only thing I think she can work is being more demanding of her defence, your too nice sometimes Kloe!

Mitchell Brain, FB: Was new to the team year but quickly made himself a valuable asset. Mitch possesses great touch and skill and fooled many a forward with his stick work and deft reverse

stick plays. He developed his passing and carrying skills as the season wore on and if he continues to do could become a great full back with that rare combination of precision and force.

Hugh Dallen, IF/FWD: An extremely skilful and swift player. Hugh displayed great skill and determination throughout the season. At times he could get caught crabbing with the ball but he has the pace and skill to eliminate any defender.

Amy Molloy, IF/CF/H: Amy has great skill and can read the game well. She proved that time and again this season and when she asked to play half she also demonstrated a fine defensive game. I think Amy surprised many an opponent with her strength and has great potential.

Brayden Morrow, RW: Always a tireless worker and very determined hockey player. Brayden inevitably found himself in the right place at the right time in the circle to snag a goal but can be guilty of getting too ball focussed when leading forward. I hope he has the words "stay wide" ringing in his ears next season.

Mim Pritchard, IF/FWD: A very skilful forward who was one of our main attacking weapons. Mim needs to concentrate on going forward and learning when she has eliminated a player. She improved throughout the season and playing seniors hockey will no doubt accelerate her learning.

Delilah Rodriguez, CF: Was a bit slow to get going this season but by the end she was back to her old self and produced some great attacking raids. Delilah even had a turn in the goals this year when the side was left short with rep players away. I don't think it has encouraged her to take up goal-keeping, so you can rest easy Kloe. Back yourself, would be my take home message for Delilah.

Alice Schacher, RH: Was great when we had her around. Alice missed a fair chunk of hockey this year through illness and horse riding commitments. Always a constant source of laughter for the players and coaches alike but underneath all the fun there is a steely resolve that is often underestimated by her opponents.

Emma Grant, H: Developed in to a great attacking right half this season. Emma possesses great strength and skill but can rush herself. As with most of the team I think Emma should have more confidence in her own ability. She has a good strong hit and push and when she chooses to use it, great vision.

Alanna Howe, FB/H: Could play anywhere across the back and is a great tackler with great pace. When she backs herself she has a sweet hit and can find a great pass. At times she would go for the old hit'n'hope. Alanna should avoid this style of play as she can produce some great passes and attacking play when she puts her mind to it.

Jackson Howe, FB: Became one of the regular starting full backs by the season's end and displayed all the skills required of a promising full back. Showed some good elimination skills and vision. One thing he can improve on next year is his ability to bring the ball to the defensive line and work with the mid-field to eliminate and vary up his passing game.

Taylah Mannering, FB: Our emergency player and ever dependable back up. Taylah never lets her teammates down and often produces some great tackles when you least expect it. As she continues to develop Taylah will become a valuable asset to any team she is a part of, I would suggest a move to CH, seeing as she apparently has some attacking prowess.

The Hornets scored a first up win against Bankstown in round 1, but it was always going to be a hard season this year. From the start, the team didn't have quite enough players to make a full team, we had no goalkeeper, and nearly half the team were either picking up a stick for the first time or were in their second year of hockey. However, everyone was keen to train and play, and with goodwill from the U13b's we were able to draw on Jasmine as goalkeeper and Pablo as regular players unless their U13 games conflicted.

Having eleven players wasn't always part of our game plan, and interchange players was a luxury we were only able to have a couple of times in the season. Despite this, there were only a few games towards the end of the season where the team wasn't competitive for nearly all of the game, until tiredness let the result get away, and only one game where the team couldn't hold the opposition out for the full game time. The team played some great games, and in a good number of our games the opposition coach praised our team's effort, and the skills of players. Throughout the season, every single player had several games where they were outstanding.

Although we only had three wins this year, the Hornets had some real highlights, and the effort in games when we were short of players was something to be proud of. If only we'd had a full team, how different the season would have been. One highlight of the season which must be mentioned however was the game against UNSW. Played on a freezing cold Friday night (the wind-chill was recorded at -2° at the airport), this was a great game because it all 'clicked' for the team – every player trapped and tackled and passed the ball around. They played the style and level of hockey they are capable of. And because it came together, the team scored four goals.

Thanks to Jasmine and Pablo who were our regular players from U13s, and also to Lex who played 4 games for us. I would like to thank Arun Aggarwal (Ashwin's dad) for umpiring this year, and all the parents. Your support at training and at games, and your good sportsmanship, was a real positive to the team and the players, and reflected well on Glebe hockey club. Most importantly, I would like to highlight the effort of Maria Wilson (Scout's mum), our team manager. I don't think anyone appreciates the significant effort Maria spent getting us a team every week, and texting parents every Friday night to make sure players would be there on Saturday morning. Maria's effort this year was highlighted when she drove players to play at Bankstown, even though her daughter wasn't playing. Her commitment and effort was way beyond what I or anyone else would have done. Without Maria, our team would probably have folded early in the year.

Hopefully every player will return in 2015. I have pride in what the players achieved this year. Every player improved their hockey, and as a team they were sporting and gracious to the opposition and umpires regardless of the score line. They worked to improve their hockey – both at training and in games, and they didn't give up in any game. Even for the last training of the season, more than half attended, and although we only had nine playing in the last game of the year, the team didn't give up and worked hard before conceding the first goal in the final minute of the first half.

Ashwin Aggarwal (12 games, 1 goal). Ashwin had a good season as a forward, and showed potential in other positions. Unfortunately Ashwin was unable to train this year, so he wasn't able to develop his ability to read positions or work with other players. When Ashwin started to pass the ball he improved his skills in taking the 'right option' in attack as well as showing his improvement as a team player. Hopefully he'll be able to train with the team next year to achieve his full potential as a hockey player.

Oliver Brownbill (10 games, 1 goal). Oliver is clearly a player of potential, and opposition teams recognised his skills and influence on the game. Oliver started as the most skilful player in the team, and importantly has continued to improve throughout the year. His attitude to training and in games has been most impressive and commendable. Oliver clearly loves to play hockey and works hard during the game (and played extra games with the U15 Strikers). Unfortunately for the Hornets, Oliver only played 10 games this year.

Ashleigh Chatelier (15 games, 1 goal). When it came to trying to understand her position and the reading of the game this year, it would be hard to find anyone in the club who asked more questions on how to improve or tried to learn. Ashleigh worked hard at training and her goal against UNSW was a well-deserved reward for her hard work. Ashleigh missed only one game this year. She is always keen to play as centre-forward, but will find herself understanding the game better if she tries other positions in 2015.

Mia Gastelaar (2 games). Mia only joined us at the end of the season, and should have been playing Under 13s. Hopefully Mia will be returning to Glebe next year. She has strong potential as a forward, and impressed the players enough that she collected team awards in her two games.

Glebe Wins the Tudor-Noller Cup



The Glebe U11A Redbacks & Glebe U13A Redbacks won the annual "Tudor-Noller Cup Challenge" on Sunday, 24 August 2014 for the first time in its 4 year history!!

The Tudor-Noller Challenge Cup is an annual event played between the Glebe and Northern Districts U11A & U13A teams and is named after stalwarts of junior hockey development within the respective Glebe and Northern Districts hockey clubs - Mark Noller from Glebe and Rohan & Eileen Tudor from Northern Districts. The Cup was conceived 4 years ago and has become a special & highly enjoyable event for both clubs. Glebe and Northern Districts do not play each other in these age groups in ordinary competition (as Glebe plays in the Central Area junior hockey competition & Northern Districts plays in the North Area junior hockey competition) and the annual event gives the young players from each club the opportunity to meet & play each other and begin to forge long lasting hockey friendships across regions. From Glebe's perspective, it is also a thrill for our young players to play for the Cup each year on the impressive Pennant Hills astro-turf pitches and everyone from Glebe who comes along to the event (players, parents and spectators) thoroughly enjoy the generous hospitality of the Northern Districts club, players and parents.

On a bright early (and sunny) Sunday morning 24 August 2014, the yearly event got underway. In accordance with the usual format, the U11's played first at 9am followed by the U13's. Among the Glebe supporters was Danny O'Brien (our club President) and Pat Nilan (one of our life members - who played 454 senior matches for Glebe and whose grandson, Riley Nilan, plays in the Glebe U13A Redbacks team).

The U11 match was very exciting. It was a fast & skilful game. The close passing skills of the Glebe players marked an interesting contrast to the longer, slapping game of Northern Districts. Both teams were short players and drew on a number of the younger players from each of the clubs for the event. Ultimately, Northern Districts prevailed 5 goals to 1, scoring 2 goals in the final minutes to record a strong first up win to Northern Districts.

The U13 teams played next, with Glebe needing to win the game to force the Tudor-Noller Challenge Cup into a "tie breaker".
