Re Michael Schultz

I examined the Annual General Meeting Minute Book of the Glebe District Hockey Club, which records the Minutes of Meetings from December 1932 until March 1969.

The fifth Annual Meeting of the Glebe District Hockey Club was held on Tuesday 22 March 1938 at the Glebe Town Hall.

It is recorded in these Minutes that Mr E G Foskett, the then President of the Metropolitan Hockey Association presented trophies to the trophy winners. There were 16 trophy winners, but I am not sure if they were all at the Meeting to collect their trophies. I suspect that some may not have been present in person to receive their trophies.

It is recorded that M Schultz received trophies for a B Grade Premiership win in 1933 and Reserve Grade Premiership wins in 1934 and 1935. B Grade was the third Grade of the Metropolitan Hockey Association Competition and Reserve Grade was the second grade of the Metropolitan Hockey Association Competition.

It is recorded in the 1937 Annual Report that M Schultz played a total of 65 games for Glebe. He did not play after the 1937 season, as he was still credited with 65 games in the Games Played List of the 1938 Report, and he is not listed in the 1939 Report.

I could find no record of William or Carl Schultz in the Hockey Club Records. Jack Worley an ex-President of the Hockey Club told me about William Schultz's death in Germany during World War 11. William was a Flight Sergeant with the 463 Squadron and died on 23 September 1944. I suspect that Carl was the Schultz family member that had a shop on Glebe Point Road in the 30s, although Jack Worley would be the person to ask about this question. Jack is in his 90s. He was born in 1917. I am told he is still alive and lives at Chelmsford.

Thanks Ian – my dad, Michael Schultz lived in Marlborough Ave (now Keegan Ave) Glebe. Dad worked at the SMH as a copy boy after leaving school and joined the Tax Dept before he turned 20 where he remained until retirement – dad did not have a business in Glebe Point Road or anywhere else. I can confirm that Michael was born 24/7/1914 and his brother William (Wibby) was born a few years later. Wibby lost his life in the RAAF in 1943/1944 and dad passed away 5/4/1996.
