



## #glebechampions

On Sunday 20 October 2019, GDHC legend, Pat Nilan, was inducted into the Hockey Australia Hall of Fame. The presentation was held at the State Sports Centre, Homebush, during the Hockey One League games when the NSW Pride teams played against HC Melbourne.

Pat's GDHC hockey achievements are well known and significant. Pat began playing for the Club as a 16 year old in 1958 and in 1959 was selected in First Grade where he played until 1978, playing a record number of 361 first grade games. In total Pat played 454 senior games for Glebe. Pat was an athletic player, fast, nimble and agile, with exceptional balance and poise. He was also a selfless player, with a good work ethic, resilience and excellent motivation. Everything he did was for the benefit of the team. His sportsmanship was recognised by all who saw him play.

He has also served his club well. Pat was Glebe Club Captain from 1962-66 and again in 1971 and was Glebe Club President from 1972-77. He coached Glebe junior teams for decades and coached the Club's First Grade team for many years. Pat's contribution to Club affairs and Club life for almost 60 years has been immense.

Pat was inducted into the NSW Hall of Champions in 1979. He is one of only five men to have been afforded this honour, the others being Brian Booth, Ron Riley, Paul Dearing and Ken Wark (Jnr). In 1982 he received an Order of Australia Medal in recognition of his services to hockey at local, state and national level. In 2007 he was inducted into Hockey NSW's Hall of Fame. Pat is one of less than twenty hockey greats who rated a notation in the Oxford Companion to Australian Sport. This is a testament to his achievements over an international career spanning 10 years.

So despite Pat's recognition in other places, it has taken some time for his contribution on the Australian stage to be recognised with this weekend's induction into the Hockey Australia Hall of Fame. Pat represented Australia from 1961 to 1972. During this period he played in 3 Olympic Games, 1964 at Tokyo (bronze medal), 1968 at Mexico (silver medal) and 1972 in Munich. In total Pat played 86 internationals for Australia, in an era when international matches were infrequent. He brought to those games the same high standards of fitness and commitment to training, dedication and flair that marked his game as a Glebe clubman.

Congratulations to Pat on this latest very well-deserved honour! A true champion in our Club of Champions.

# TURF UPDATE

The City of Sydney Council has approved the building of a small scale multi-purpose field suitable for hockey on The Crescent, Annandale in between the proposed skateboard park and the childcare centre. This is great news for the Club, as this area can be used for training by all sections of the Club, both formally and informally, for junior games, and, if all goes to plan, for competitions using the new International 5s format. The Club has been lobbying for a turf for over 30 years. A full field is still within reach thanks to the support of Darcy Byrne at the Inner West Council but having a surface within walking distance of the clubhouse for training will be an enormous boost for the Club's juniors, for improving our senior skill base and most importantly for giving Glebe

Hockey a home again in our local area. We are very grateful to Kerryn Phelps for her significant support since 2016, particularly for her efforts amending the recent proposal to Council for the field to meet the FIH standards for an International 5s field. We are also grateful to Clover Moore for her recent support in getting the concept plans for field through Council.


