BACKGROUND

The Glebe District Hockey Club (GDHC) has been a cornerstone of Sydney's hockey community since its foundation in 1933. Rooted in the storied St James Sports Club, which fielded its first hockey team in 1931, GDHC has a rich history, proudly fielding competitive teams each year across all grades. The Club's legacy is built on the thousands of players who have passed through its doors and the enduring sense of community that has always been its hallmark.

GDHC provides more than a game of hockey. People of all ages and abilities are welcomed into the GDHC family, and its inclusive and accepting philosophy has ensured that lifelong friendships are forged over the shared passion for the game. This is what makes Glebe District Hockey Club a Champion Club, and a Club of Champions.

The Club fielded its first junior team in 1948 and many of Glebe's Juniors have gone on to state and national honours, including representing Australia. The Club focuses on supporting and nurturing players at club level, developing both hockey and team skills, and providing opportunities for leadership and contribution. Our Juniors tell us they love playing for GDHC because of the strong friendships they form, the opportunities the Club provides, and above all because it is fun. Players of all abilities or experience from ages 4 to 17 are welcomed in the Juniors, with the youngest players starting with the "hookin2hockey" Minkey program, graduating to the under 10s (U10) through to under 18s (U18). Juniors can also extend their hockey skills by playing in the SEHA (Sydney East Hockey Association) Competition, and at least one team at each of the U14 and U16 age levels plays in the Sydney Metro competition.

JUNIORS DIRECTOR REPORT

Juniors Director: Tara Taylor

The 2024 playing year was an excellent season for Glebe Juniors, defined by major changes that are already shaping our future. With the introduction of new uniforms, the eagerly awaited Crescent Turf, and the statewide shift from odd to even year age levels, we managed three significant changes at once! Amidst all this, we also celebrated tremendous success, with six of our Junior teams making the finals, four progressing to the Grand Final, and three of them claiming championship titles in their divisions.

Significant Developments

This year, Glebe Juniors transitioned to fielding teams in the U10, U12, U14, U16, and U18 divisions, replacing the traditional U9, U11, U13, U15, and U17 structure. The shift, implemented by our playing associations in early 2024, required significant communication and adjustments, but thanks to our dedicated team managers and the support of parents and families, the process was remarkably smooth.

A highlight of this shift was the emergence of a strong U10 SEHA competition, where Glebe fielded three teams out of 7. Glebe continues to lead in this age group, showcasing the depth of talent and development within our club at this youngest competition age-level. It was particularly exciting to see two of our U10 teams reach the Grand Final and both win — with a draw after extra time. We could not have asked for a better outcome in a Glebe v Glebe Grand Final.

Additionally, we took the unique opportunity this year to field a second U16 team in the Metro competition, due to the strong retention of players from 2023 (who did not progress

to the next age-level due to the age-level change). This allowed more players the opportunity to experience the higher level of competition, which we believe will contribute to their long-term development and to the future of our club. Special thanks to Ken Wark, who led the U16 Glebe Fire Metro Team, helping them to grow and develop in this competitive environment.

The change in age-levels also meant our U14 Metro team included players who were all completely new to the Metro Competition. Usually about half the players on a Metro team have had some prior experience of the Metro Competition. As a result, this group experienced an enormous learning curve, however, they kept up their spirit and kept fighting and were a much better team by year end. Thank you to Mack Noller, their coach, who was so committed and persistent in his development focus.

Crescent Turf – A Game Changer

The opening of the Crescent Turf in April was another landmark achievement for our club. This facility has become a home ground for our U10 and U12B teams, giving them the opportunity to play on both Jubilee Grass and Crescent Turf. We also hosted finals games here, marking the first time in many years that Glebe was able to do so. This new turf is a crucial part of our club's expansion, providing our Juniors with more access to top-quality facilities in the local area — many have told me they are now able to practise more! We can't wait for the new summer comp to begin.

Development Programs

Our focus on development continues to be a cornerstone of our success. This year, we once again ran a six-week pre-season Development Academy, ensuring our teams were ready to hit the ground running. For the third year, we also offered an additional 12 hours of Development Academy sessions during school holidays, along with weekly Junior Fitness sessions at the start of the season.

In 2024, we expanded our Glebe Junior Accelerator program to include U14 Redback players alongside the U16 (with U18s joining seniors mostly). This program targets technical and tactical skills for players aiming to transition to our Senior Men's and Women's teams. The fast-paced sessions, held mostly at the Crescent, focused on key elements to improve individual skills and overall game awareness.

Huge thanks to Development Director Katrina Cochrane, whose tireless efforts continue to make these initiatives a success.

Representative Success

As you'll see in the following pages, 2024 was another positive year for our representative players. Many of our Juniors took part in SEHA teams, and we have numerous players

currently trialling for the indoor representative season. Their commitment to improving their hockey, forming connections within the hockey community, and playing more games is commendable. We also had several players selected for State Teams and Squads, an exciting milestone for both the players and our club – see the update later in this Annual Report.

A Club of Volunteers

Glebe Juniors runs entirely on volunteer efforts, and it's thanks to these contributions that our club thrives. I want to extend my deepest gratitude to all of our volunteers.

Firstly, I'd like to mention our incredible coaches. This year they were all either current Senior players or highly experienced retired Glebe or Senior players. Their knowledge and passion for the game have made a profound impact on our Juniors, helping to inspire the next generation.

Our team managers have also been outstanding, handling the logistics and communication that make every game and training session run smoothly. Thank you for your dedication and hard work.

A special mention goes to Peter Bestel, our tireless Juniors Umpires Coordinator. With the increased number of Metro teams this year, Peter went above and beyond to ensure every game was covered. His efforts are invaluable, and we couldn't have done it without him.

In 2023, the Glebe District Hockey Club proudly fielded four U9 teams in a quarter field development competition, totalling 27 players. During the off-season, our local association, with guidance from Hockey NSW, reclassified the junior age divisions into U10, U12, U14, U16, and U18. This shift reflects the age group structures prominent from the 1950s to the 1980s. As a result, most of the U9 players moved into the U10 ranks for the 2024 season. Glebe fielded three U10 teams in this new half field format, a significant achievement as it was more than any other Hockey club in the South-East Sydney Hockey Association [SEHA]. Throughout the season, Glebe's U10 teams competed against the Sutherland, St George Randwick, Bankstown, and the University of NSW Hockey Clubs.

One of the season's highlights was the completion of the Crescent synthetic playing surface, which, along with Jubilee Oval, allowed Glebe to host regular home games each Saturday morning. This has been a tremendous asset for the club, as games had to be played at other venues in previous seasons. The ability to play and train locally has significantly strengthened the club's visibility in the community.

Despite fielding three separate U10 teams, the decision was made to train as a unified squad on Wednesday nights. The focus during these sessions was on developing fitness, practising fundamental skills, and addressing the individual needs of each player. Week after week, the players displayed keen enthusiasm, positivity, and a genuine eagerness to learn and improve. This contributed to a season filled with fun and enjoyment for all involved.

Wednesday nights also became a hub for social interaction among the families. The clubhouse was open, fostering camaraderie among the parents, who would gather to chat while the children trained. After training, the players often found themselves climbing trees, kicking a ball around the oval, or engaging in other spontaneous activities.

I must take this opportunity to thank the Glebe DHC Clubhouse managers Daisy Noble, Clark Foster, Cate Heath and Henry Hunt, whose support was invaluable throughout the season. Their contributions, though sometimes behind the scenes, had a profound impact. By providing a warm and welcoming clubhouse every Wednesday night after training, they created a positive environment for families to gather, share a meal, have a drink, and catch up. One parent mentioned that Wednesday nights were her favourite time of the week, as the clubhouse buzzed with conversation, while the kids happily played outside on the forecourt or oval. This sense of community was exceptional and appreciated by everyone involved in the U10 and U12 squads.

A huge thank you also to Mr Nic Glass for taking on the responsibility of organising the families to volunteer for cooking and serving duties on Wednesday nights throughout the season. Nic often stepped up and took on the task himself, always bringing a positive attitude and a can-do spirit. On behalf of all the families and parents, thank you, Nic, for your dedication and for helping Wednesday nights run so smoothly. We truly appreciate all your hard work!

At the start of the season, U10 registrations totalled 27 players. It was decided to divide the players into three teams, based on ability and friendship groups, to ensure a balanced and enjoyable experience. The three teams were named the Strikers, Wasps, and Hornets, each starting with 9 players (8 on the field at any time). While family commitments and holidays occasionally meant teams played with the bare minimum or even one player short, we were mindful that U10 teams could have a maximum of 13 players each. We aimed to avoid having 4-5 substitutes per game to keep all players actively involved on the field, rather than

spending too much time on the sideline. Each team gained a player or two throughout the season, with final numbers balancing out at 10 players per team and a total squad size of 30 by the season's end.

Word about the U10 program spread quickly throughout the local community. Friends of players would often come down to the turf to try out hockey, along with younger siblings and classmates. Our approach has always been inclusive, and we've welcomed everyone—whether new to hockey or experienced—without turning anyone away.

The U10 coaches for 2024 were Ms Lydia Najdzion (Strikers), Mr Mark Paterson (Wasps), and Mr Rupert Hughes (Hornets). These dedicated coaches were well-supported by their team managers: Mr. Tim McMinn (Strikers), Ms. Sukata Suwanjarat (Wasps), and Mr. Martin Schneider (Hornets). The managers handled the essential administrative tasks, including game day match cards and player eligibility requirements. On behalf of the coaching team, I'd like to extend our heartfelt thanks to the managers for their hard work behind the scenes, which allowed us coaches to focus solely on coaching and supporting the players.

The U10s were extremely fortunate to have many hands on deck every Wednesday night, helping them learn and master the fundamentals of hockey. A special thank you goes to my father and GlebeDHC Life Member, Geoffrey Paterson—Granddad to Grace and Frank—who never missed a session, rain, hail, or shine. Geoff, who trained juniors for many years, including his sons, at Jubilee Oval—the spiritual home of the club—brought invaluable experience to the squad. His return to the clubhouse after training stirred fond memories of the years he spent helping build the club's junior base.

A big thank you also to Ms Sophie Lloyd, who, in 2024, was completing her Duke of Edinburgh Award at St Scholastica's College, Glebe Point. As part of the community service component of her award, Sophie generously volunteered her time to assist the U10 squad. Her presence was invaluable, especially with those players whose attention spans could wander. Sophie had a natural ability to keep them engaged, ensuring they were practising and playing throughout the season.

I would also like to express my deepest gratitude to Mrs. Sue Heath, who undertook a monumental amount of work behind the scenes. Sue ensured the clubhouse was always well-stocked for Wednesday night training sessions. Along with her husband, Mr. Kevin Heath, she organised the many Saturday morning BBQs, serving bacon and eggs, and sausage rolls, which became a cherished post-game tradition for both players and families. The effort involved in purchasing the food and transporting all the necessary equipment from the clubhouse to the Crescent field every second Saturday morning was truly immense. The warmth and hospitality extended to the Glebe families and visiting opposition teams were deeply appreciated. Sue, who also serves as our Club President, was also a

constant presence on Saturday mornings, overlooking the junior teams with pride. She was always gracious, up for a chat, and ever-present in her Glebe colours. Her support and dedication set a welcoming tone for everyone involved.

Lastly, a heartfelt thanks to Ms. Tara Taylor, who provided unwavering support and counsel throughout the season, ensuring we always had what we needed. Her organisational efforts helped the season run smoothly, and her guidance was invaluable.

The success of the U10 squad in 2024 was truly a team effort, and the contributions of all these individuals made the season a memorable and enjoyable experience for players and families alike. In closing, the 2024 season has been a testament to the strength of Glebe Hockey's community spirit, teamwork, and dedication to developing young players.

The season started much like previous ones, with most of the U10 Wasps players progressing through the Minkey and U9 ranks from the last two seasons. However, the U10 competition brought a new level of formality, requiring a dedicated goalkeeper for every game and featuring matches played on half a field with seven field players plus the goalkeeper. This shift added an exciting challenge to the team, and the players adapted brilliantly, working hard to develop their skills and play as a cohesive unit.

The U10 Wasps had a stellar season, playing 12 games and finishing with an impressive record of 10 wins, 1 draw, and just 1 loss. With three byes during the season, they scored 66 goals and conceded 23, giving them a positive goal difference of 43. The Wasps wrapped up the regular season with 31 points, reflecting their strong performances on the field.

The Wasps entered the finals series with high spirits, starting with the Major Semi-Final against the Glebe Hornets at Crescent Field. In front of a packed crowd of parents, siblings,

grandparents, and club members, both teams delivered an intense and thrilling display of hockey. Despite their efforts, the Wasps were edged out by the Hornets, who claimed a 3-1 victory in a tense battle that showcased the skills and determination of both sides.

Following the defeat, the Wasps had to quickly regroup as they faced Sutherland in the final, with a spot in the Grand Final on the line. This match was equally tense, with the scoreline remaining tight throughout. However, the Wasps rose to the occasion, eventually securing a hard-fought 6-3 victory and earning their place in the Grand Final.

The Grand Final, played on Sunday, 15 September 2024, at Kyeemagh Hockey Field, was a spectacle for the ages. In a fitting twist, the two Glebe teams—the Wasps and the Hornets—met once again, for the third time in four weeks. The Hornets struck first and, with a series of short corners, applied heavy pressure on the Wasps' defence. However, the Wasps held firm, entering halftime trailing 1-0. Early in the second half, the Wasps equalised, and the match continued with both teams trading attacking opportunities. Despite several close chances, neither side could break the deadlock, and the game ended 1-1 at full time. This led to a dramatic sudden death, golden goal drop-off, where the teams played two 6-minute halves, first 5 v 5, and then finally 4 v 4. Even after extra time, the teams remained inseparable. In a fitting end to an incredible season and a remarkable match, both teams were awarded joint premiers—a well-deserved recognition for two evenly matched sides that gave their all.

Carter Bell: The ultimate team player. Carter always gave his all and supported his teammates with courtesy and kindness. He volunteered to play in goals during the final and Grand Final, where he performed remarkably, stopping some incredible shots. On the field, Carter made tremendous progress, scoring key goals throughout the season while continuing to improve his stick work.

Viktoria Bidanov: New to hockey in 2024, Viktoria improved steadily every week. By the end of the season, she was a vital part of the team, with her passing and pushing developing to become strong and accurate.

Charlie Downton: Another new player in 2024, Charlie showed natural hand-eye coordination. When focused and engaged, he made excellent tackles and delivered strong passes into the attacking half. He became more involved in every game as the season progressed.

Isla Hutton: "Miss Consistent" always delivered. Isla ran hard, tackled with intensity, and chased back tirelessly. She scored crucial goals, particularly in the final against Sutherland, and had a standout performance in the Grand Final with impressive reverse stick traps. **Harriet Edwards:** Harriet is the type of player every team needs. Always upbeat, positive, and enthusiastic, she was a pleasure to coach. Attentive and eager to learn, her hockey skills improved tremendously this year. Harriet was a key contributor in the midfield and upfront, with strong passing, trapping, and involvement in every game.

Abby Glass: Abby has a keen sense for staying in the contest, as seen in the Grand Final, where she made crucial tackles and never missed a beat. A quiet achiever, Abby never sought the limelight but always played her role and position with dedication to the team. **Finn O'Brien:** A natural talent, Finn's speed and game sense made him an asset upfront. He always seemed to be in the right place at the right time, including when he scored the equaliser in the Grand Final.

Moving Cody into outside defender certainly added the strength we needed, not only in his ability to never give up, chase players down, make tackles you wouldn't think possible, but his biggest skill was his ability to throw outstanding overheads to connect with his midfielders and strikers.

I can honestly say we were very fortunate to have one of the strongest midfield lines across the metro competition and they demonstrated this strength week in, week out and gave the opposition teams a challenge trying to penetrate through the middle of the pitch. Jess, Airley, Emilie, Sophia Grey, Miki, in particular, held the consistency of the team across these positions. Airley moving into our Defensive Mid position offered control, leadership and strength required for our team to be successful in connecting our defensive line to our strikers. Jess's ability to run the ball with speed and skill is great to watch and her ability to throw overheads and pull the trigger with effective tomahawks was a highlight for the season - not to mention her drag flicking on Penalty Corners. Emilie was certainly one of the most consistent players you will have in the midfield, and her ability to dispossess the opposition and set up attacking plays for the strikers is very impressive. Miki's work rate is certainly one the most consistent you will see across the team. Her ability to play across lines and be effective in whichever position she is playing is a quality that I admire. Her ability to remain calm and controlled in all situations had her surprising the opposition on a

regular basis of just how skilful she is. Sophia Grey's ability to engage in contested tackles and win these the majority of the time is a strength you don't see very often. Her speed and ability to run the ball, win the free hit but keep the play going continually creates attacking outcomes that benefit us greatly.

To say the Strikers work rate was consistently high this season is an understatement. They worked hard at training to build the connections that they require, not only with their individual stick-on-ball skills and goal shooting, but more importantly developing their overall game awareness. This enhanced their ability to connect with each other across the striker line and understand the importance of their Without ball movement creating so many opportunities for us as a team and allowing them to create attacking outcomes on a regular basis. The life of a striker can be challenging as they often do a lot running, create opportunities for attacking plays, but may not even touch the ball, however it's their work rate off ball that needs to be acknowledged and highlighted. Jack joined our club this year and certainly made his mark as a strong, skilful striker. His ability to adapt to our way of play is not easy when joining a team who have been together across the years, however, it's his ability to take on board feedback, try new things, and work with his teammates that demonstrates his ability as a strong team player. Dan is one of those players you love to have on your team. His speed is out of control and his work rate is next level. He fights for every ball and runs down that ball most would not even attempt to try and get but somehow, he manages to get it. Siala's ability to set up a press and do the work required, would often have the opposition making mistakes or result in us being in a position to dispossess them. Playing across lines, also demonstrated her ability to be adaptable when required and be able to connect with her teammates and create positive outcomes. Anna continually steps up each week and demonstrates a work rate most players should aspire to implement themselves. Her ability to move across lines also demonstrates her skill and strength and her willingness to do what is best for the team is a quality I admire. As a team, we had one of the hardest Press Structures to penetrate in the competition and this is largely down to the hard work rate and game sense of our strikers.

I would like to finish by saying a massive thank you to our Team Manager. Amanda, who without you, I certainly cannot do my job. Your support to not only me, but the players and parents throughout the season is amazing and we are all very grateful.

As we have many of our U16 players moving up an age group next year, and there is a very strong chance this team may never play together again, I just want to say how grateful and honoured I am to have had the opportunity to work with each of you this year individually and as a team. I am extremely proud of each of you, not only as talented and skilful athletes, but you are all genuinely great humans. This is evident with how well you have supported and connected with each other on and off the field all year. I know your friendships will

continue and I wish all of you the very best for the future and I hope I get the chance to work with you all again in the future.

FINALS REPORT



Final Season Results


U10 (SEHA)


U12 A (SEHA)

U12 Redbacks reached the semi-finals and then the preliminary finals where they played a tight game but lost to Sutherland Blue Tongues with a final score 1-2.










